# Glossary

*Central Mental Hospital.* The Central Mental Hospital, Dundrum, is administered by HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster but serves the country as a whole rather than a specified catchment area.

*Health Research Board (HRB).* The Health Research Board was established in 1986 (under Statutory Instrument No. 279) to promote, assist, commission and conduct medical, health, epidemiological and health services research in Ireland. The Board arose from the amalgamation of two former bodies, the Medical Research Council and the Medico-Social Research Board (MSRB).

*Health Service Executive (HSE) Area.* The address from which each patient was admitted to hospital was used to allocate the patient to the corresponding Health Service Executive area and the admission was rated accordingly. Thus, tabulations relating to HSE areas were calculated irrespective of whether or not the patient was admitted to a hospital administered by that area. Data on patients admitted to private hospitals were returned to the area in which they normally resided. A map outlining each HSE area and its respective catchment population according to the Census of Population 2006 (Central Statistics Office 2007a; Central Statistics Office 2007b; Central Statistics Office 2007c) is presented in Chapter 1.

*ICD-10.* The diagnostic groups in this report are based on the WHO International Classification of Diseases categories (ICD-10) (WHO 1992).

*In-patient days.* In-patients days were the number of days spent in hospital from date of admission to date of discharge. It was calculated by subtracting date of admission from date of discharge, including time spent on transfer for medical or surgical purposes while still 'on the books' of psychiatric units and hospitals.

*Legal status.* The legal status reported throughout this report is that recorded on admission. Changes may occur in legal status following admission but this is not recorded by the NPIRS.

*Length of stay.* Length of stay was derived by calculating the amount of time spent in hospital between admission and discharge by subtracting date of admission from date of discharge, including time spent on transfer for medical or surgical purposes while still 'on the books' of psychiatric units and hospitals. It should be remembered that because of the existing legislative provisions a small number of involuntary patients may be discharged on trial but remain 'on the books' until formally discharged later.

*Socio-economic group.* Patients were allocated to one of 11 socio-economic groups (SEGs) according to the Classification of Occupations of the Central Statistics Office (CSO) in the Census of Population 2006 (Central Statistics Office 2007c). Socio-economic group was determined by a person's occupation or their former occupation where the patient was unemployed or retired. If a patient was a student or engaged in house duties, the occupation of the head of household or spouse or guardian was used to determine socio-economic group. If such persons (students and/or persons engaged in house duties) were not members of a family unit and/or were living alone (e.g. widowed grandparents, etc.) they were assigned to the unknown group.

# Summary

This report presents data on all admissions to, discharges from, and deaths in, Irish psychiatric units and hospitals as recorded on the National Psychiatric In-patient Reporting System (NPIRS) in 2010. Data are presented nationally, regionally, by HSE area, and locally, by county, by hospital type, and by individual psychiatric units and hospitals. Rates reported are per 100,000 total population.

## Admissions

There were 19,619 admissions to Irish psychiatric units and hospitals in 2010, a rate of 462.7 per 100,000 total population. This is a reduction of 576 admissions from 2009 (20,195). The rate of admissions also declined from 476.3 in 2009 to 462.7 per 100,000 population in 2010. There were 6,266 first admissions in 2010, an increase in the number of first admissions from 2009 (5,972). The rate of first admissions also increased from 140.9 per 100,000 in 2009 to 147.8 in 2010. There was a reduction in the number of re-admissions from 14,223 in 2009 to 13,353 in 2010 and, for the first time since 1980, re-admissions dropped to below 70% of all admissions (68%).

There was an equal proportion of male and female admissions, and the admissions rates were similar for both: 464.6 per 100,000 for males and 460.9 for females. Males had a higher rate of first admissions than females, at 159.0, compared with 136.6 for females. The 45–54 year age group had the highest rate of all admissions, at 727.7, followed by the 35–44 year age group, at 660.4, and the 55–64 year group, at 659.1 per 100,000 population. The 75 year and over age group had the lowest rate of all admissions, at 461.6 per 100,000 population. The 18–19 year age group had the highest rate of first admissions, at 291.6 per 100,000, followed by the 20–24 year age group, at 216.4, and the 25–34 year age group, at 193.4. The 55–64 year age group had the lowest rate of first admissions, at 162.4 per 100,000.

Single persons accounted for over half (54.5%) of all admissions in 2010, married persons accounted for 27%, widowed accounted for 4% and divorced accounted for 3%. The unskilled occupational group had the highest rate of all (749.2) and first admissions (175.1).

Depressive disorders and schizophrenia together accounted for almost half (48%) of all admissions; depressive disorders accounted for 29% of all and 30% of first admissions, while schizophrenia accounted for almost 20% (19.5%) of all and 12% of first admissions. Depressive disorders had the highest rate of all (132.8) and first admissions (44.7). Schizophrenia had the second-highest rate of all admissions, at 90.1 per 100,000. Neuroses had the second-highest rate of first admissions, at 18.2 per 100,000, followed by schizophrenia, at 17.7, and alcoholic disorders, at 15.0.

Eight per cent of all and nine per cent of first admissions were involuntary, representing no change in all admissions from 2009 and a one percentage point increase in involuntary first admissions from 2009 (8%). The rate of involuntary all admissions was highest for schizophrenia, at 17.1 per 100,000, followed by mania, at 7.3, and depressive disorders, at 2.8.

There were 202 admissions with no fixed abode in 2010.

## **Discharges and deaths**

There were 19,614 discharges from, and 140 deaths in, Irish psychiatric units and hospitals in 2010. Males accounted for 62% of all deaths in 2010, and 58% of deaths were aged 75 years and over.

Almost half (48%) of all discharges took place within two weeks of admission, a further 20% occurred within two to four weeks of admission, and 26% occurred within one to three months of admission. Ninety-four per cent of all discharges occurred within three months of admission. Over 90% of all discharges for most disorders occurred within three months of admission, with the exception of organic mental disorders, schizophrenia, intellectual disability and development disorders.

The average length of stay for all discharges, excluding those of one year or more, was 26.0 days (median 14.0) days. Discharges with a diagnosis of organic mental disorder had the longest average length of stay, at 45.6 days (median 22.0 days).

## **HSE Areas**

Twenty-seven per cent of admissions were resident in Dublin Mid-Leinster in 2010, with a further 27% resident in HSE South, 24% were resident in HSE West and 21% were resident in Dublin North-East. Less than one per cent of all admissions in 2010 were recorded as non-resident.

HSE South had the highest rate of all admissions, at 496.6 per 100,000, while Dublin Mid-Leinster had the lowest rate, at 439.9 per 100,000 population. Dublin North-East had the highest rate of first admissions, at 164.4 per 100,000, followed by HSE South, at 151.4. Dublin Mid-Leinster and HSE West had the same rate of first admissions each, at 137.3 per 100,000.

Females had higher rates of all admissions than males in Dublin Mid-Leinster and in Dublin North-East, while males had higher rates in HSE South and in HSE West. Males had the highest rates of first admissions in all HSE areas, with rates ranging from 175.9 per 100,000 in Dublin North-East to 143.6 in Dublin Mid-Leinster. Age groups were condensed into two categories: under 45 and 45 years and over. The 45 years and over group had the highest rate of admissions in all HSE Areas, with rates ranging from 678.9 in Dublin North-East to 601.9 in HSE West.

Depressive disorders had the highest rate of all admissions in all four HSE areas, with rates ranging from 158.2 in HSE South to 113.0 in Dublin North-East. Similarly, rates for first admissions for depressive disorders were highest across all four areas, ranging from 52.0 in HSE West to 36.5 in Dublin Mid-Leinster.

HSE South had the highest rate of involuntary all admissions, at 46.4 per 100,000, followed by HSE West, at 40.9, Dublin North-East, at 31.8, and Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 31.2 per 100,000. Dublin North-East had the highest rate of involuntary first admissions, at 15.3 per 100,000 population, followed by HSE South, at 12.8. Both HSE West and Dublin Mid-Leinster had the same rate of involuntary first admissions, at 12.1 per 100,000.

Half of all discharges for Dublin North-East occurred within two weeks of admission, 49% for HSE South, 47% for HSE West and 45% for Dublin Mid-Leinster. Ninety-four per cent of discharges for all areas occurred within three months of admission. Dublin Mid-Leinster had the longest average length of stay, at 27.5 days (median 15.0 days), followed by Dublin North-East, at 25.8 days (median 13.0 days), HSE West, at 25.5 days (median 14.0 days), and HSE South, at 25.0 days (median 13.0 days).

## Counties

The highest rates of first admissions were reported for counties Longford (206.4), Carlow (196.6), Westmeath (186.5) and Wexford (172.3). Monaghan had the lowest rate of first admissions, at 62.5 per 100,000, followed by Cavan, at 76.6.



## Non-residents

There were 55 admissions for non-residents in 2010. Thirty-eight per cent had an address originating in England, 33% had an address in Northern Ireland, and 7% had an address in the United States. Almost 35% of non-residents had a diagnosis of schizophrenia, 18% had a diagnosis of mania, 13% had a diagnosis of alcoholic disorders, and 11% had depressive disorders.

## Hospital type

Fifty-two per cent of all admissions in 2010 were to general hospital psychiatric units, 26% were to psychiatric hospitals (including the Central Mental Hospital Dundrum; Carraig Mór, Cork; and St Joseph's Intellectual Disability Services, St Ita's Hospital, Portrane) and 22% were to private hospitals.

Over one-third of all admissions (34%) to private hospitals, 30% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and almost 23% (22.5%) to psychiatric hospitals had a diagnosis of depressive disorders. Twenty-four per cent of all admissions to psychiatric hospitals and 23% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units had a diagnosis of schizophrenia, compared with almost 7% (6.5%) to private hospitals. The proportion of all admissions to private hospitals with a diagnosis of alcoholic disorders, at 15%, was twice that of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units, at 7%, and almost twice that of admissions to psychiatric hospitals, at 8%. A somewhat similar pattern was observed for first admissions for alcoholic disorders: 18% to private hospitals, 10% to psychiatric hospitals and 9% to general hospital psychiatric units.

Involuntary admissions accounted for 10% of all admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 10% of admissions to psychiatric hospitals. In contrast, just 2% of admissions to private hospitals were involuntary.

Over one-third of discharges from general hospital psychiatric units (34%) and from psychiatric hospitals (34%) occurred within one week of admission, compared with just 12% of discharges from private hospitals. Over half of all discharges from general hospital psychiatric units (54%) and from psychiatric hospitals (53%) occurred within two weeks of admission, compared with one-quarter of discharges from private hospitals. Average length of stay was longest in private hospitals, at 33.5 days (median 29.0 days). This compares with an average length of stay of 26.0 days (median 11.0) in psychiatric hospitals and 22.8 days (median 12.0) in general hospital psychiatric units.

## Child and adolescent admissions

There were 435 admissions for under 18s in 2010, an increase in admissions for under 18s from 2009 (367). There were 272 admissions to dedicated child and adolescent units in 2010. Eighty-three per cent of these admissions were first admissions.

