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# About the HRB

The Health Research Board (HRB) is the lead agency supporting and funding health research in Ireland. We also have a core role in maintaining health information systems and conducting research linked to national health priorities. Our aim is to improve people's health, build health research capacity, underpin developments in service delivery and make a significant contribution to Ireland's knowledge economy.

## Our information systems

The HRB is responsible for managing five national information systems. These systems ensure that valid and reliable data are available for analysis, dissemination and service planning. Data from these systems are used to inform policy and practice in the areas of alcohol and drug use, disability and mental health.

## Our research activity

The main subjects of HRB in-house research are child health, mental health and alcohol and drug use. The research that we do provides evidence for changes in the approach to service delivery. It also identifies additional resources required to support people who need services for problem alcohol and drug use, mental health conditions and intellectual, physical and sensory disabilities.

The **Mental Health Research Unit** gathers data on patient admissions, treatment and discharges from psychiatric hospitals and units throughout Ireland. The data collected have been reported in the *Activities of Irish Psychiatric Services* since 1965 and continue to play a central role in the planning of service delivery. The unit is extending its service to include information about activity in community care settings in order to reflect the changing patterns of care for patients with a mental illness. Multi-disciplinary experts in the unit carry out national and international research and disseminate findings on mental health and mental illness in Ireland. These findings inform national policy, health service management, clinical practice and international academic research.

The **HRB Statistics series** compiles data on problem alcohol and drug use, child health, disability and mental health from a single point or period in time.

The **HRB Statistics series** replaces the annual reports published by the Disability Databases Unit and the Mental Health Research Unit. Previous reports associated with this series are:

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# Glossary

*Central Mental Hospital.* The Central Mental Hospital, Dundrum, is administered by HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster but serves the country as a whole rather than a specified catchment area.

*Health Research Board (HRB).* The Health Research Board was established in 1986 (under Statutory Instrument No. 279) to promote, assist, commission and conduct medical, health, epidemiological and health services research in Ireland. The Board arose from the amalgamation of two former bodies, the Medical Research Council and the Medico-Social Research Board (MSRB).

*Health Service Executive (HSE) Area.* The address from which each patient was admitted to hospital was used to allocate the patient to the corresponding Health Service Executive area and the admission was rated accordingly. Thus, tabulations relating to HSE areas were calculated irrespective of whether or not the patient was admitted to a hospital administered by that area. Data on patients admitted to private hospitals were returned to the area in which they normally resided. A map outlining each HSE area and its respective catchment population according to the Census of Population 2006 (Central Statistics Office 2007a; Central Statistics Office 2007b; Central Statistics Office 2007c) is presented in this chapter.

*ICD-10.* The diagnostic groups in this report are based on the WHO International Classification of Diseases categories (ICD-10) (WHO 1992).

*In-patient days.* In-patients days were the number of days spent in hospital from date of admission to date of discharge. It was calculated by subtracting date of admission from date of discharge, including time spent on transfer for medical or surgical purposes while still 'on the books' of psychiatric units and hospitals.

*Legal status.* The legal status reported throughout this report is that recorded on admission. Changes may occur in legal status following admission but this is not recorded by the NPIRS.

*Length of stay.* Length of stay was derived by calculating the amount of time spent in hospital between admission and discharge by subtracting date of admission from date of discharge, including time spent on transfer for medical or surgical purposes while still 'on the books' of psychiatric units and hospitals. It should be remembered that because of the existing legislative provisions a small number of involuntary patients may be discharged on trial but remain 'on the books' until formally discharged later.

*Socio-economic group.* Patients were allocated to one of 11 socio-economic groups (SEGs) according to the Classification of Occupations of the Central Statistics Office (CSO) in the Census of Population 2006 (Central Statistics Office 2007c). Socio-economic group was determined by a person's occupation or their former occupation where the patient was unemployed or retired. If a patient was a student or engaged in house duties, the occupation of the head of household or spouse or guardian was used to determine socio-economic group. If such persons (students and/or persons engaged in house duties) were not members of a family unit and/or were living alone (e.g. widowed grandparents, etc.) they were assigned to the unknown group.





# Summary

This report presents data obtained from the National Psychiatric In-patient Reporting System (NPIRS) in 2008 on all admissions to, discharges from, and deaths in, Irish psychiatric units and hospitals. Data are presented nationally, regionally, by HSE area, and locally, by county, by hospital type, and by individual psychiatric units and hospital. Rates reported are per 100,000 total population.

## Admissions

There were 20,752 admissions to Irish psychiatric units and hospitals in 2008, a rate of 489.5 per 100,000 total population. This is a reduction of 17 admissions from 2007 and virtually no change in the rate of admission (489.9) in 2007. There was an increase in the number of first admissions in 2008, from 5,853 in 2007 to 6,194 in 2008, with a corresponding decrease in the number of re-admissions, from 14,916 in 2007 to 14,558 in 2008. The rate of first admissions increased from 138.0 per 100,000 total population in 2007 to 146.1 in 2008. Re-admissions accounted for 70% of all admissions, a slight decrease from 2007 (72%).

Although there was an equal proportion of male and female admissions, females had a higher admission rate, at 492.7 per 100,000, than males, at 486.2. Males had a higher rate of first admission, at 155.3, than females, at 136.8 per 100,000 population. The 45–54 year age group had the highest rate of all admissions, at 768.5 per 100,000 total population, followed by the 35–44 year age group, at 728.2, and the 55–64 year age group, at 684.7. The 20–24 year age group had the highest rate of first admissions, at 212.9 per 100,000.

Single persons accounted for over half of all (54.5%) admissions. The unskilled occupational group had the highest rate of all (975.6) and first (209.5) admissions.

Depressive disorders, schizophrenia and alcoholic disorders accounted for 61% of all admissions; depressive disorders for 30%; schizophrenia for 19%, and alcoholic disorders for 12%. Depressive disorders had the highest rate of all admissions, at 147.3 per 100,000, followed by schizophrenia, at 93.1, and alcoholic disorders, at 58.9. Similarly, depressive disorders had the highest rate of first admission, at 51.8 per 100,000. Alcoholic disorders had the second-highest rate of first admission, at 18.6, followed by schizophrenia, at 15.8.

There was a reduction of one percentage point in the proportion of non-voluntary all admissions and a reduction of two percentage points in non-voluntary first admissions from 2007–2008. Eight per cent of all admissions and 8% of first admissions were non-voluntary.

There were 179 admissions for persons with no fixed abode in 2008.

## Discharges and deaths

There were 20,603 discharges from, and 161 deaths in, Irish psychiatric units and hospitals in 2008. Males accounted for 53% of deaths, and over half of all deaths (57%) were aged 75 years and over.

Half of all discharges occurred within two weeks of admission; 20% occurred within two to four weeks of admission and 24% occurred within one to three months of admission. Ninety-four per cent of discharges thus occurred within three months of admission and 2% of discharges occurred after one year or more in hospital. The average length of stay for all discharges, excluding those of one year or more, was 25.0 days (median 13.0 days).

## HSE Areas

Twenty-nine per cent of all admissions were resident in Dublin Mid-Leinster, 27% were resident in HSE South, 23% were resident in HSE West and 21% were resident in Dublin North-East. Less than one per cent of all admissions in 2008 were recorded as non-residents.

The HSE South had the highest rate of all admissions, at 521.4 per 100,000 population, followed by Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 490.7, HSE West, at 472.6, and Dublin North-East, at 461.3. Dublin North-East had the highest rate of first admissions, at 149.7, followed by HSE South, at 149.2, and Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 145.7 per 100,000. HSE West had the lowest rate of first admission, at 135.4 per 100,000.

Females had higher rates of all admissions than males in Dublin Mid-Leinster (499.1 for females and 482.1 for males) and Dublin North-East (488.0 for females and 434.6 for males). In contrast, males had higher rates than females in HSE South (537.4 for males and 505.2 for females) and HSE West (475.0 for males and 470.1 for females). Males had higher rates than females for first admissions in all HSE areas, with rates ranging from 168.9 in HSE South to 142.6 per 100,000 in HSE West.

