Caitriona Creely is International Liaison Officer at the Health Research Board. She was formally nominated as National Focal Point for the EAHC Public Health Programme in November 2008 by the Department of Health and Children. She holds a PhD in Biophysics from Trinity College Dublin and worked for a number of years as a postdoctoral researcher in The Institute for Photonic Sciences in Barcelona before joining the Health Research Board in 2007. She is also currently National Contact Point for Health in the EU 7th Framework Programme and a member of the Programme Committee for Health for FP7.

Margaret M. Barry is Professor of Health Promotion and Public Health at the Department of Health Promotion, National University of Ireland, Galway, where she is Head of Department and Director of the Health Promotion Research Centre. Margaret has published widely in the field of mental health promotion and is responsible for a number of large-scale national, European and international research projects. Having completed her primary degree and doctoral studies in Psychology at Trinity College, Dublin, she has held previous posts as Lecturer in Psychology at the University of Birmingham, UK; Trinity College, Dublin, and as Deputy Director of the Health Services Research Unit at University College, North Wales. Visiting Fellow at the Victorian Health Foundation, Australia in 2007 and Visiting Lecturer in 2002 at the World Health Organisation Collaborating Centre at the Institute of Psychiatry, King's College, London. Co-author of the text *Implementing Mental Health Promotion* (Barry and Jenkins, 2007) recently published by Elsevier.

Stephan Van den Broucke is a Scientific Project Officer at the Executive Agency for Health and Consumers of the European Commission in Luxembourg. He holds a PhD in Behavioural Sciences from the Catholic University of Leuven, Belgium, and has completed postgraduate training courses in health promotion, epidemiology and health policy studies at the Universities of Maastricht, The Netherlands, and Antwerp, Belgium. He has previously held positions of research co-ordinator, head of research and senior expert at the Flemish Institute for Health Promotion in Brussels, and is a part-time lecturer at the Catholic University of Leuven. He is a Member of the Flemish Health Council since 1998, and a consulting member of the High Council for Health of Belgium. He is a former member of the Regional Committee for Europe of the International Union for Health Promotion and Education (IUHPE), and has served as a Temporary Advisor to the World Health Organisation on several occasions. He has published widely on topics related to preventive behaviour change, health promotion, health policy, mental health, project management and evaluation.