Over half of all (53%) and first admissions (53%) for under 18s were females. Thirty-five per cent of all admissions were aged 17 years on admission, 33% were aged 16 years, 13% were aged 15 years, 11% were aged 14 years and a further 7% were aged 11–13 years. Similar proportions were observed for first admissions.

Twenty-eight per cent of all admissions for under 18s had a diagnosis of depressive disorders, 11% had neuroses, 9% had schizophrenia and 8% had eating disorders. Depressive disorders accounted for 29% of first admissions for under 18s, neuroses accounted for 11%, schizophrenia accounted for 9% and eating disorders accounted for 7%.

Almost 63% of all admissions for under 18s were to dedicated child and adolescent in-patient units, almost 29% were to general hospital psychiatric units, 7% were to psychiatric hospitals and just 2% were to private hospitals. Similar proportions were observed for first admissions.

Ninety-five per cent of under 18s admitted in 2010 were discharged in 2010. Almost 28% were discharged within one week of admission, 11% were discharged within one to two weeks, 16% were discharged within two to four weeks and 39% were discharged within one to three months.

The average length of stay for persons under 18 admitted and discharged in 2010 was 33.2 days (median 23.5 days). The average length of stay for under 18s was longest for those admitted to child and adolescent units, at 47.1 days (median 41.0 days), followed by private hospitals, at 27.9 days (median 25.0), general hospital psychiatric units, at 11.4 days (median 4.0 days), and psychiatric hospitals, at 7.4 days (median 5.0 days).

# 1 Introduction and Background Information

We are pleased to present our annual report on the activities of Irish psychiatric in-patient services for the year 2010. The report presents cross-sectional data on admissions, discharges and deaths for psychiatric in-patient facilities in Ireland in 2010. Data are presented nationally, regionally (by HSE area), and locally (by county, by hospital type and by individual unit and hospital). Data on admissions for children and adolescents, i.e. those under 18 years of age, are presented separately in this report in Chapter 5. Data on admissions to the dedicated child and adolescent units, St Anne's Centre, Galway; Warrenstown House, Dublin; Ginesa Unit, St John of God Hospital, Dublin; St Joseph's Adolescent Inpatient Unit, St Vincent's Hospital, Fairview; and Willow Grove Adolescent Inpatient Unit, St Patrick's University Hospital, Dublin, are included in that chapter, along with data on admissions to units and hospitals for persons under 18.

Comparative data for 2009 used throughout the report are from the publication *Activities of Irish Psychiatric Units and Hospitals 2009: Main Findings* (Daly and Walsh 2010) and rates reported are per 100,000 total population. All tables referred to in the text are located at the end of each chapter.

Data in this report were obtained from the National Psychiatric In-patient Reporting System (NPIRS). On the advice of the *Commission of Enquiry on Mental Illness* (Department of Health 1966), the Department of Health carried out a census of patients resident in Irish psychiatric hospitals on 31 March 1963, and information on all admissions, discharges and deaths thereafter was collected locally and returned to the Department. On the establishment of the Medico-Social Research Board (MSRB), the census and admission data were transferred to that organisation for analysis and publication. The MSRB published the results of the 1963 psychiatric in-patient census (Walsh 1971), along with a composite publication of data for 1965–1969 (O'Hare and Walsh 1972).

In 1971 the MSRB revised and improved this reporting from in-patient psychiatric facilities, commencing with a census on 31 March of that year. Subsequently, MSRB, and later its successor, the Health Research Board (HRB), continued the series of annual activities reports on admissions, discharges and deaths and continued decennial censuses, the most recent of which was carried out on 31 March 2010 (Daly and Walsh 2011). These reports continue to play a central role in the planning of service delivery. National and regional newsletters, capturing data in the HSE administrative areas, are also produced from the database. The NPIRS database also

provides much of the data on Performance Indicators (PIs) for the mental health services which are used to monitor targets in certain key areas of the services. This need for service planning and implementation to be based on high-quality, reliable and timely information was emphasised in the health information strategy document *Health Information – A National Strategy* (Department of Health and Children 2004).

The Mental Health Information Systems (MHIS) Unit liaises closely with all its stakeholders involved in the collection of mental health information and 2010 was no exception in this regard. The NPIRS training manual was revised and updated in 2010 and personnel from the MHIS unit visited a number of hospitals to deliver the contents of the updated manual and to advise units and hospitals of any changes to procedures. Further visits to hospitals and units are planned for 2011.

In 2008 the HRB signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Mental Health Commission (MHC). This MOU allowed for cooperation in areas of mutual interest in the area of mental health information and for close liaison between the two agencies in an effort to avoid, where possible, areas of duplication in the collection of mental health information. One key facet of the MOU was the agreement by the HRB to undertake a psychiatric in-patient census every three years, commencing in 2010, the results of which are available in the *Irish Psychiatric Units and Hospitals Census 2010* (Daly and Walsh 2011). The HRB also agreed to collect data for NPIRS from all centres approved under the Mental Health Act 2001.

More detailed analysis of the data presented in this report is available on request. A data request form including the terms and conditions concerning the use of data supplied from the NPIRS, along with an information document regarding the database, Information for users of the NPIRS database, can be downloaded from the HRB website [www.hrb.ie](http://www.hrb.ie). This information document outlines the variables collected and records changes in the database over the years. A privacy and confidentiality policy document entitled *Privacy and Confidentiality Policy relating to data held in the Mental Health Information Systems Unit (MHIS Unit) including procedures for the request and release of data* is also available on the HRB website ([www.hrb.ie](http://www.hrb.ie)) and it is advised that this document be consulted before requests for data are submitted to the MHIS Unit.

## Data coverage and collection

Data on admissions to, and discharges from, 67 general hospital psychiatric units, psychiatric hospitals, private hospitals, child and adolescent units and the Central Mental Hospital (CMH) are included in this report. A breakdown of each hospital type for 2010 is presented in Table 1.1.

Hospitals and units included in this report are all those on the Register of Approved Centres by the MHC under the Mental Health Act 2001. Two additional approved centres commenced submitting data in 2010 and data for these centres are presented in this report. The centres are Lois Bridges, Sutton, Dublin, and Willow Grove Adolescent Inpatient Unit, St Patrick's Hospital, Dublin. Data for Willow Grove are presented in Chapter 5 of the report.

Differences in data reported for child and adolescent admissions should also be noted between the MHC report and data in this report. Admissions for children and adolescents in this report include all admissions for persons under 18 years of age regardless of their marital status, whereas the MHC's data on admissions for children and adolescents includes admissions for children as defined under the Mental Health Act 2001, i.e. a child is defined as a person under the age of 18 years other than a person who is or has been married.

Data for the NPIRS were returned quarterly to the MHIS Unit of the HRB, either electronically or manually, according to agreed specifications. With the manual system, completed forms were returned to personnel at the HRB in accordance with procedures and practices established over a number of years. Personnel at the HRB code and process the data and maintain ongoing liaison with hospital personnel. The admission and discharge form used to collect data from hospitals is presented in Appendix 1.

## Quality assurance and validation of data

Data received from units and hospitals for the NPIRS are subjected to various in-built and manual quality assurance and validation measures. Data are cleaned and validated upon receipt and import of data into the database, prior to the return of quarterly status reports to units and hospitals, prior to the return of annual status reports, and at year end in preparation for this report. All units and hospitals are required to sign off on final admission and discharge data for the year in advance of the preparation of this report.

## Legal status

The legal status recorded by NPIRS is that recorded on admission and whilst changes may occur in legal status following admission this is not recorded by the NPIRS. It is important to note that data on legal status presented in this report differs from that reported by the MHC (Mental Health Commission 2011) as it does not include data on admission orders to detain voluntary patients whereas MHC figures do. This is the re-grading of the legal status of a voluntary patient to involuntary.

## Transfers

NPIRS does not record information on transfers because under Sections 20 and 21 of the Mental Health Act 2001, transfers of detained patients either to another approved centre or to the Central Mental Hospital (CMH) remain patients of the centre from which they are transferred. Transfers to the CMH (the only centre so far designated for the reception of such transfers) from the courts and prisons are regulated by the Criminal Law Insanity Act 2006. Patients detained in approved centres can be transferred to the CMH but only following authorisation by a mental health tribunal as provided for by the Mental Health Act 2001.

## Computation of rates

The rates accompanying numerical data in this report were calculated using the Census of Population 2006 (Central Statistics Office 2007a; Central Statistics Office 2007b; Central Statistics Office 2007c). Although the CSO carried out a more recent population census in 2011 the final results of this census were not available at the time of production of this report. All data were rated to the total population. It was not possible to rate divorced aged 18–19 as the number of divorced persons in the population among 18–19-year-olds was not available.



## Health Service Executive Areas

The composition of HSE areas and the mental health catchment areas (MHCA)/Local Health Offices (LHOs) (with which MHCAs are generally coterminous) that comprise HSE areas, consist of electoral divisions (EDs). Population figures for the HSE areas have been supplied courtesy of Health Atlas Ireland in the Health Promotion Unit of the HSE. Population figures for socio-economic groups were not available by HSE area because the census data produced by the CSO for socio-economic groups by EDs related to the socio-economic group of the reference person rather than every person resident in the state on census night. Thus, it was not possible to calculate the socio-economic group for the total population for each HSE area. (If the reference person did not have a socio-economic group – for example, if the reference person was under the age of 15 or if the reference person was absent on census night – then this person was not included in the count for socio-economic group. There were 7,942 households whose reference person did not have a socio-economic group, and these households contained 23,030 persons in total – CSO personal communication).

At the time of publication of this report the composition of a number of MHCAs remain unconfirmed with LHOs, arising from uncertainty relating to boundaries of these MHCAs. These catchment areas are as follows: Areas 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5. However, the numbers involved are small and, thus, rates for the relevant HSE areas are not likely to change significantly were accurate population figures available.

In this report the address from which a person was admitted was used to assign them to a HSE area. In previous years the county from which a person was admitted was used to assign them to a health board area as these boards were composed of aggregations of counties. However, with the formation of the four HSE areas, address information at electoral division level is needed to assign a person to a HSE area. Because of the lack of information on address lines in the data and the difficulty relating to data confidentiality in collecting addresses it has not been possible to assign admissions to an electoral division. Thus, for the purpose of this report, county has been used as in previous years to assign a person to a HSE area. While this is not ideal it is the only possible method given the lack of availability of small area data at present.

Population figures based on CSO census data for 2006 for each HSE area are presented below in Table 1.2. The four HSE areas are roughly equal in terms of the total population.