The 45 years and over group had the highest rate of admission in all four HSE areas, with rates ranging from 745.8 per 100,000 in Dublin Mid-Leinster to 596.6 in HSE West. The rate of admission for the 45 years and over group was twice that of the under 45 year group in Dublin Mid-Leinster and Dublin North-East.

Depressive disorders had the highest rate of all and first admissions in all HSE areas, with rates for all admissions ranging from 177.1 per 100,000 in HSE South to 115.7 in Dublin North-East. Rates for first admissions ranged from 57.1 in HSE South to 42.4 in Dublin North-East.

HSE South had the highest rate of all non-voluntary admissions, at 44.1 per 100,000, followed by Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 36.6, and HSE West, at 33.5. Dublin North-East had the lowest rate of all non-voluntary admissions, at 33.1 per 100,000.



Thirty-two per cent of discharges for Dublin North-East, 31% for HSE South, 30% for Dublin Mid-Leinster and 29% for HSE West occurred within one week of admission. Two-thirds of all discharges for each HSE area occurred within one month of admission, while over 93% occurred within three months of admission. Discharges for Dublin Mid-Leinster had the longest average length of stay, at 25.8 days (median 14.0 days), followed by HSE South, at 25.1 days (median 13.0 days), Dublin North-East, at 24.6 days (median 13.0 days), and HSE West, at 24.4 days (median 14.0 days).

The highest rate of first admissions was recorded for persons resident in County Westmeath, at 204.2, followed by Longford, at 203.5, Laois, at 192.4, and Kerry, at 186.6. Counties with the lowest rates for first admissions include Monaghan (51.8), Cavan (76.6) and Donegal (105.9).

There were 71 admissions of non-residents in 2008. Forty-one per cent had an address originating in Northern Ireland, 32% had an address in England, while 7% had an address in the United States. One-quarter of admissions of non-residents had a diagnosis of schizophrenia, 24% had a diagnosis of depressive disorders, 10% had a diagnosis of alcoholic disorders, while a further 10% had a diagnosis of mania.

## **Hospital type**

Fifty-one per cent of all admissions and 50% of first admissions were to general hospital psychiatric units. Twenty-nine per cent of all admissions were to public psychiatric hospitals (including the Central Mental Hospital, Dundrum; Carraig Mór, Cork; and St Joseph's Intellectual Disability Service, Portrane) and 20% were to private hospitals. Twenty-four per cent of first admissions were to private hospitals and 26% were to psychiatric hospitals.

Over one-third (36%) of all admissions to private hospitals, 31% to general hospital psychiatric units and 24% to psychiatric hospitals had a diagnosis of depressive disorders. Depressive disorders accounted for the highest proportion of first admissions to all types of hospital, with 41% of first admissions to private hospitals, 36% to general hospital psychiatric units and 29% to psychiatric hospitals. Non-voluntary admissions accounted for 11% of all admissions to psychiatric hospitals, 9% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 1% of admissions to private hospitals.

Over one-third of discharges from psychiatric hospitals (37%) and one-third from general hospital psychiatric units (33%) occurred within one week of admission, compared with 13% from private hospitals. Over half of all discharges from general hospital psychiatric units (54%) and psychiatric hospitals (58%) occurred within two weeks of admission compared with 26% from private hospitals. Discharges from private hospitals had the longest average length of stay, at 33.2 days (median 27.0 days).

## Child and adolescent admissions

There were 406 admissions for children and adolescents under 18 years of age in 2008. This was an increase on admissions from 2007 (364). Seventy-two per cent of admissions were first admissions, an increase on the number and proportion of first admissions from 2007 (249; 68%). There were 143 admissions to dedicated child and adolescent units (St Anne's Children's Centre, Galway; Warrenstown House, Dublin; and Ginesa Unit, St John of God Hospital, Dublin). Eighty-five per cent of these were first admissions. Two hundred and sixty-three (65%) admissions aged under 18 were to adult psychiatric units or hospitals.

Females accounted for over half of all (58%) and first (57%) admissions for under 18s. Forty-three per cent of all admissions were aged 17 years on admission, 28% were aged 16 years, 14% were aged 15 years, 9% were aged 14 years, 3% were aged 13 years and 5% were aged 6–12 years. Females accounted for 62% of all and 58% of first admissions to dedicated child and adolescent units.

Depressive disorders accounted for 26% of all and 29% of first admissions for persons under 18 years of age. Eighteen per cent of all admissions had a diagnosis of eating disorders, 15% had a diagnosis of neuroses and 9% had a diagnosis of schizophrenia. Thirteen per cent of first admissions had a diagnosis of eating disorders and 13% had a diagnosis of neuroses, while 10% had a diagnosis of schizophrenia. Females accounted for 61% of all admissions with depressive disorders, 58% of all admissions with neuroses and 89% of all admissions with eating disorders; males accounted for 60% of all admissions with schizophrenia.

Thirty-eight per cent of all admissions for under 18s in 2008 were to general hospital psychiatric units, 35% were to dedicated child and adolescent units, 17% were to psychiatric hospitals and 10% were to private hospitals.

Ninety-three per cent of all under 18s admitted in 2008 were discharged in 2008. The average length of stay for those admitted and discharged in 2008 was 24.5 days (median 13.0 days). Average length of stay was longest in dedicated child and adolescent units, at 49.7 days (median 41.0 days), followed by private hospitals, at 16.5 days (median 18.0 days), psychiatric hospitals, at 14.0 days (median 6.0 days), and general hospital psychiatric units, at 10.2 days (median 4.0 days).

# 1 Introduction and Background Information

We are pleased to present our annual report on the activities of Irish psychiatric in-patient services for the year 2008. The report presents cross-sectional data on admissions, discharges and deaths for psychiatric in-patient facilities in Ireland in 2008. Data are presented nationally, regionally (by HSE area), and locally (by county, by hospital type and by individual unit and hospital). Data on admissions for children and adolescents, i.e. those under 18 years of age, are presented separately in this report in Chapter 5. Data on admissions to the dedicated child and adolescent units, St Anne's Centre, Galway; Warrenstown House, Dublin; and Ginesa Unit, St John of God Hospital, Dublin, are included in that chapter, along with data on admissions to units and hospitals for under 18s.

Comparative data for 2007 used throughout the report are from the publication *Activities of Irish Psychiatric Units and Hospitals 2007* (Daly *et al.* 2008) and rates reported are per 100,000 total population. There was an increase in the number of units and hospitals reporting to the NPIRS database in 2008 due to additional centres becoming approved centres under the Mental Health Act 2001 (Department of Health and Children 2001). This should be borne in mind when comparing data over time. All tables referred to in the text are located at the end of each chapter.

Data in this report were obtained from the National Psychiatric In-patient Reporting System (NPIRS). On the advice of the Commission of Enquiry on Mental Illness (Department of Health 1966), the Department of Health carried out a census of patients resident in Irish psychiatric hospitals on 31 March 1963, and information on all admissions, discharges and deaths thereafter was collected locally and returned to the Department. On the establishment of the Medico-Social Research Board (MSRB), the census and admission data were transferred to that organisation for analysis and publication. The MSRB published the results of the 1963 psychiatric in-patient census (Walsh 1971), along with a composite publication of data for 1965–1969 (O'Hare and Walsh 1972).

In 1971 the MSRB revised and improved this reporting from in-patient psychiatric facilities, commencing with a census on 31 March of that year. Subsequently, MSRB, and later its successor, the Health Research Board (HRB), continued the series of annual activities reports on admissions, discharges and deaths and continued decennial censuses which became quinquennial in 2006 (Daly and Walsh 2006). These reports continue to play a central role in the planning of service delivery. National and regional newsletters, capturing data in the HSE administrative areas, are also

produced from the database. The NPIRS database also provides much of the data on key Performance Indicators (PIs) for the mental health services which are used to monitor targets in certain key areas of the services. This need for service planning and implementation to be based on high-quality, reliable and timely information was emphasised in the health information strategy document Health Information – A National Strategy (Department of Health and Children 2004).

The MHRU liaises closely with all its stakeholders involved in the collection of mental health information and 2008 was no exception in this regard. The NPIRS training manual was revised and updated in 2008 and personnel from the MHRU visited a number of hospitals to deliver the contents of the updated manual and to advise units and hospitals of changes to the data. Further visits to hospitals and units are planned for 2009.