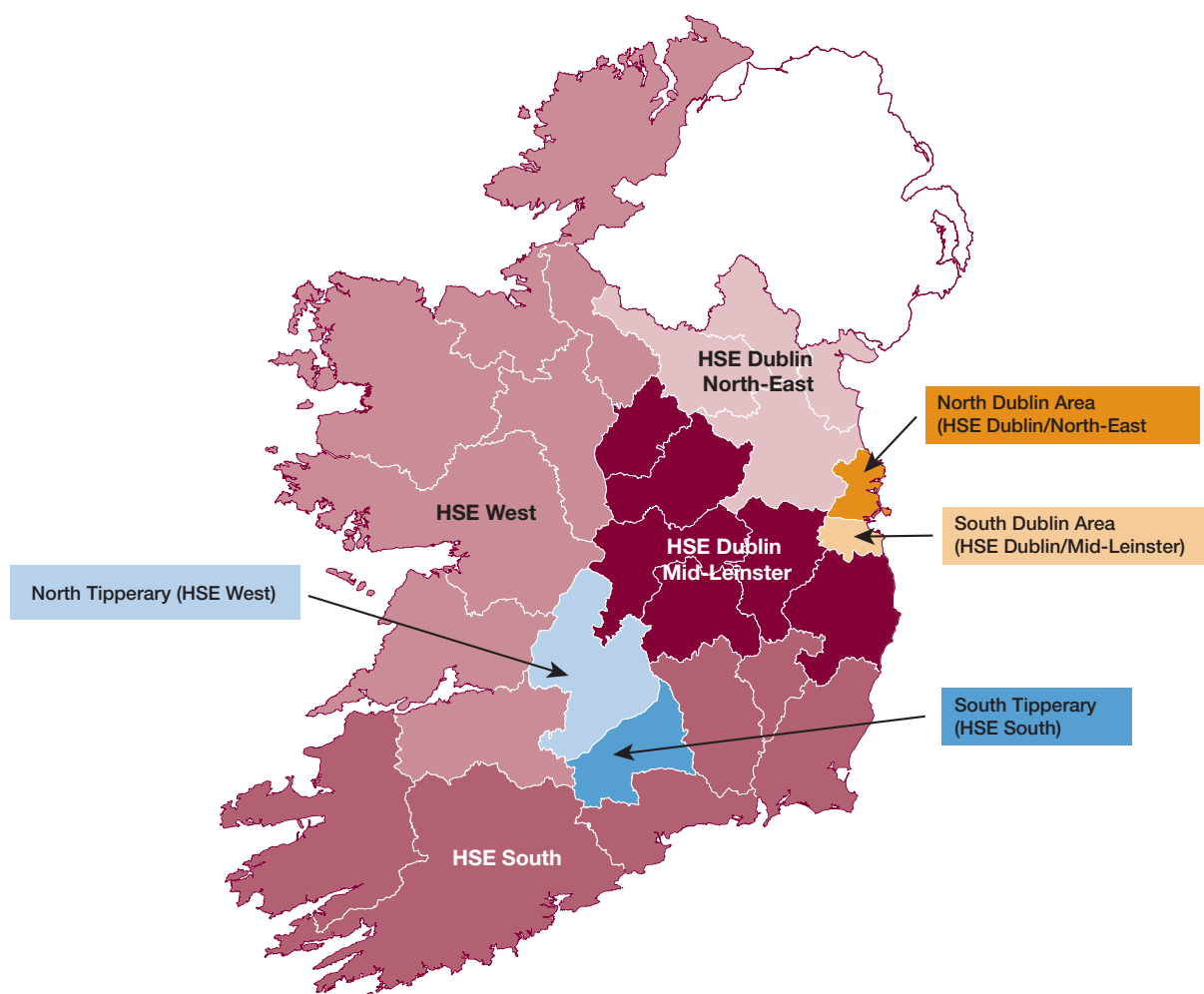

Data on involuntary admissions by HSE areas presented in this report differ from those reported by the Mental Health Commission due to differences in assigning persons to a HSE area. As noted above, HSE area in this report is determined by the address given on admission. In contrast, HSE area, as reported by the MHC, is determined by the location of the approved centre to which a person was admitted.

## Diagnosis

The diagnostic groups in this report are based on the WHO International Classification of Diseases categories (ICD-10, WHO 1992) and are presented in Table 1.3. From 2004 the ICD-10 diagnostic codes were assembled by us into new, more appropriate groupings. Therefore, some groups are not entirely comparable with diagnostic categories used prior to the 2004 report. Only three of the new categories are directly comparable to the old categories: alcoholic disorders, other drug disorders and intellectual disability.

Eating disorders, developmental disorders, and behavioural, emotional disorders of childhood and adolescence are presented as individual entities whereas previously these three categories were included in the neuroses and personality disorder groupings. However, it should be pointed out that organic, schizophrenic, depressive and manic conditions arising in childhood and adolescence are included in the 'F' codes appropriate to these disorders and are not presented as disorders of childhood and adolescence. Finally, ICD-10 uses the term 'mental retardation', but our grouping is of 'intellectual disability' to accord with current Irish usage.

## Limitations

Whilst the MHIS Unit is engaged in continuous quality improvement initiatives and continuous liaison with mental health services personnel concerning data collection and validation and whilst every effort is made to ensure that data is of the highest quality, a number of limitations to the data should be noted.

Two additional in-patient facilities submitted data to the NPIRS in 2010 and three units were removed from the Register of Approved Centres. Thus, any change in admissions or discharges over time or any comparisons with previous or subsequent years must be interpreted with caution and must take into account these additional facilities submitting data. In addition, as mentioned earlier, data presented by the MHC and that presented here may differ due to reasons already outlined and thus comparisons between both sets of data must be interpreted with caution.

Comparison of rates over time should also be interpreted with caution given the change in population base used to calculate rates over the years. From 2006 it was decided to revert to using the total population for the calculation of rates as this is the standard used internationally, allowing for comparability of rates across countries. For this reason, Table 2.2 presents rates of all and first admissions for 1965–2010 per 100,000 total population, allowing comparability of Irish rates over time.

Rates in this report are based on the total population of catchment areas. However, there are significant numbers of privately medically insured persons in every catchment area and the proportions can vary widely. Such persons are more likely to be admitted to private hospitals. As, for the moment, we are unable to adjust for this inflation of denominator catchment populations, comparison of rates between catchments should be done with caution.

As some services do not provide a preliminary diagnosis on admission, but rather supply diagnoses on discharge, diagnostic data on admissions not discharged by the end of the year during which they have been admitted are not available for those services. In these instances, a number of admissions have been returned with unspecified diagnoses and therefore the 'Other and unspecified' diagnostic category includes those with an unspecified mental disorder (F99) and those for whom no diagnosis had been assigned at the time of submission of data to the MHIS Unit. A number of hospitals also indicated having difficulty obtaining diagnoses for admissions/discharges from medical personnel and this is also reflected in the number of admissions/discharges returned with unspecified diagnoses. It is particularly disappointing that some hospitals continue to report this problem despite ongoing requests and the increasing emphasis on evidence-based information to inform service planning and delivery. This will inevitably affect the rates reported for diagnosis and,



in particular, tables relating to individual units and hospitals and their respective catchment areas.

As noted in previous years the collection of information relating to socio-economic group continues to pose a major problem for many units and hospitals. Fifty-two per cent of occupations were returned as unknown, rendering assignment to a socio-economic group impossible. This should be borne in mind when interpreting tables and figures relating to socio-economic group.

The issue of recording data on patients who are transferred between units and hospitals has been a continuing problem for many hospitals. The difficulties have been accentuated by the increasing number of catchment areas where general hospital psychiatric units operate and the psychiatric hospital remains open and transfers occur between the two. This is in addition to transfers from one catchment area to another and of the small number of transfers to the CMH. This issue was addressed at a training seminar, during which the HRB policy concerning how transfers should be dealt with was outlined, and it was further emphasised during recent visits to units and hospitals. Transfers to general hospitals for medical, surgical or other treatment are not required for HRB reporting purposes as this would lead to the loss of valuable length of stay information given that, while in the general hospital, patients, unless discharged, on legal grounds remain 'on the books' of the transferring hospital.

In 2007, an increase in the number of all and first admissions was noted for the first time since the 1980s. This increase could be the result of a number of factors, including legislative changes arising from the introduction in late 2006 of the provisions of the Mental Health Act 2001. Most notable of these provisions in relation to the above-mentioned increase is Section 14(2) of the Act which allows for a patient to be detained for 24 hours for examination by a consultant psychiatrist. Some of these patients, upon examination by a consultant psychiatrist, may be admitted voluntarily and may be deemed not to have a mental illness and be allowed home. For those, usually the majority, deemed to have a mental illness and unwilling to remain as voluntary patients an admission order is completed and they are admitted involuntarily within the 24 hours. Although patients may be allowed home following examination such patients may have been recorded as having been admitted, albeit for a short period of time, i.e. less than 24 hours. Such persons may be reflected in the admission figures in this report, although it is likely that the numbers are small. From 2009, the MHIS Unit have requested that persons should only be returned as admitted when the admission order is made or they have been admitted voluntarily; those allowed home following examination by a consultant within 24 hours should not be recorded as an admission.

Admissions do not necessarily represent incidence of mental illness but rather the activity of in-patient services. Throughout the country there may be considerable differences in admission rates from service to service, but this does not necessarily indicate variations in incidence and may simply reflect differing admission practices.

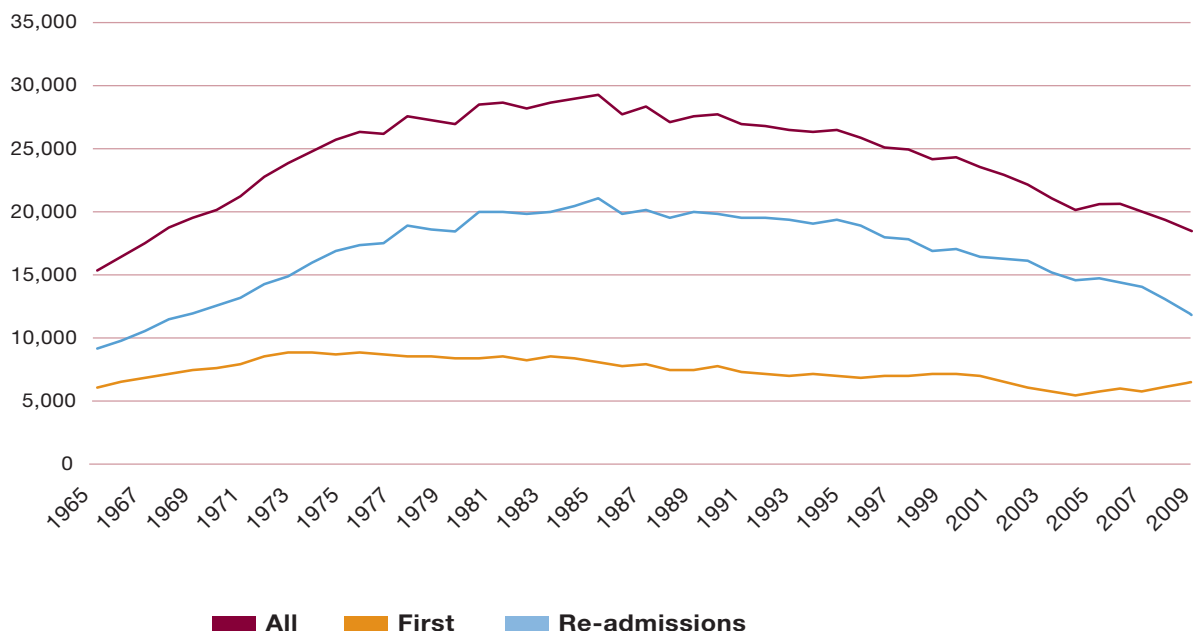
Finally, it should be borne in mind that admissions and discharges represent episodes or events rather than persons. Thus, one person may have several admissions during the course of a year and each admission is recorded separately. The introduction of an Electronic Patient Record (EPR) with a unique identifier for every individual in the State, as recommended by A Vision for Change (Department of Health and Children 2006) and the national health information strategy, Health Information – A National Strategy (Department of Health and Children 2004), would allow longitudinal analysis of data, thereby enabling more effective planning and delivery of services. In addition, A Vision for Change pointed out that a unique identifier is ‘essential to facilitate effective epidemiological research’.

## 2 National and Regional (HSE) Admissions, Discharges and Deaths

### National all and first admissions

There were 19,619 admissions to Irish psychiatric units and hospitals in 2010, a rate of 462.7 per 100,000 total population (Table 2.1 and Table 2.2). This is a reduction of 576 admissions from 2009 (20,195). The rate of admissions also declined from 476.3 in 2009 to 462.7 per 100,000 population in 2010. There were 6,266 first admissions in 2010, an increase in the number of first admissions from 2009 (5,972). The rate of first admissions also increased from 140.9 per 100,000 in 2009 to 147.8 in 2010. There was a reduction in the number of re-admissions from 14,223 in 2009 to 13,353 in 2010. For the first time since 1980, re-admissions dropped to below 70% of all admissions (68%).

Admission numbers have been steadily declining since reaching a peak of 29,392 in 1986 (Figure 2.1 and Table 2.2). The pattern of decline for re-admissions is similar to that of all admissions, while first admissions have not shown such great variations in pattern since 1965 as that for all admissions. In the ten-year period 2001–2010 there has been a 20% decline in admission numbers.

## Gender and age

There was an equal proportion of male and female admissions, and the admission rates were similar for both: 464.6 per 100,000 for males and 460.9 for females (Table 2.3). The equal distribution of male and female admissions has been observed for the last three years. Males had a higher rate of first admissions than females, at 159.0, compared with 136.6 for females.

The 45–54 year age group had the highest rate of all admissions, at 727.7 followed by the 35–44 year age group, at 660.4, and the 55–64 year group, at 659.1 per 100,000 population (Table 2.3). The 75 year and over age group had the lowest rate of all admissions, at 461.6 per 100,000 population. The 18–19 year age group had the highest rate of first admissions, at 291.6 per 100,000, followed by the 20–24 year age group, at 216.4, and the 25–34 year age group, at 193.4. The 55–64 year age group had the lowest rate of first admission, at 162.4 per 100,000.

## Marital status

Single persons accounted for over half (54.5%) of all admissions in 2010, married persons accounted for 27%, widowed accounted for 4% and divorced accounted for 3%. Although divorced persons accounted for just 3% of all admissions they had the highest rate of admissions, at 1,122.0 per 100,000 (Table 2.4). Similarly, they had the highest rate of first admissions, at 280.5 per 100,000. Single and widowed males had higher rates of all admissions (507.5 and 449.5, respectively) than their single and widowed female counterparts (411.0 and 436.3, respectively). Females who were married or divorced had higher rates of admission, at 394.2 and 1,145.2 per 100,000, respectively, compared with males who were married (278.0) or divorced (1,094.5 per 100,000). Males had higher rates of first admissions across all marital status groups compared with females.

## Socio-economic group

The unskilled occupational group had the highest rate of all (749.2) and first admissions (175.1) (Table 2.5). The high rate amongst the unskilled group is in keeping with the pattern observed over many years. However, it must be noted that over half (52%) of all occupations were returned as unspecified thus making assignment to a socio-economic group impossible. The manual skilled group had the second-highest rate of all admissions, at 351.1 per 100,000, followed by the semi-skilled group, at 324.4. Employers and managers had the lowest rate of all (97.6) and first admissions (37.8).



## Diagnosis

Depressive disorders accounted for 29% of all and 30% of first admissions and had the highest rate of all (132.8) and first admissions (44.7) (Table 2.6). Schizophrenia accounted for almost 20% of all admissions and 12% of first admissions and had the second-highest rate of all admissions, at 90.1 per 100,000. Mania accounted for 11% of all and 7% of first admissions and had the third-highest rate of all admissions, at 49.4 per 100,000. Alcoholic disorders accounted for 9% of all and 10% of first admissions and had the fourth-highest rate of all admissions, at 42.2 per 100,000. Neuroses had the second-highest rate of first admissions, at 18.2 per 100,000, followed by schizophrenia, at 17.7, and alcoholic disorders, at 15.0. Males had higher admission rates than females for schizophrenia (108.0 per 100,000 for males and 72.3 for females), while females had higher rates for depressive disorders, at 153.7, than males, at 111.9 per 100,000.

## Legal status

Eight per cent of all and 9% of first admissions were involuntary, representing no change in all admissions from 2009 and a minimal increase in involuntary first admissions from 2009 (8%) (Table 2.7). The rate of involuntary all admissions was 37.8 per 100,000, relatively unchanged from 2009, at 38.5. There was a slight increase in the first admissions rate for involuntary admissions, at 13.2 per 100,000, compared with 11.9 in 2009.

The rate of involuntary all admissions was highest for schizophrenia, at 17.1 per 100,000, followed by mania, at 7.3, and depressive disorders, at 2.8 (Table 2.8).

It should be noted that data on legal status differs from that reported by the Mental Health Commission. Data in this report does not include data on Admission Orders to detain voluntary patients whereas data reported by the Mental Health Commission includes such Admission Orders.

## No fixed abode

There were 202 admissions with no fixed abode in 2010. Sixty-seven per cent were male, 63% were single, 25% had a diagnosis of schizophrenia, 14% had a diagnosis of other drug disorders, 12% had a diagnosis of depressive disorders and 11% had a diagnosis of alcoholic disorders.



## National discharges and deaths

There were 19,614 discharges from, and 140 deaths in, Irish psychiatric units and hospitals in 2010 (Table 2.9). Males accounted for 62% of all deaths in 2010, and 58% of deaths were aged 75 years and over (Table 2.10).

## Length of stay

Almost half (48%) of all discharges took place within two weeks of admission, a further 20% occurred within two to four weeks of admission and 26% occurred within one to three months of admission (Table 2.11). Ninety-four per cent of all discharges occurred within three months of admission.

Thirty-nine per cent of discharges with a diagnosis of alcoholic disorders, 27% with a diagnosis of depressive disorders and 19% with a diagnosis of schizophrenia occurred within one week of admission (Table 2.11). Over 90% of all discharges for most disorders occurred within three months of admission, with the exception of organic mental disorder, schizophrenia, intellectual disability and development disorders.

Thirty-one per cent of voluntary admissions were discharged within one week of admission, compared with 14% of involuntary admissions (Table 2.12). Almost 70% (69.5%) of those discharges admitted voluntarily were discharged within four weeks of admission, compared with 49% of those admitted involuntarily.

## In-patient days

Table 2.13 presents an analysis of in-patient days for discharges and deaths, excluding those with a length of stay of one year or more. Two per cent of discharges were thus excluded as they distort the number of in-patient days considerably. Discharges within one week of admission accounted for 30% of all discharges, 3% of in-patient days and an average length of stay of 3 days (median 3 days). The average length of stay was 26.0 days (median 14.0) days.

Discharges with a diagnosis of organic mental disorder had the longest average length of stay – at 45.6 days (median 22.0 days) – and accounted for 3% of discharges and 5% of in-patient days (Table 2.14). Schizophrenia had the second-longest average length of stay, at 36.5 days (median 20.0 days), and accounted for 20% of discharges and 28% of in-patient days. Other drug disorders had the shortest average length of stay, at 12.6 days (median 6.0).