In 2008 the HRB signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Mental Health Commission (MHC). This MOU allowed for cooperation in areas of mutual interest in the area of mental health information and for close liaison between the two agencies in an effort to avoid, where possible, areas of duplication in the collection of mental health information. One key facet of the MOU was the agreement by the HRB to undertake a psychiatric in-patient census every three years, commencing in 2010. The HRB also agreed to collect data for NPIRS from all centres approved under the Mental Health Act 2001. A number of additional facilities became approved centres in 2008 and data for these centres are included in this report.

More detailed analysis of the data presented in this report is available on request. A data request form including the terms and conditions concerning the use of data supplied from the NPIRS, along with an information document regarding the database, Information for users of the NPIRS database, can be downloaded from the HRB website [www.hrb.ie](http://www.hrb.ie). This information document outlines the variables collected and records changes in the database over the years. A privacy and confidentiality policy document entitled Privacy and Confidentiality Policy relating to data held in the Mental Health Research Unit (MHRU) including procedures for the request and release of data is also available on the HRB website and it is advised that this document be consulted before requests for data are submitted to the MHRU.

## **Data coverage and collection**

Data on admissions to, and discharges from, 63 general hospital psychiatric units, psychiatric hospitals, private hospitals, child and adolescent units and the Central Mental Hospital (CMH) are included in this report. A breakdown of each hospital type for 2008 is presented in Table 1.1.

Hospitals and units included in this report are all those on the Register of Approved Centres by the Mental Health Commission (MHC) under the Mental Health Act 2001. Six additional approved centres commenced submitting data in 2008 and data for these centres are presented in this report. The centres are as follows: Sycamore Unit, Connolly Hospital, Dublin; St Finbarr's Hospital, Cork; Orchard Grove, Ennis, Co Clare; Unit 9A Merlin Park, Galway; An Coilín, Castlebar, Co Mayo; and Teach Aisling, Castlebar, Co Mayo. Three additional centres (Cappahard Lodge, Ennis, Co Clare; Tearmann and Curragour Wards, St Camillus' Hospital, Limerick; St Anne's Unit, Sacred Heart Hospital, Castlebar, Co Mayo), which were approved in October 2008, will be included in the annual report from January 2009 as they were not in a position to submit returns for the end of 2008. Thus, because these newly approved centres will not commence submitting returns to the NPIRS until 2009, there are differences between data reported here and data for 2008 reported by the Mental Health Commission (MHC) in their annual report for 2008.

Differences in data reported for child and adolescent admissions should also be noted between the MHC report and data in this report. Admissions for children and adolescents in this report include all admissions for persons under 18 years of age regardless of their marital status, whereas the MHC's data on admissions for children and adolescents includes admissions for children as defined under the Mental Health Act 2001, i.e. a child is defined as a person under the age of 18 years other than a person who is or has been married.

Data for the NPIRS were returned quarterly to the Mental Health Research Unit (MHRU) of the HRB, either electronically or manually, according to agreed specifications. With the manual system, completed forms were returned to personnel at the HRB in accordance with procedures and practices established over a number of years. Personnel at the HRB code and process the data and maintain ongoing liaison with hospital personnel. The admission and discharge form used to collect data from hospitals is presented in Appendix 1.

## **Quality assurance and validation of data**

Data received from units and hospitals for the NPIRS are subjected to rigorous quality assurance and validation measures. Data are cleaned and validated upon receipt and import of data into the database, prior to the return of quarterly status reports to units and hospitals, prior to the return of annual status reports, and at year end in preparation for this report. All units and hospitals are required to sign off on final admission and discharge data for the year prior to the preparation of this report.

## **Legal status**

The legal status recorded by NPIRS is that recorded on admission and whilst changes may occur in legal status following admission this is not recorded by the NPIRS. It is important to note that data on legal status presented in this report differs from that reported by the Mental Health Commission (Mental Health Commission 2009) for a number of reasons. Data contained here does not include data on admission orders to detain voluntary patients whereas MHC figures do. This is the re-grading of the legal status of a voluntary patient to involuntary.

## **Transfers**

NPIRS does not record information on transfers because under Sections 20 and 21 of the Mental Health Act 2001, transfers of detained patients either to another approved centre or to the Central Mental Hospital (CMH) remain patients of the centre from which they are transferred. Transfers to the CMH (the only centre so far designated for the reception of such transfers) from the courts and prisons are regulated by the Criminal Law Insanity Act 2006. Patients detained in approved centres can be transferred to the CMH but only following authorisation by a mental health tribunal as provided for by the Mental Health Act 2001.



## Computation of rates

The rates accompanying numerical data in this report were calculated using the Census of Population 2006 (Central Statistics Office 2007a; Central Statistics Office 2007b; Central Statistics Office 2007c). All data were rated to the total population. It was not possible to rate divorced aged 18–19 as the number of divorced persons in the population among 18–19-year-olds was not available.

## Health Service Executive Areas

The composition of HSE areas and the mental health catchment areas (MHCA)/Local Health Offices (LHOs) (with which MHCAs are generally coterminous) that comprise HSE areas, consist of electoral divisions (EDs). Population figures for the HSE areas have been supplied courtesy of Health Atlas Ireland in the Health Promotion Unit of the HSE. Population figures for socio-economic groups were not available by HSE area because the census data produced by the CSO for socio-economic groups by EDs related to the socio-economic group of the reference person rather than every person resident in the state on census night. Thus, it was not possible to calculate the socio-economic group for the total population for each HSE area. (If the reference person did not have a socio-economic group – for example, if the reference person was under the age of 15 or if the reference person was absent on census night – then this person was not included in the count for socio-economic group. There were 7,942 households whose reference person did not have a socio-economic group, and these households contained 23,030 persons in total – CSO personal communication).

At the time of publication of this report the composition of three MHCAs remains unconfirmed with LHOs, arising from uncertainty relating to boundaries of these MHCAs. However, the numbers involved are small and, thus, rates for the relevant HSE areas are not likely to change significantly were accurate population figures available.

In this report the address from which a person was admitted was used to assign them to a HSE area. In previous years the county from which a person was admitted was used to assign them to a health board area as these boards were composed of aggregations of counties. However, with the formation of the four HSE areas, address information at electoral division level is needed to assign a person to a HSE area. Because of the lack of information on address lines in the data and the difficulty relating to data confidentiality in collecting addresses it has not been possible to assign admissions to an electoral division. Thus, for the purpose of this report, county has been used as in previous years to assign a person to a HSE area. While this is not ideal it is the only possible method given the lack of availability of small area data at present.

Population figures based on CSO census data for 2006 for each HSE area are presented below in Table 1.2. The four HSE areas are roughly equal in terms of the total population.