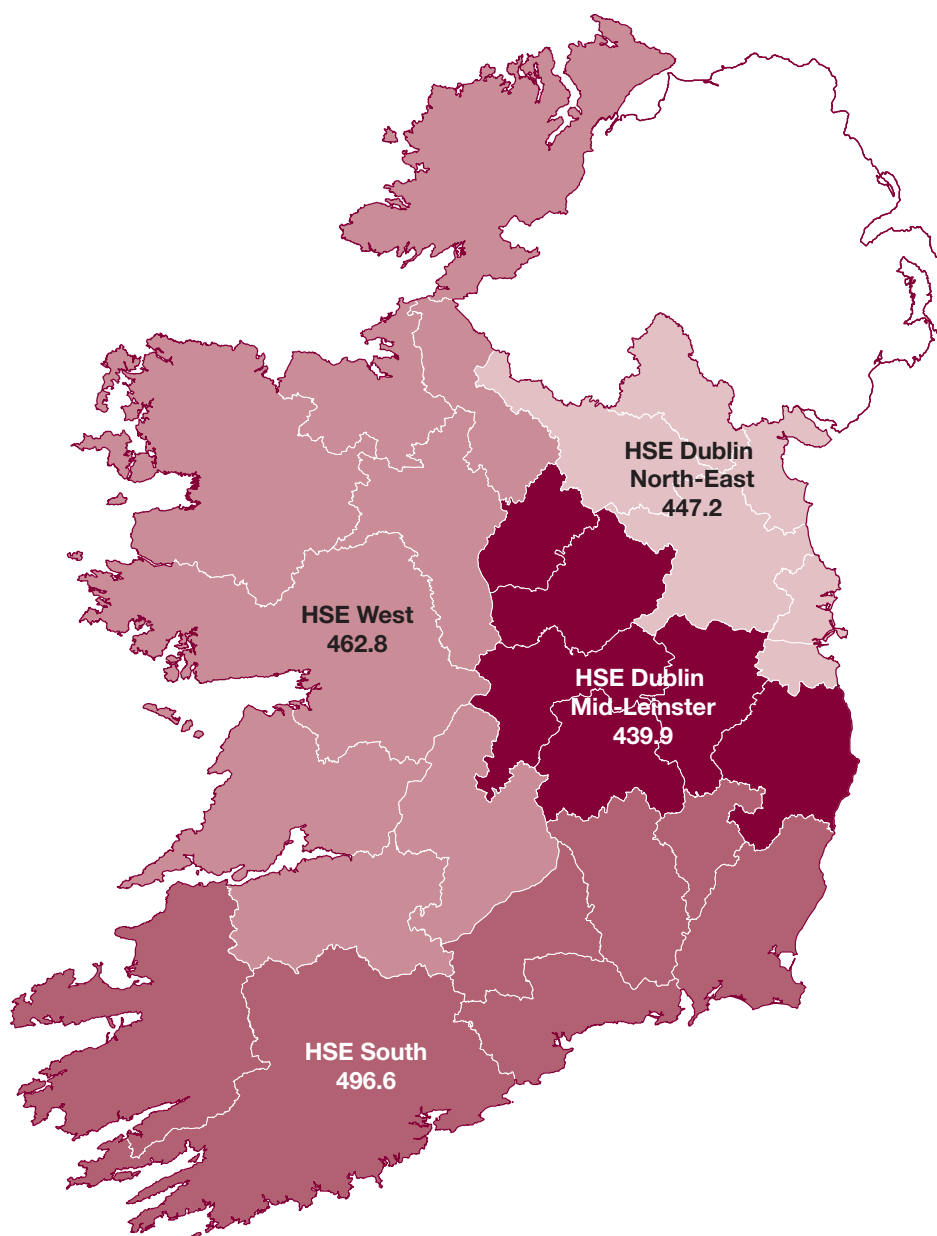

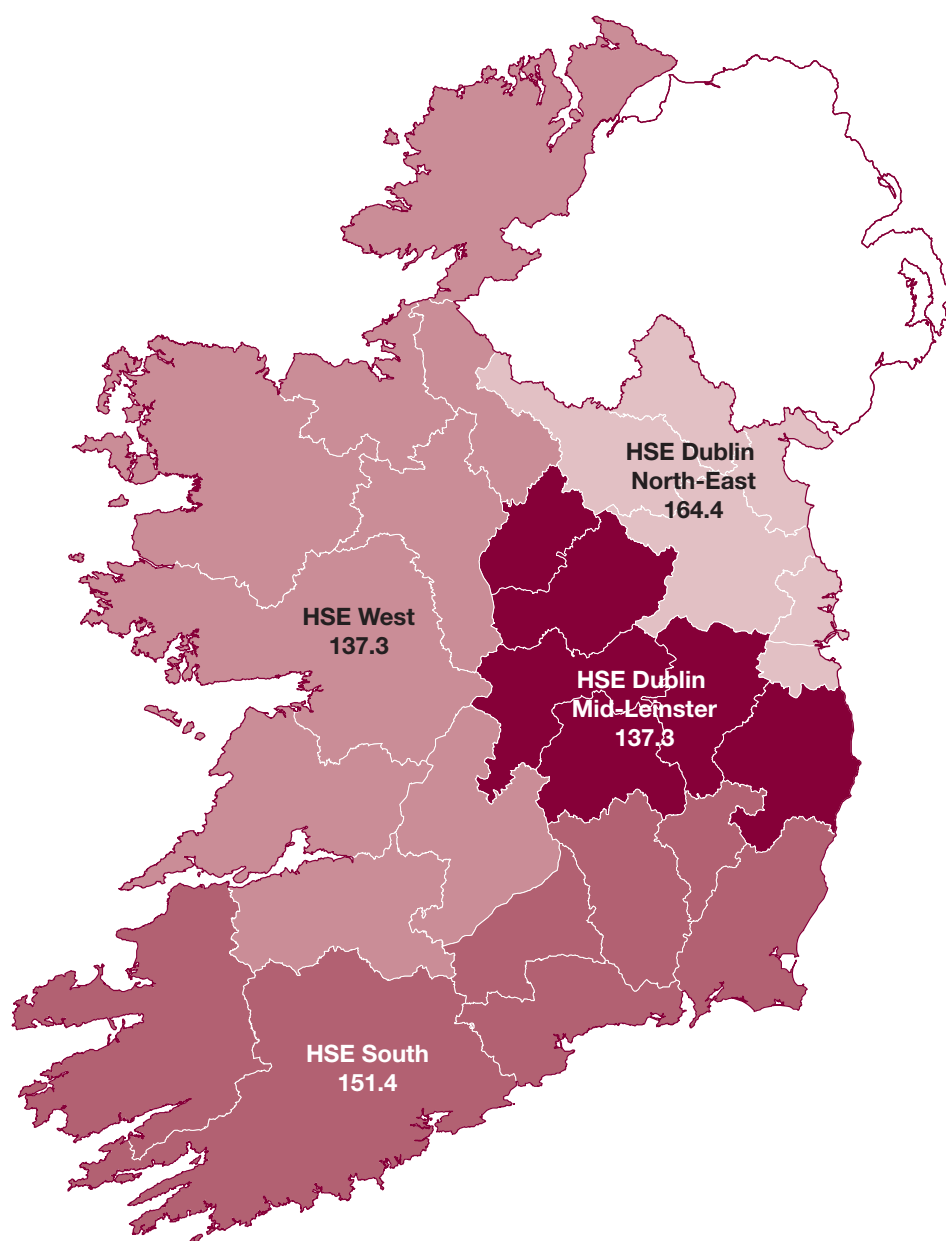
## All and first admissions

Twenty-seven per cent of admissions were resident in Dublin Mid-Leinster in 2010, with a further 27% resident in HSE South, 24% in HSE West and 21% in Dublin North-East. Less than one per cent of all admissions in 2010 were recorded as non-resident.

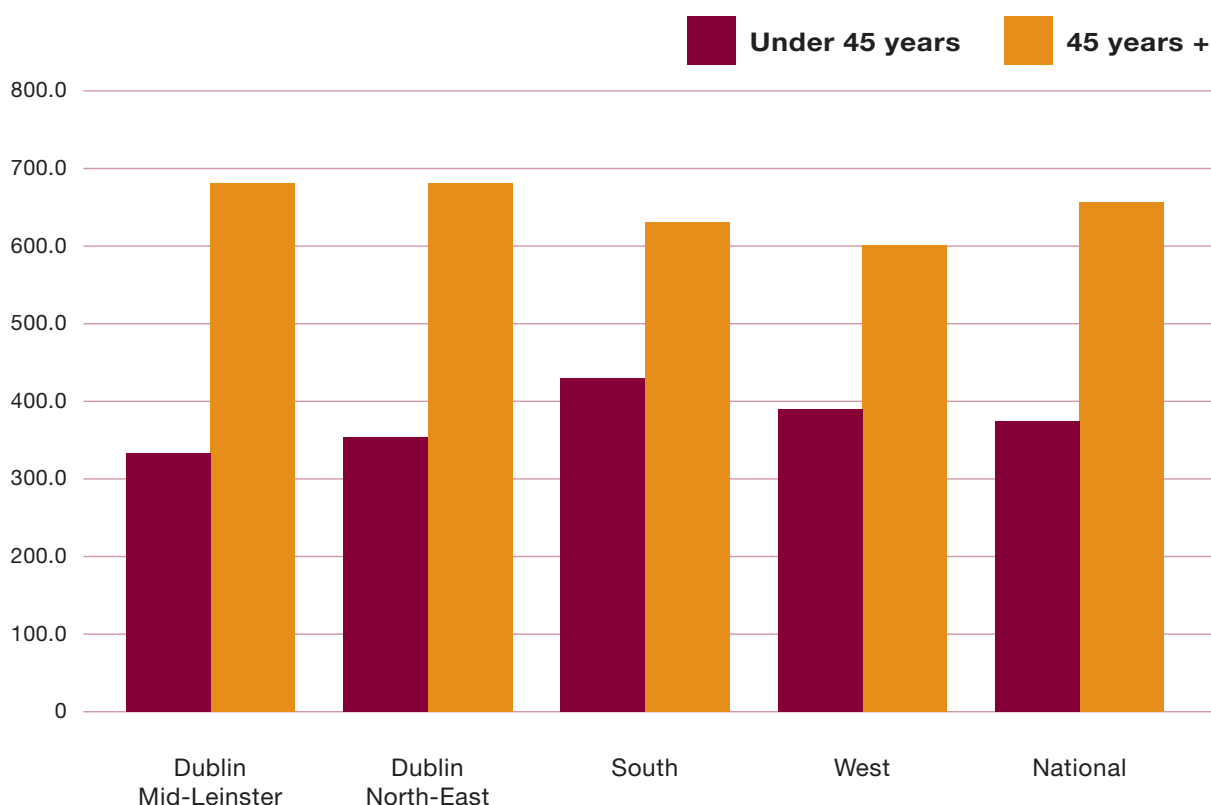


**Figure 2.3** Health Service Executive Areas. First admissions. Ireland 2010.

HSE South had the highest rate of all admissions, at 496.6 per 100,000, followed by HSE West, at 462.8 and Dublin North-East, at 447.2 (Table 2.15 and Figure 2.2). Dublin Mid-Leinster had the lowest rate of all admissions, at 439.9 per 100,000 population. Dublin North-East had the highest rate of first admissions, at 164.4 per 100,000, followed by HSE South, at 151.4 (Table 2.15 and Figure 2.3). Dublin Mid-Leinster and HSE West had the same rate of first admissions each, at 137.3 per 100,000.

## Gender and age

Females had higher rates of all admissions than males in Dublin Mid-Leinster (458.6 per 100,000 for females and 420.9 for males) and in Dublin North-East (453.4 per 100,000 for females and 440.9 for males), while males had higher rates in HSE South (512.7 for males and 480.3 for females) and in HSE West (480.5 per 100,000 for males and 444.8 for females) (Table 2.15). Males had the highest rates of first admissions in all HSE areas, with rates ranging from 175.9 per 100,000 in Dublin North-East to 143.6 in Dublin Mid-Leinster (Table 2.15).

HSE South had the highest rate of all admissions amongst the 18–19 year age group (653.2), the 25–34 year age group (716.2) and the 35–44 year age group (707.6) (Table 2.16); Dublin North-East had the highest rate amongst the 45–54 year age group (777.6) and the 65–74 year age group (668.8); Dublin Mid-Leinster had the highest rate amongst the 55–64 year age group (709.7) and the 75 year and over age group (608.5). HSE West had the highest rate of all admissions amongst the 20–24 year age group, at 558.9 per 100,000. First admission rates for groups in the age range 35–74 were highest in Dublin North-East (Table 2.17). HSE South had the highest rates of first admissions for the 18–19 year age group and for the 25–34 year age group; Dublin Mid-Leinster had the highest rate for the 75 and over age group, while HSE West had the highest rate for the 20–24 year age group.

Age groups were condensed into two distinct groups, under 45 years and 45 years and over. The 45 years and over group had the highest rate of admissions in all HSE Areas, with rates ranging from 678.9 in Dublin North-East to 601.9 in HSE West (Figure 2.4).

## Marital status

Divorced persons had the highest rate of all admissions in all HSE areas, with rates ranging from 1,478.6 per 100,000 in Dublin North-East to 832.3 in HSE West (Table 2.18). Single persons had the second-highest rate of all admissions in Dublin North-East (405.4), HSE South (533.9) and HSE West (490.8), while widowed persons had the second-highest rate in Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 555.6 per 100,000. Rates of first admissions were highest for divorced persons in all areas, with rates ranging from 413.7 per 100,000 in Dublin North-East to 202.4 in HSE West. Widowed persons had the second-highest rate of first admissions in Dublin Mid-Leinster (190.5), HSE South (159.6) and HSE West (139.9), while single persons had the second-highest in Dublin North-East, at 142.5 per 100,000.