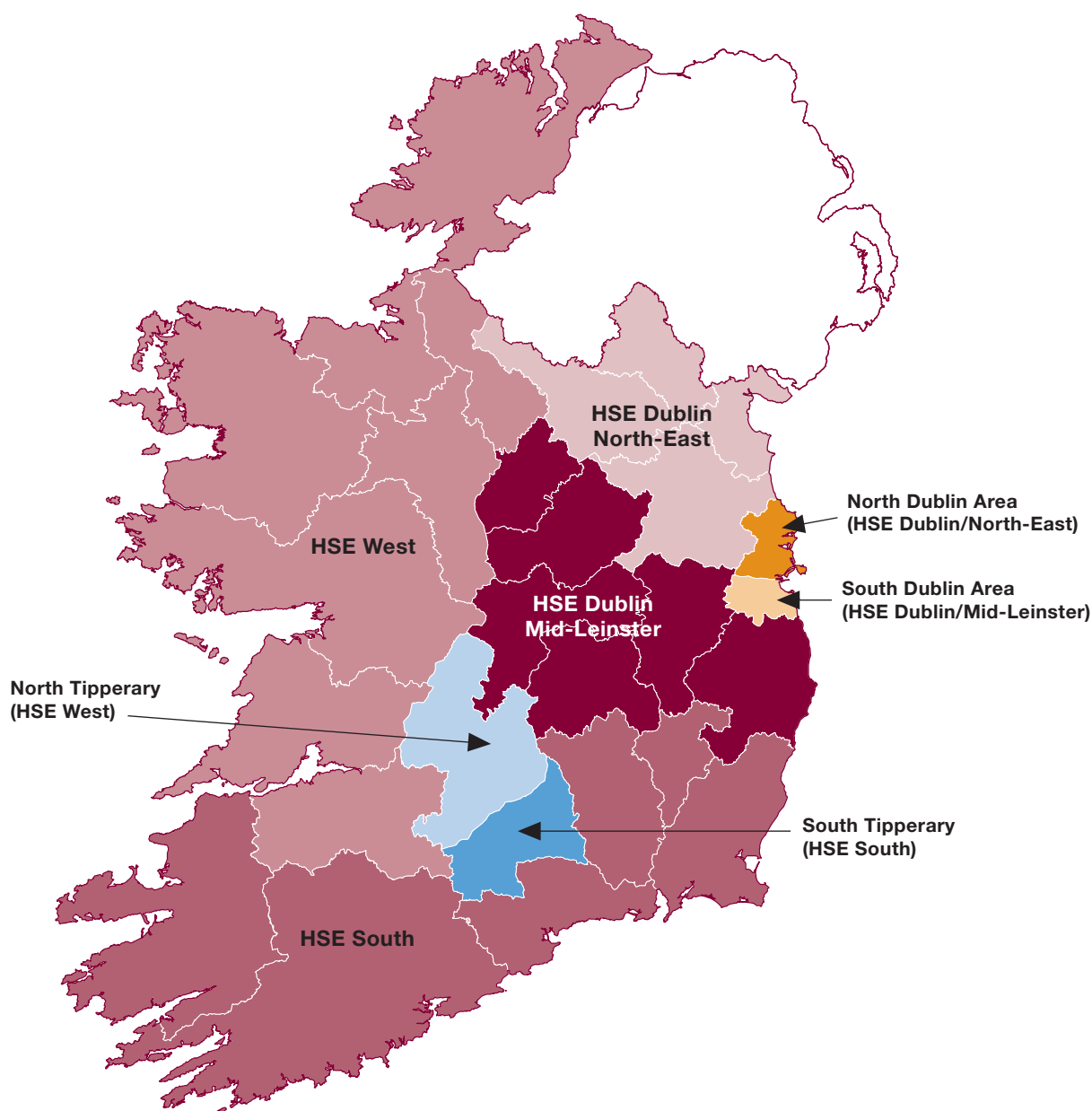

Data on non-voluntary admissions by HSE areas presented in this report differ from those reported by the Mental Health Commission due to differences in assigning persons to a HSE area. As noted above, HSE area in this report is determined by the address given on admission. In contrast, HSE area, as reported by the MHC, is determined by the location of the approved centre to which a person was admitted.

## Diagnosis

The diagnostic groups in this report are based on the WHO International Classification of Diseases categories (ICD-10, WHO 1992) and are presented in Table 1.3. From 2004 the ICD-10 diagnostic codes were assembled by us into new, more appropriate groupings. Therefore, some groups are not entirely comparable with diagnostic categories used prior to the 2004 report. Only three of the new categories are directly comparable to the old categories: alcoholic disorders, other drug disorders and intellectual disability.

Eating disorders, developmental disorders, and behavioural, emotional disorders of childhood and adolescence are presented as individual entities whereas previously these three categories were included in the neuroses and personality disorder groupings. However, it should be pointed out that organic, schizophrenic, depressive and manic conditions arising in childhood and adolescence are included in the 'F' codes appropriate to these disorders and are not presented as disorders of childhood and adolescence. Finally, ICD-10 uses the term 'mental retardation', but our grouping is of 'intellectual disability' to accord with current Irish usage.

## Limitations

Whilst the MHRU is engaged in continuous quality improvement initiatives and continuous liaison with mental health services personnel concerning data collection and validation and whilst every effort is made to ensure that data is of the highest quality, a number of limitations to the data should be noted.

Six additional in-patient facilities submitted data to the NPIRS in 2008. Thus, any change in admissions or discharges over time or any comparisons with previous or subsequent years must be interpreted with caution and must take into account these additional facilities submitting data. In addition, as mentioned earlier, data presented by the MHC and that presented here may differ due to reasons already outlined and thus comparisons between both sets of data must be interpreted with caution.

Comparison of rates over time should also be interpreted with caution given the change in population base used to calculate rates over the years. From 2006 it was decided to revert to using the total population for the calculation of rates as this is the standard used internationally, allowing for comparability of rates across countries. For this reason, Table 2.2 presents rates of all and first admissions for 1965–2008 per 100,000 total population, allowing comparability of Irish rates over time.

Rates in this report are based on the total population of catchment areas. However, there are significant numbers of privately medically-insured persons in every catchment area and the proportions can vary widely. Such persons are more likely to be admitted to private hospitals. As, for the moment, we are unable to adjust for this inflation of denominator catchment populations, comparison of rates between catchments should be done with caution.

As some services do not provide a preliminary diagnosis on admission, but rather supply diagnoses on discharge, diagnostic data on admissions not discharged by the end of the year during which they have been admitted are not available for those services. In these instances, a number of admissions have been returned with unspecified diagnoses and therefore the 'Other and unspecified' diagnostic category includes those with an unspecified mental disorder (F99) and those for whom no diagnosis had been assigned at the time of submission of data to the MHRU. A number of hospitals also indicated having difficulty obtaining diagnoses for admissions/discharges from medical personnel and this is also reflected in the number of admissions/discharges returned with unspecified diagnoses. It is particularly disappointing that some hospitals continue to report this problem despite ongoing requests and the increasing emphasis on evidence-based information to inform service planning and delivery. This will inevitably affect the rates reported for diagnosis and in particular tables relating to individual units and hospitals and their respective catchment areas.

The collection of information relating to socio-economic group continues to pose a major problem for many units and hospitals this year. Forty-seven per cent of occupations were returned as unknown, rendering assignment to a socio-economic group impossible. This should be borne in mind when interpreting tables and figures relating to socio-economic group.

The issue of recording data on patients who are transferred between units and hospitals has been a continuing problem for many hospitals. The difficulties have been accentuated by the increasing number of catchment areas where general hospital psychiatric units operate and the psychiatric hospital remains open and transfers occur between the two. This is in addition to transfers from one catchment area to another and of the small number of transfers to the CMH. This issue was addressed at a training seminar, during which the HRB policy concerning how transfers should be dealt with was outlined, and it was further emphasised during recent visits to units and hospitals. Transfers to general hospitals for medical, surgical or other treatment are not required for HRB reporting purposes as this would lead to the loss of valuable length of stay information given that, while in the general hospital, patients, unless discharged, remain 'on the books' of the transferring hospital.

In 2007, an increase in the number of all and first admissions was noted for the first time since the 1980s. This increase could be the result of a number of factors, including legislative changes arising from the introduction in late 2006 of the provisions of the Mental Health Act 2001. Most notable of these provisions in relation to the above-mentioned increase is Section 14(2) of the Act which allows for a patient to be detained for 24 hours for examination by a consultant psychiatrist. Some of these patients, upon examination by a consultant psychiatrist, may be admitted voluntarily and may be deemed not to have a mental illness and be allowed home. For those, usually the majority, deemed to have a mental illness and unwilling to remain as voluntary patients an admission order is completed and they are admitted involuntarily within the 24 hours. Although patients may be allowed home following examination such patients may have been recorded as having been admitted, albeit for a short period of time, i.e. less than 24 hours. Such persons may be reflected in the admission figures in this report, although it is likely that the numbers are small. From 2009, the MHRU have requested that persons should only be returned as admitted when the admission order is made or they have been admitted voluntarily; those allowed home following examination by a consultant within 24 hours should not be recorded as an admission.

Admissions do not necessarily represent incidence of mental illness but rather the activity of in-patient services. Throughout the country there may be considerable differences in admission rates from service to service, but this does not necessarily indicate variations in incidence and may simply reflect differing admission practices.

Finally, it should be borne in mind that admissions and discharges represent episodes or events rather than persons. Thus, one person may have several admissions during the course of a year and each admission is recorded separately. The introduction of an Electronic Patient Record (EPR) with a unique identifier for every individual in the State, as recommended by A Vision for Change (Department of Health and Children 2006) and the national health information strategy, Health Information – A National



Strategy (Department of Health and Children 2004), would allow longitudinal analysis of data, thereby enabling more effective planning and delivery of services. In addition, A Vision for Change pointed out that a unique identifier is 'essential to facilitate effective epidemiological research'.

## **WISDOM - a mental health information system**

WISDOM is a web-based health information system developed by the HRB in partnership with the HSE. The WISDOM system is used to record, store and retrieve patient information. This information is stored in a centrally located database and includes personal details and records of patient contacts. In addition to maintaining patient records, WISDOM has the ability to generate documents such as appointment letters, schedule appointments, (e.g. with a social worker), and produce reports, (e.g. to identify number of patients receiving a particular treatment type).

WISDOM has been designed to suit the manner in which the Irish mental health service delivers care to patients in both the inpatient and community settings. It is accessible only on the private HSE network to authorised Mental Health Service professionals.

In line with the plan to run WISDOM as a proof of concept followed by a comprehensive evaluation of the outcome, the Donegal Local Health Area was selected as the location for the initial implementation.

The WISDOM Proof of Concept phase commenced in January 2009 with the training of the first system users and subsequent take-up of WISDOM. A team-based approach has been adopted for the roll-out of the system within Donegal. Since January, this roll-out has been continuing according to plan, with the completion of training of approximately 250 HSE personnel scheduled for mid-August 2009. This will allow HSE staff to use the functionality within WISDOM to assist them in providing quality care to users of the mental health services in Donegal.

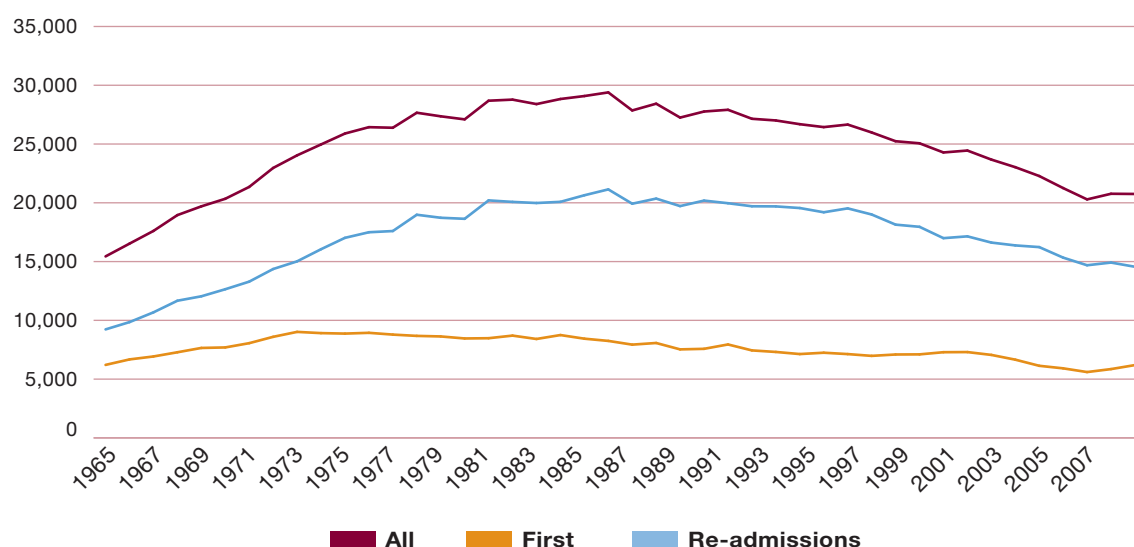
The HRB would like to acknowledge the substantial effort that has been made to date by the HSE, particularly local HSE management, project staff and WISDOM end users.



## 2 National and Regional (HSE) Admissions, Discharges and Deaths

### National all and first admissions

There were 20,752 admissions to Irish psychiatric units and hospitals in 2008, a rate of 489.5 per 100,000 total population (Table 2.1 and Table 2.2). This is a reduction of just 17 admissions from 2007 (20,769), with no change in the rate of admissions (489.9 in 2007) (Table 2.2). There was an increase in the number of first admissions in 2008, from 5,853 in 2007 to 6,194 in 2008 and thus there was a corresponding decrease in the number of re-admissions from 14,916 in 2007 to 14,558 in 2008 (Table 2.1). The rate of first admissions increased from 138.0 in 2007 to 146.1 per 100,000 total population in 2008 (Table 2.2), while that for re-admissions decreased from 351.8 in 2007 to 343.4 per 100,000 in 2008. Re-admissions accounted for 70% of all admissions, a slight decrease from 2007 (72%) (Table 2.1).

Figure 2.1 illustrates the pattern in the number of admissions from 1965 to 2008. Admission numbers reached a peak of 29,392 in 1986 and have been declining since despite an increase from 2006–2007.



## Gender and age

The proportion of male and female admissions was equal, as in 2007, and, similarly, the rate of all admissions for females, at 492.7 per 100,000, was higher than that for males, at 486.2 (Table 2.3), as in 2007. This trend for higher all admission rates for females in the last two years is in contrast to the higher rate for males for many years previously. In 2008, males had a higher rate of first admissions, at 155.3, than females, at 136.8, per 100,000 population (Table 2.3).

The 45–54 year age group had the highest rate of all admissions, at 768.5 per 100,000 total population, followed by the 35–44 year age group, at 728.2, and the 55–64 year age group, at 684.7 (Table 2.3). Rates of first admissions were higher among the younger age groups, with the 20–24 year age group having the highest rate, at 212.9 per 100,000, followed by the 18–19 year age group, at 208.1, and the 35–44 year age group, at 201.5. The 18–19 year age group had the lowest rate of all admissions, at 383.4 per 100,000, while the 55–64 year age group had the lowest rate of first admissions, at 161.9.

## Marital status

Single persons accounted for over half of all (54.5%) admissions, married persons accounted for 27%, widowed accounted for 4% and divorced accounted for 2%. Divorced persons had the highest rate of all (695.4) and first (208.3) admissions, while married persons had the lowest, at 363.8 for all admissions, and 122.5 per 100,000 for first admissions (Table 2.4). Single and divorced males had higher rates of all admissions (536.6 for single and 727.2 for divorced) compared with females who were single (435.1) or divorced (668.6). Females who were married or widowed had higher rates of all admissions, at 438.5 and 487.3, respectively, compared with males who were married (290.5) or widowed (456.8). The pattern for first admissions was similar, with the exception of widowed males who had a higher rate of first admissions (178.8) than females (132.9).

## Socio-economic group

The unskilled occupational group had the highest rate of all (975.6) and first (209.5) admissions (Table 2.5). Manual skilled had the second-highest rate of all admissions, at 404.2, followed by lower professionals, at 350.3, and semi-skilled, at 350.0. Manual skilled had the second-highest rate of first admissions, at 129.4, followed by higher professionals, at 125.6, and lower professionals, at 120.4. However, as 47% of occupations were returned as unknown or unspecified in 2008, making assignment to a socio-economic group impossible, caution should be exercised when interpreting data on socio-economic group.

## Diagnosis

Depressive disorders accounted for 30% of all and 35% of first admissions; schizophrenia accounted for 19% of all and 11% of first admissions; while alcoholic disorders accounted for 12% of all and 13% of first admissions. These three disorders combined accounted for 61% of all admissions.

Depressive disorders had the highest rate of all admissions, at 147.3 per 100,000, followed by schizophrenia, at 93.1 and alcoholic disorders, at 58.9 (Table 2.6). Similarly, depressive disorders had the highest rate of first admissions, at 51.8 per 100,000. Alcoholic disorders had the second-highest rate of first admissions, at 18.6, followed by schizophrenia, at 15.8.