## Socio-economic group

Non-manual occupations accounted for the highest proportion of all admissions in all four HSE areas, ranging from 15% in Dublin Mid-Leinster to 9% in HSE West (Table 2.19). However, as mentioned previously, caution must be exercised when interpreting data on socio-economic group as 52% of occupations were returned as unknown or unspecified, thus making assignment to a socio-economic group impossible. The proportion of unknown/unspecified occupations returned was highest for admissions resident in Dublin North-East, at 60.5% of all admissions.

Non-manual occupations similarly accounted for the largest proportion of first admissions in all areas, ranging from 15% in Dublin Mid-Leinster and 15% in HSE South to 9% in HSE West (Table 2.20).

## Diagnosis

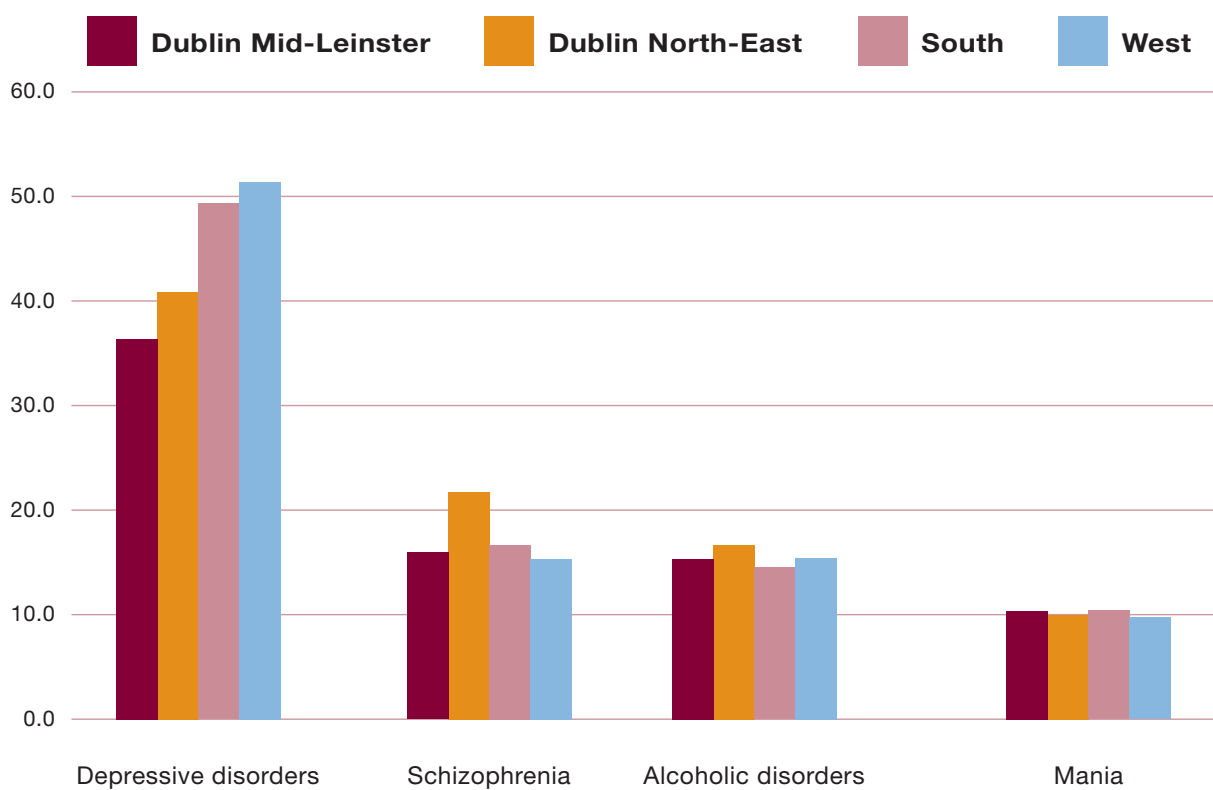

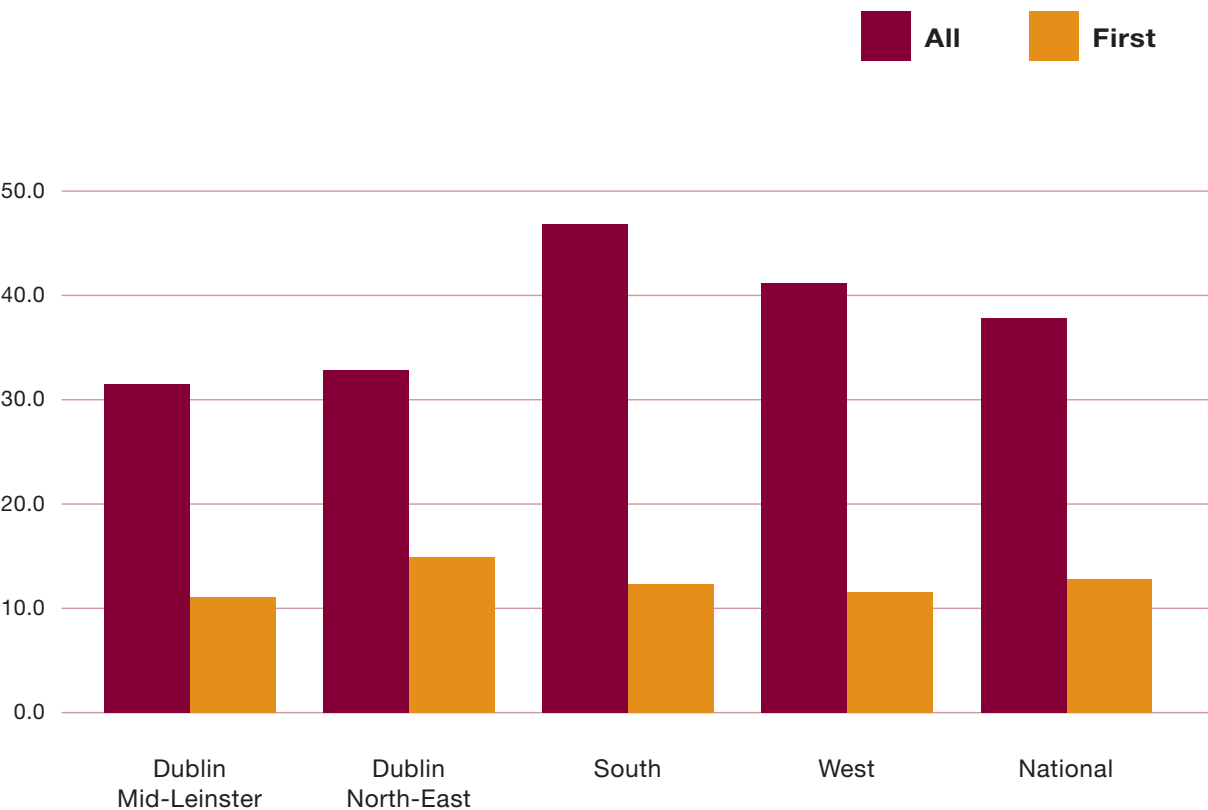
**Figure 2.5** Health Service Executive Areas. All admissions by selected diagnoses.

Depressive disorders had the highest rate of all admissions in all four HSE areas, with rates ranging from 158.2 in HSE South to 113.0 in Dublin North-East (Table 2.21 and Figure 2.5). Similarly, rates for first admissions for depressive disorders were highest across all four areas, ranging from 52.0 in HSE West to 36.5 in Dublin Mid-Leinster (Table 2.22 and Figure 2.6).

Schizophrenia had the second-highest rate of all admissions in each HSE area, ranging from 101.1 per 100,000 in HSE South to 82.8 in Dublin Mid-Leinster and 82.8 in Dublin North-East.

## Legal status

HSE South had the highest rate of involuntary all admissions, at 46.4 per 100,000, followed by HSE West, at 40.9, and Dublin North-East, at 31.8 (Table 2.23 and Figure 2.7). Dublin Mid-Leinster had the lowest, at 31.2 per 100,000. Dublin North-East had the highest rate of involuntary first admissions, at 15.3 per 100,000 population, followed by HSE South, at 12.8. Both HSE West and Dublin Mid-Leinster had the same rate of involuntary first admission, at 12.1 per 100,000.

## Length of stay

Thirty-two per cent of discharges for Dublin North-East occurred within two weeks of admission (Table 2.24). The equivalent proportions for the other HSE areas were as follows: 28% for Dublin Mid-Leinster, 30% for HSE South and 27% for HSE West. Half of all discharges for Dublin North-East occurred within two weeks of admission, 49% for HSE South, 47% for HSE West and 45% for Dublin Mid-Leinster (Table 2.24). Ninety-four per cent of discharges for all areas occurred within three months of admission.

Dublin Mid-Leinster had the longest average length of stay, at 27.5 days (median 15.0 days), followed by Dublin North-East, at 25.8 days (median 13.0 days), HSE West, at 25.5 days (median 14.0 days), and HSE South, at 25.0 days (median 13.0 days) (Table 2.26).

## Counties

Rates of first admissions by county are presented in Table 2.27 and Figure 2.8. Admissions returned as non-residents were excluded from this analysis. The highest rates of first admissions were reported for counties Longford (206.4), Carlow (196.6), Westmeath (186.5) and Wexford (172.3). Monaghan had the lowest rate of first admissions, at 62.5 per 100,000, followed by Cavan, at 76.6.

## Diagnosis

First admissions resident in Tipperary South had the highest rate of depressive disorders, at 82.9 per 100,000 population, followed by Tipperary North, at 75.7, Longford, at 75.6, and Mayo, at 72.7. Monaghan had the lowest rate of first admissions for depressive disorder, at 14.3 per 100,000.

First admissions resident in Kerry had the highest rate of admissions for schizophrenia, at 25.7 per 100,000, followed by Meath, at 23.3, Donegal, at 21.1, and Dublin and Cork, both at 20.8. Waterford had the lowest rate of first admissions for schizophrenia, at 0.9 per 100,000.