Females had higher rates of all and first admissions for depressive disorders, at 170.7 and 54.8, respectively, than males, at 124.0 for all and 48.7 for first admissions. In contrast, males had higher rates of all and first admissions for schizophrenia (115.9 for all and 19.8 for first) and alcoholic disorders (71.8 for all and 23.9 for first) than females (70.3 for all and 11.7 for first admissions for schizophrenia, and 45.9 for all and 13.4 for first admissions for alcoholic disorders).

## Legal status

Eight per cent of all and 8% of first admissions were non-voluntary (Table 2.7). This is a reduction of one percentage point for all admissions and two points for first admissions since 2007. This is the second complete year since the full enactment of the Mental Health Act 2001 in late 2006. Comparative proportions for non-voluntary admissions in 2006 were 11% of all and 12% of first.

The rate of non-voluntary all admissions in 2008 was 37.3 per 100,000 population, while that for first admissions was 11.8 (Table 2.7). This compares with 41.4 for all and 13.3 for first admissions in 2007, and 51.2 for all and 16.4 for first admissions in 2006.

Schizophrenia had the highest rate of non-voluntary admission, at 15.5 per 100,000, followed by mania, at 7.5 and depressive disorders, at 4.0 (Table 2.8).

There were 59 non-voluntary admissions for alcoholic disorders in 2008 and 32 of these did not have a secondary diagnosis recorded. However, it should be noted that under the Mental Health Act 2001 persons with a diagnosis of alcoholic disorders or personality disorders cannot be involuntarily admitted without an accompanying mental illness. This was not the case for the above admissions. Similarly, there were 40 non-voluntary (all) admissions for personality disorder in 2008 and 27 of these did not have a secondary diagnosis recorded.

As mentioned earlier in the report, it should be noted that data on legal status differs from that reported by the MHC. Data in this report does not include data on Admission Orders to detain voluntary patients whereas data reported by the Mental Health Commission does. In addition, whilst the HRB has agreed with the MHC to collect data on all approved centres, data for centres approved in the latter part of 2008 are not included in this report because these centres were not in a position to submit returns until January 2009.

## **No fixed abode**

There were 179 admissions for persons with no fixed abode in 2008. Seventy-nine per cent of such admissions were male and 78% were single. Twenty-one per cent had a diagnosis of alcoholic disorders, a further 21% had a diagnosis of schizophrenia, while 18% had a diagnosis of depressive disorders. Twelve per cent were non-voluntary admissions.

## **National discharges and deaths**

There were 20,603 discharges from, and 161 deaths in, Irish psychiatric units and hospitals in 2008 (Table 2.9). Males accounted for 53% of deaths, and over half of all deaths (57%) were aged 75 years and over (Table 2.9). Ninety-two per cent of deaths were aged 55 years and over.

## **Length of stay**

Half of all discharges occurred within two weeks of admission; 20% occurred within two to four weeks of admission and 24% occurred within one to three months of admission (Table 2.10). Ninety-four per cent of discharges thus occurred within three months of admission and 2% of discharges occurred after one year or more in hospital.

Forty-two per cent of discharges with alcoholic disorders, 28% of discharges with depressive disorders and 20% of discharges with schizophrenia occurred within one week of admission (Table 2.10). Almost all discharges for alcoholic disorders (99%) and depressive disorders (96%) and 89% of discharges for schizophrenia occurred within three months of admission.

Thirty-two per cent of voluntary admissions were discharged in 2008 within one week of admission compared with 14% of non-voluntary admissions (Table 2.11). Seventy-two per cent of voluntary admissions were discharged in 2008 within four weeks of admission compared with 45% of non-voluntary admissions.

## **In-patient days**

Analysis of in-patient days for discharges and deaths, excluding those with a length of stay of one year or more, is presented in Table 2.13. As discharges with a length of stay of one year or more distort the number of in-patient days considerably they were excluded and 2% of discharges were thus excluded. Discharges within one week of admission accounted for 31% of discharges, 4% of in-patient days, and had an average length of stay of 2.9 days (median 3.0 days). The average length of stay for all discharges, excluding those of one year or more, was 25.0 days (median 13.0 days).

Depressive disorders accounted for the largest proportion of discharges and in-patient days, at 26.1% and 26.3%, respectively, with an average length of stay of 25.2 days (median 15.0 days) (Table 2.14). Discharges with a diagnosis of organic mental disorders had the longest average length of stay, at 46.5 days (median 20.0 days), followed by schizophrenia, at 33.6 days (median 19.0 days). Discharges with a diagnosis of other drug disorders had the shortest average length of stay, at 12.7 days (median 6.0 days).

## **Health Service Executive (HSE) Areas**

### **All and first admissions**

As outlined in Chapter 1, HSE areas were determined by the address given by patients on admission. Twenty-nine per cent of all admissions were resident in Dublin Mid-Leinster, 27% were resident in HSE South, 23% were resident in HSE West and 21% were resident in Dublin North-East. Less than one per cent of all admissions in 2008 were recorded as non-residents.

The HSE South had the highest rate of all admissions, at 521.4 per 100,000 population, followed by Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 490.7, HSE West, at 472.6, and Dublin North-East, at 461.3. Dublin North-East had the highest rate of first admissions, at 149.7, followed by HSE South, at 149.2, and Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 145.7 per 100,000. HSE West had the lowest rate of first admissions, at 135.4 per 100,000 (Table 2.15 and Figures 2.2 and 2.3).

## **Gender and age**

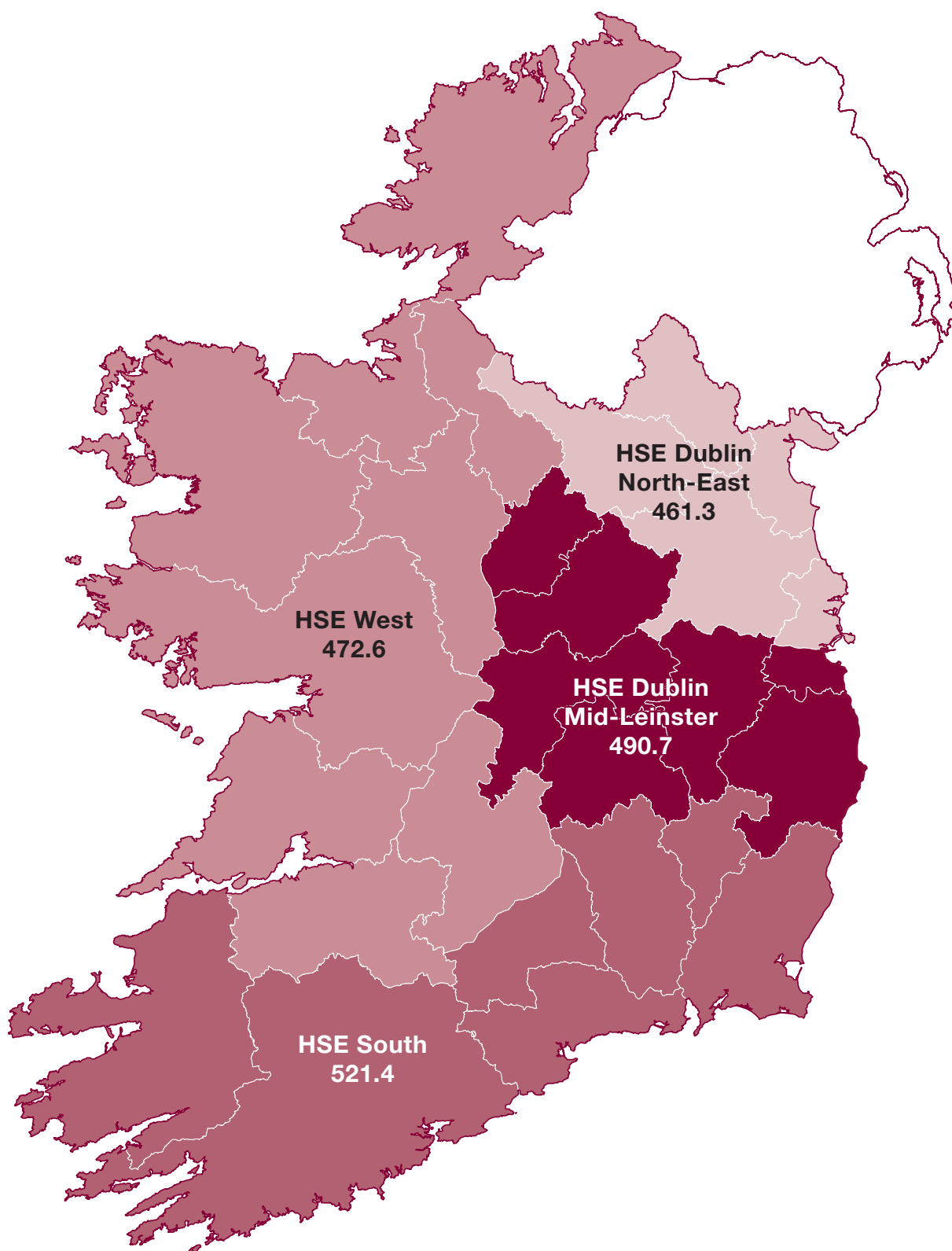
Females had higher rates of all admissions than males in Dublin Mid-Leinster (499.1 for females and 482.1 for males) and Dublin North-East (488.0 for females and 434.6 for males) (Table 2.15). In contrast, males had higher rates than females in HSE South (537.4 for males and 505.2 for females) and HSE West (475.0 for males and 470.1 for females). Males had higher rates than females for first admissions in all HSE areas,



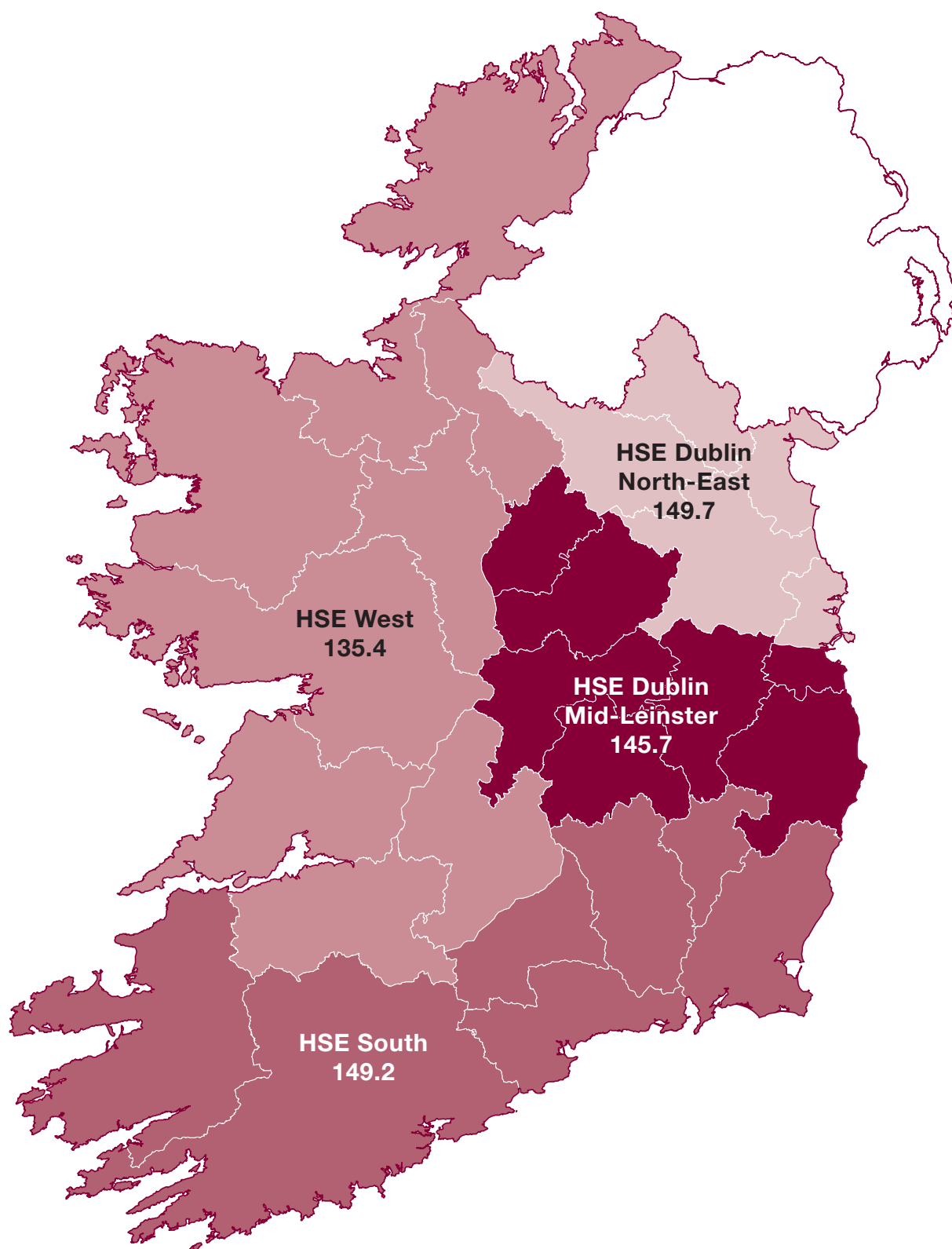
with rates ranging from 168.9 in HSE South to 142.6 per 100,000 in HSE West.

HSE South had higher rates of admissions for all age groups up to 44 years of age, while Dublin Mid-Leinster had higher rates for age groups ranging from 45–74 years (Table 2.16). Dublin North-East had the highest rate of admission for the 75 year and over age group. For first admissions, HSE South had the highest rate for age groups up to 34 years, while Dublin North-East had the highest rates for age groups ranging from 35 years upwards (Table 2.17).

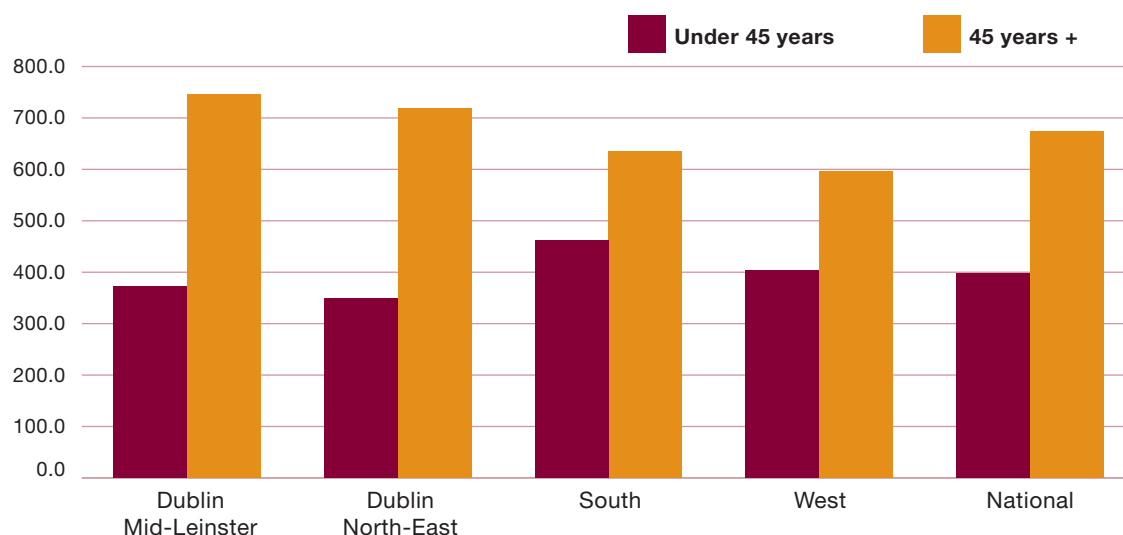
Age groups were collapsed into two broad categories: under 45 years and 45 years and over. The 45 years and over group had the highest rate of admission in all four HSE areas, with rates ranging from 745.8 per 100,000 in Dublin Mid-Leinster to 596.6 in HSE West (Figure 2.4). The rate of admission for the 45 years and over group was twice that of the under 45 year group in Dublin Mid-Leinster and Dublin North-East.