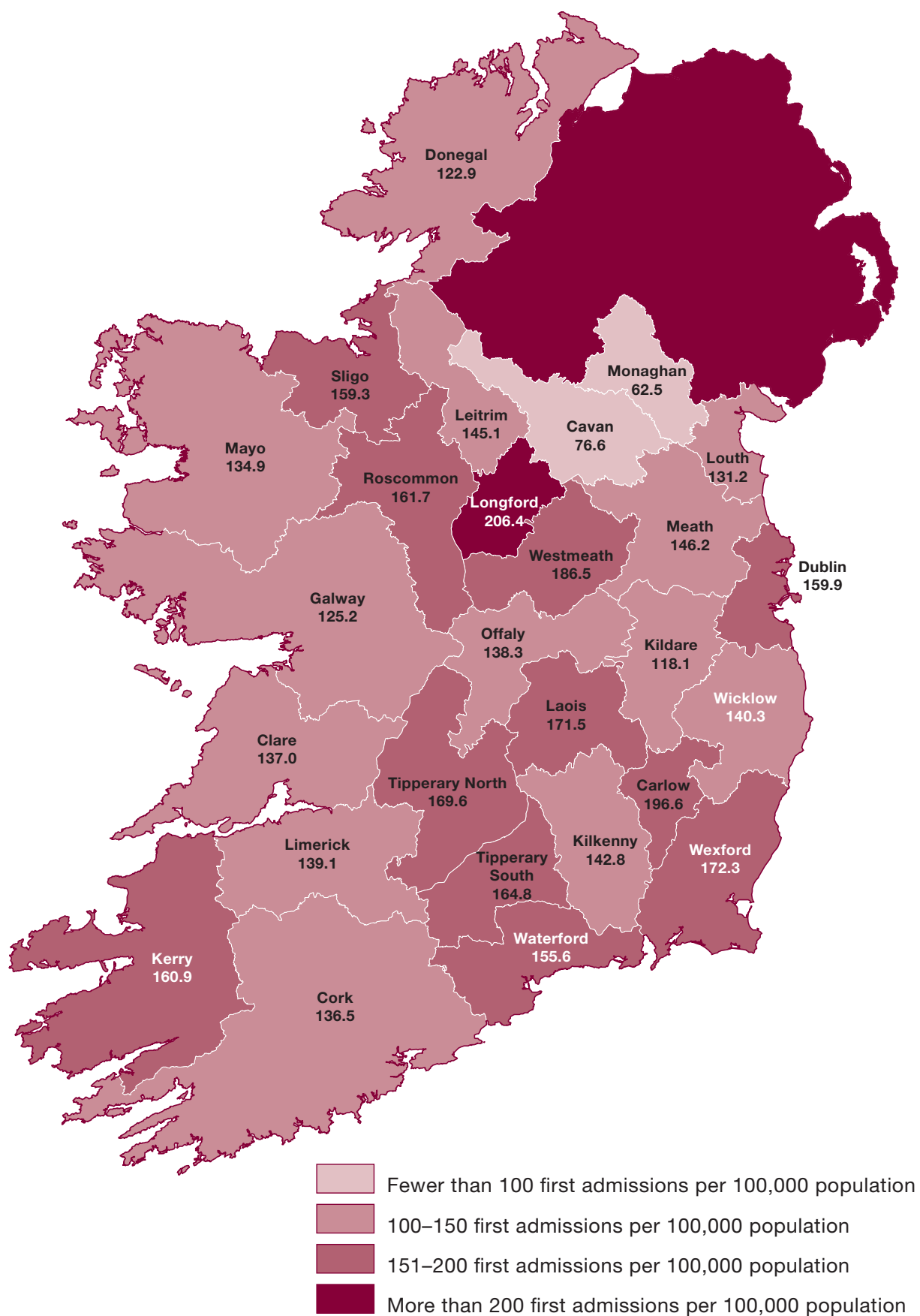
First admissions resident in Sligo had the highest rate of alcoholic disorders, at 32.8 per 100,000, followed by Leitrim, at 31.1, Westmeath, at 27.7, and Longford, at 26.2. Waterford had the lowest rate of first admissions for alcoholic disorders, at 4.6 per 100,000 population.

## Non-residents

The designation of a person as non-resident is determined by the address given by the person at the time of their admission and it is therefore more likely to reflect persons who have recently arrived in the country.

There were 55 admissions for non-residents in 2010, a reduction of 14 from 2009. Thirty-eight per cent had an address originating in England, 33% had an address in Northern Ireland, and 7% had an address in the United States (Table 2.28). Almost 35% of non-residents had a diagnosis of schizophrenia, 18% had a diagnosis of mania, 13% had a diagnosis of alcoholic disorders and 11% had depressive disorders (Table 2.29).

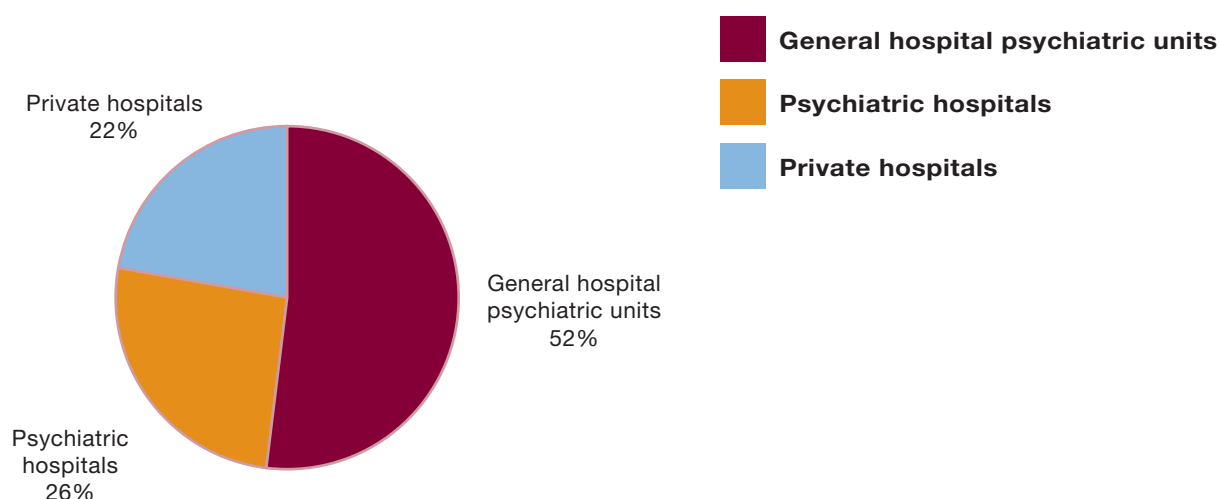

### 3 Hospital Type – Admissions, Discharges and Deaths

Fifty-two per cent of all admissions in 2010 were to general hospital psychiatric units, 26% were to psychiatric hospitals (including the Central Mental Hospital Dundrum; Carraig Mór, Cork; and St Joseph's Intellectual Disability Services, St Ita's Hospital, Portrane) and 22% were to private hospitals (Table 3.1 and Figure 3.1). Admissions to general hospital psychiatric units increased by two percentage points from 2009 to 2010 and admissions to psychiatric hospitals decreased by three percentage points. In the ten-year period from 2001–2010 admissions to general hospital psychiatric units increased from 42% to 52%, admissions to psychiatric hospitals decreased from 44% to 26% and admissions to private hospitals increased from 14% to 22%.

Re-admissions accounted for 70% of all admissions to psychiatric hospitals, 68% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 66% of admissions to private hospitals (Table 3.1).

## Gender and age

Over half of all admissions to general hospital psychiatric units (53%) and to psychiatric hospitals (54%) were male, while 60% of all admissions to private hospitals were female (Table 3.1). Fifty-five per cent of first admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 59% of first admissions to psychiatric hospitals were male, while almost 55% of first admissions to private hospitals were female.

A higher proportion of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units (46%) and to psychiatric hospitals (43%) were aged 25–44 years than to private hospitals (31%). In contrast, 41% of admissions to private hospitals were aged 45–64 years, compared with 32% to psychiatric hospitals and 30% to general hospital psychiatric units (Table 3.2).

## Marital status

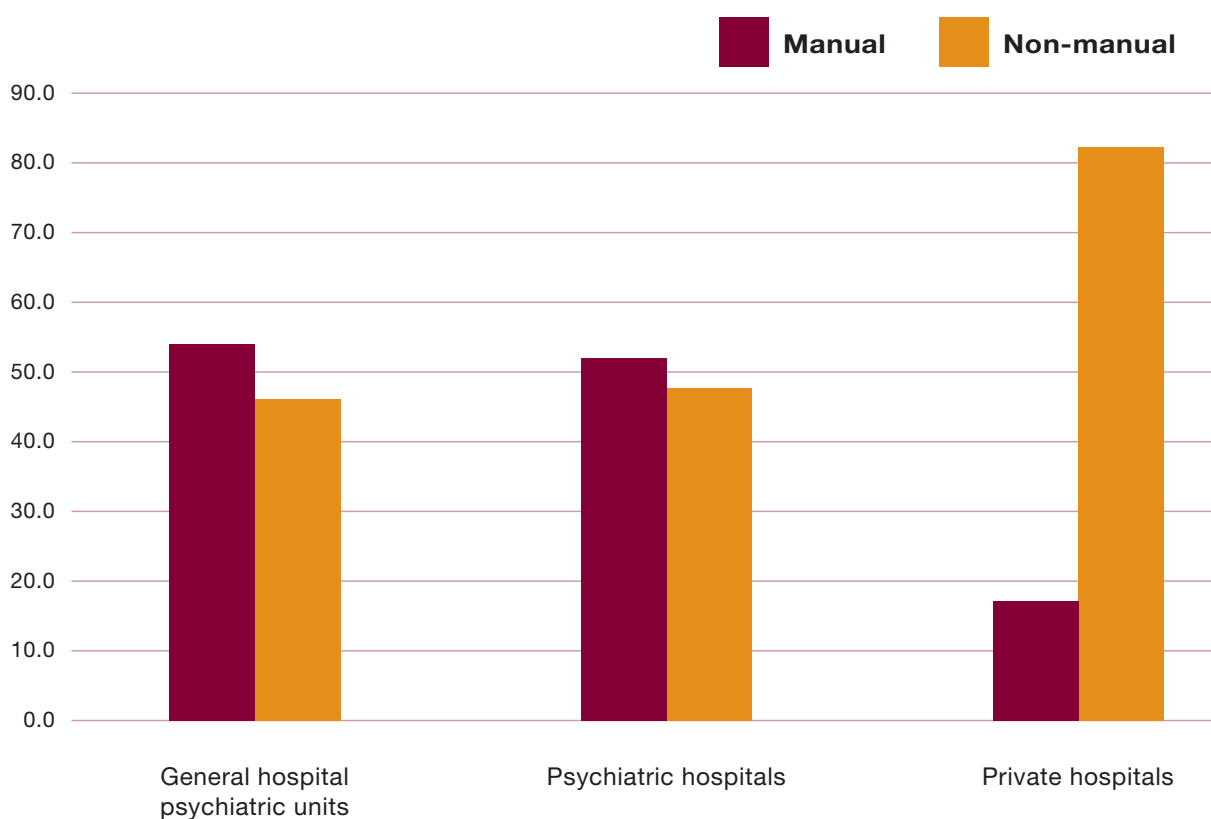
Almost 61% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units were single, while the comparable figure for psychiatric hospitals was 54% and that for private hospitals was 41% (Table 3.3). A higher proportion of admissions to private hospitals were married, at 44%, compared with admissions to either general hospital psychiatric units (22%) or psychiatric hospitals (22%). Similar patterns were observed for first admissions.



## Socio-economic group

One-fifth of admissions to private hospitals were for higher and lower professional (combined), compared with 7% to general hospital psychiatric units and 3% to psychiatric hospitals (Table 3.4). Fifteen per cent of admissions to private hospitals were for non-manual occupations, while that for general hospital psychiatric units was 13% and that for psychiatric hospitals was 9%.

Socio-economic groups were combined into two groups, manual and non-manual occupations. A higher proportion of admissions to private hospitals (83%) had non-manual occupations, compared with 48% to psychiatric hospitals and 46% to general hospital psychiatric units (Figure 3.2). Over half of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units (54%) and to psychiatric hospitals (52%) were for manual occupations, compared with 17% to private hospitals.

## Diagnosis

Over one-third of all (34%) and first (36%) admissions to private hospitals had a diagnosis of depressive disorders (Table 3.6 and Table 3.7). Thirty per cent of all admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and almost 23% (22.5%) to psychiatric hospitals had a diagnosis of depressive disorders.

Twenty-four per cent of all admissions to psychiatric hospitals and 23% of all admissions to general hospital psychiatric units had a diagnosis of schizophrenia, compared with almost 7% (6.5%) to private hospitals (Table 3.6). Similarly, 5% of first admissions to private hospitals had a diagnosis of schizophrenia, compared with 16% to psychiatric hospitals and 13% to general hospital psychiatric units (Table 3.7).

The proportion of admissions to private hospitals with a diagnosis of alcoholic disorders, at 15%, was twice that of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units, at 7%, and almost twice that of admissions to psychiatric hospitals, at 8% (Table 3.6). A somewhat similar pattern was observed for first admissions for alcoholic disorders; 18% to private hospitals, 10% to psychiatric hospitals and 9% to general hospital psychiatric units (Table 3.7).

## Legal status

Involuntary admissions accounted for 10% of all admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 10% of admissions to psychiatric hospitals. In contrast, just 2% of admissions to private hospitals were involuntary (Table 3.8). Fourteen per cent of first admissions to psychiatric hospitals were involuntary, compared with 10% to general hospital psychiatric units and 2% to private hospitals.

## Length of stay

Over one-third of discharges from general hospital psychiatric units (34%) and from psychiatric hospitals (34%) occurred within one week of admission, compared with just 12% of discharges from private hospitals (Table 3.9). Over half of all discharges from general hospital psychiatric units (54%) and from psychiatric hospitals (53%) occurred within two weeks of admissions, compared with one-quarter of discharges from private hospitals.

Average length of stay for all discharges, excluding those of one year or more, was longest in private hospitals, at 33.5 days (median 29.0 days) (Table 3.10). This compares with an average length of stay of 26.0 days (median 11.0) in psychiatric hospitals and 22.8 days (median 12.0) in general hospital psychiatric units.

## 4 Individual Units and Hospitals – Admissions, Discharges and Deaths

The data for the catchment area populations presented in this chapter have been supplied courtesy of Health Atlas Ireland, Health Promotion Unit, HSE. The catchment areas presented comprise a number of electoral divisions (EDs); however, the composition of three catchment areas remained unconfirmed with Local Health Offices (LHOs), arising from uncertainty relating to the boundaries of these catchment areas. The numbers involved are small and are not likely to change the rates significantly. A list of units and hospitals by individual catchment areas is presented in Appendix 2. Footnotes pertaining to changes/issues of interest for certain hospitals in 2010 should be noted in Table 4.2 as they have not been repeated for every table in this chapter.

The addition of new approved centres to certain catchment areas will be reflected in possible changes in the pattern of rates over time and this should be borne in mind when comparing rates for catchment areas over a particular time span.

All and first admissions for individual catchment areas and their respective populations are presented in Table 4.1. (All tables referred to in this chapter are presented at the end of the chapter.) All admission rates were highest in Waterford Mental Health Catchment Area (MHCA), at 553.1 per 100,000 population, followed by MHCA 7 (Dublin North), at 538.2, and Kerry, at 532.1. Cavan/Monaghan had the lowest rate of all admissions, at 142.3 per 100,000, followed closely by Cluain Mhuire MHCA, at 142.7.

MHCA 7 (Dublin North) had the highest rate of first admissions, at 188.0 per 100,000, followed by Area 6 (Dublin North West), at 160.5, Kerry, at 147.3, and Carlow/Kilkenny, at 146.7. Cluain Mhuire MHCA had the lowest rate, at 15.7 per 100,000.

The number of admissions to individual units and hospitals along with the difference and the percentage change from 2009–2010 are presented in Table 4.2. The number of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units increased by 63, from 10,113 admissions in 2009 to 10,176 in 2010. The biggest increase (161) was observed in Connolly Hospital, Blanchardstown, due in some part to the opening in September 2010 of a new ward to accommodate acute admissions that were previously admitted to St Brendan's Hospital. Admissions to psychiatric hospitals decreased by 738, from 5,876 in 2009 to 5,138 in 2010, although some hospitals recorded minor increases from 2009 to 2010. Private hospitals recorded an overall increase in admissions of 99 from 2009–2010.



## Diagnosis

Tipperary (North and South combined) had the highest rate of all admissions for depressive disorders, at 262.9 per 100,000, followed by Mayo MHCA, at 184.9, and North Lee MHCA, at 163.4 (Table 4.3). Cluain Mhuire MHCA had the lowest rate of all admissions for depressive disorders, at 13.3 per 100,000.

MHCA 7 (Dublin North) had the highest rate of all admissions for schizophrenia, at 140.3 per 100,000, followed by Kerry MHCA, at 137.3, and Longford/Westmeath MHCA, at 119.8 (Table 4.3). MHCA 8 (North County Dublin) had the lowest rate of all admissions for schizophrenia, at 23.0 per 100,000.

Sligo/Leitrim MHCA had the highest rate of all admissions for alcoholic disorders, at 97.1 per 100,000, followed by Donegal MHCA, at 60.0, and MHCA 7 (Dublin North), at 51.1 (Table 4.3). MHCA 8 (North County Dublin) had the lowest rate of all admissions for alcoholic disorders, at 2.3 per 100,000.

In keeping with the order for all admissions, first admission rates for depressive disorders were highest for units and hospitals in Tipperary (North and South combined), at 65.1 per 100,000, followed by Mayo MHCA, at 63.8, and North Lee MHCA, at 59.6 (Table 4.4). Cluain Mhuire MHCA had the lowest rate of first admissions for depressive disorders, at 0.6 per 100,000.

Units and hospitals in MHCA 6 (Dublin North West) had the highest rate of first admissions for schizophrenia, at 36.2 per 100,000, followed by MHCA 7 (Dublin North), at 34.1, and Kerry, at 27.2 (Table 4.4). Units and hospitals in Waterford had the lowest rate of first admissions for schizophrenia, at 0.8 per 100,000 population.

Sligo/Leitrim had the highest rate of first admissions for alcoholic disorders, at 25.0 per 100,000, followed by North Lee MHCA, at 21.5, and MHCA 7 (Dublin North), at 18.4 (Table 4.4). MHCA 8 (North County Dublin) had the lowest rate of first admissions for alcoholic disorders, at 0.5 per 100,000.

## Length of stay

Length of stay on discharge varied greatly across hospitals, with almost half of all discharges from St Ita's Hospital, Portrane (47%), and St Brigid's Hospital, Ardee (47%), occurring within one week of admission (Table 4.21). In addition, over 40% of discharges from St Vincent's Hospital, Fairview (44%), Tallaght Hospital (43%), Bantry General Hospital (42%) and Newcastle Hospital, Greystones (41%), occurred within one week of admission (Table 4.20 and Table 4.21). In contrast, the highest proportion of discharges from private hospitals to occur within one week of admission was in St John of God Hospital, at 15% (Table 4.22).

## 5 Child and Adolescent Admissions

This chapter presents data on admissions for persons under 18 years of age regardless of the in-patient facility to which they were admitted. Thus, some admissions may have been reported on earlier in the report. However, data on admissions to dedicated child and adolescent units have not been reported on previously. These centres are Warrenstown House, Dublin; Ginesa Unit, St John of God Hospital, Dublin; St Anne's Children's Centre, Galway; St Joseph's Adolescent In-patient Unit, St Vincent's Hospital, Fairview; Éist Linn Child and Adolescent In-patient Unit, Cork; and Willow Grove Adolescent Unit, St Patrick's Hospital, Dublin, which became a new approved centre in 2010.

### All and first admissions

There were 435 admissions for under 18s in 2010. This is an increase in admissions for under 18s from 2009 (367), reflecting increased capacity in the child and adolescent services for in-patient admissions. Seventy-nine per cent of these were first admissions (Table 5.1).

There were 272 admissions to dedicated child and adolescent units in 2010 (Table 5.2). Eighty-three per cent of these admissions were first admissions.

### Gender and age

Over half of all (53%) and first admissions (53%) were females (Table 5.1). Thirty-five per cent of all admissions were aged 17 years on admission, 33% were aged 16 years, 13% were aged 15 years, 11% were aged 14 years and a further 7% were aged 11–13 years (Table 5.1). Similar proportions were observed for first admissions.

Fifty-seven per cent of all admissions and of first admissions to dedicated child and adolescent units were female (Table 5.2). Over one-third (35%) of all admissions to dedicated child and adolescent units were aged 16 years, 19% were aged 17 years, 18% were aged 15 years, 17% were aged 14 years and 11% were aged 11–13 years. Similar proportions were observed for first admissions.

### Diagnosis

Twenty-eight per cent of all admissions for under 18s had a diagnosis of depressive disorders, 11% had neuroses, 9% had schizophrenia and 8% had eating disorders



(Table 5.3). Females accounted for 69% of all admissions for under 18s with depressive disorders, 37% of those with neuroses and 85% of those with eating disorders. In contrast, males accounted for 73% of under 18s with a diagnosis of schizophrenia.

Depressive disorders accounted for 29% of first admissions for under 18s, neuroses accounted for 11%, schizophrenia accounted for 9% and eating disorders accounted for 7% (Table 5.3). Females accounted for 69% of first admissions for under 18s with a diagnosis of depressive disorders, 88% of those with a diagnosis of eating disorders and 32% of those with neuroses. Males accounted for 73% of those with schizophrenia and 68% of those with neuroses.

## **Legal status**

Three per cent of all and two per cent of first admissions for under 18s were involuntary in 2010 (Table 5.4). This amounts to a total of 12 involuntary all admissions and eight involuntary first admissions. Table 5.5 presents legal status by diagnoses for admissions for under 18s, and the involuntary admissions are spread across several of the disorders.

## **Hospital type**

Almost 63% (62.5%) of all admissions for under 18s were to dedicated child and adolescent in-patient units, almost 29% (28.5%) were to general hospital psychiatric units, 7% were to psychiatric hospitals and just 2% were to private hospitals (Table 5.6). Similar proportions were observed for first admissions.

## **Length of stay**

Ninety-five per cent of under 18s admitted in 2010 were discharged in 2010. Almost 28% (27.5%) were discharged within one week of admission, 11% were discharged within one to two weeks, 16% were discharged within two to four weeks, 39% were discharged within one to three months and 6% were discharged within three months to one year (Table 5.7).

The average length of stay for persons under 18 admitted and discharged in 2010 was 33.2 days (median 23.5 days) (Table 5.8). The average length of stay for under 18s was longest for those admitted to child and adolescent units, at 47.1 days (median 41.0 days), followed by private hospitals, at 27.9 days (median 25.0), general hospital psychiatric units, at 11.4 days (median 4.0 days), and psychiatric hospitals, at 7.4 days (median 5.0 days).