## Marital status

Divorced persons had the highest rate of admissions in Dublin North-East (643.5), HSE South (899.0) and HSE West (802.3), while widowed persons had the highest rate in Dublin Mid-Leinster (531.8) (Table 2.18). A similar pattern was observed for first admissions.

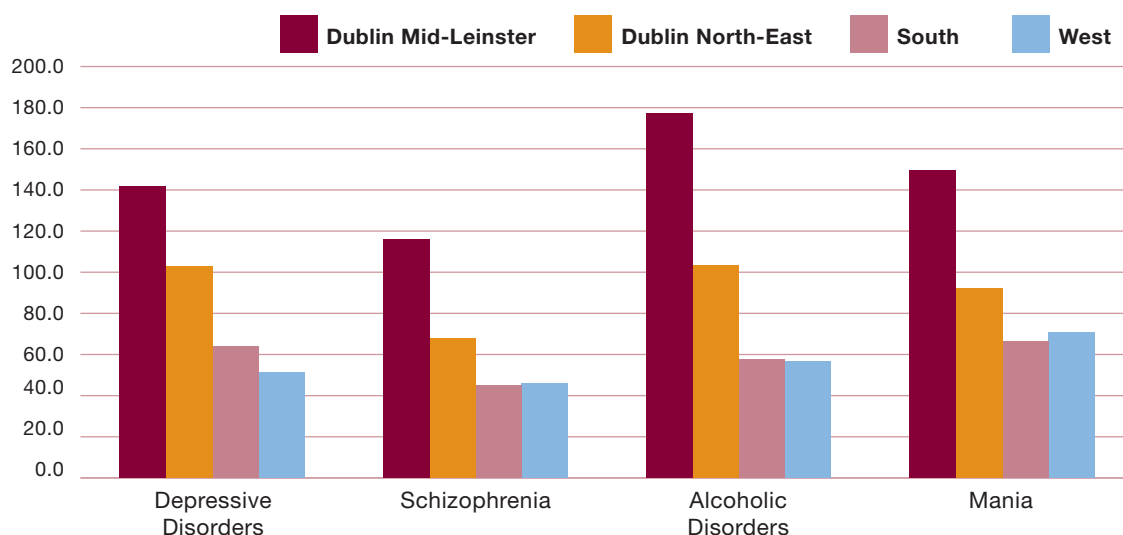
## Socio-economic group

Non-manual occupations accounted for the highest proportion of all admissions for all four HSE areas, ranging from 15% in Dublin Mid-Leinster to 11% in HSE South (Table 2.19). Likewise, non-manual occupations accounted for the highest proportion of first admissions for all areas, with 14% in both Dublin Mid-Leinster and HSE West and 13% in both Dublin North-East and HSE South (Table 2.20). However, as indicated previously, caution should be exercised when interpreting data on socio-economic group as 47% of occupations were returned as unknown or unspecified.

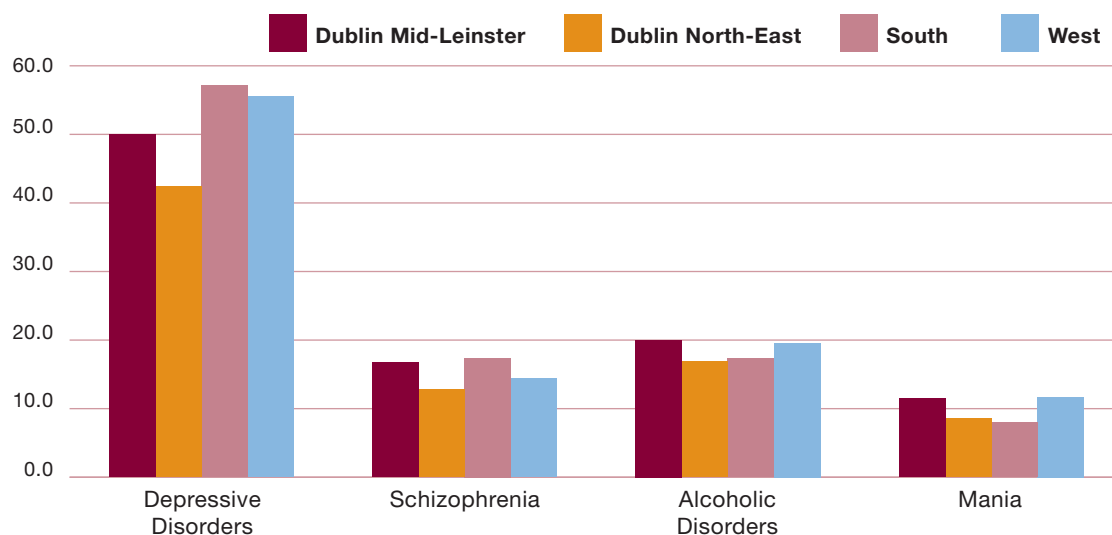
## Diagnosis

Depressive disorders had the highest rate of all and first admissions in all HSE areas, with rates for all admissions ranging from 177.1 per 100,000 in HSE South to 115.7 in Dublin North-East (Table 2.21 and Figure 2.5). Rates for first admissions ranged from 57.1 in HSE South to 42.4 in Dublin North-East (Table 2.22). All admission rates for schizophrenia were second-highest in all areas, with rates ranging from 103.3 in HSE South to 67.6 in Dublin North-East (Table 2.21). Alcoholic disorders had the second-highest rate of first admissions in three of the four areas (Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 20.0, Dublin North-East, at 16.9, and HSE West, at 19.6), while schizophrenia had the second-highest rate in HSE South, at 17.4 (Table 2.22).





**Figure 2.5** Health Service Executive Areas. All admissions by selected diagnoses. Ireland 2008. Rates per 100,000 total population



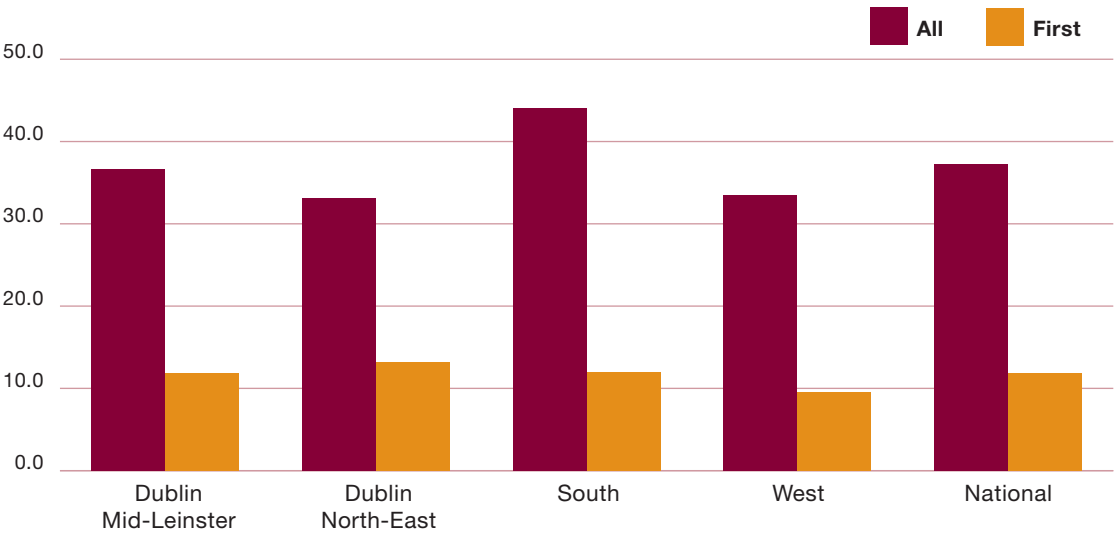
**Figure 2.6** Health Service Executive Areas. First admissions by selected diagnoses. Ireland 2008. Rates per 100,000 total population

## Legal status

HSE South had the highest rate of all non-voluntary admissions, at 44.1 per 100,000, followed by Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 36.6, and HSE West, at 33.5 (Table 2.23 and Figure 2.7). Dublin North-East had the lowest rate of all non-voluntary admissions, at 33.1 per 100,000.

Dublin North-East had the highest rate of non-voluntary first admissions, at 13.2 per 100,000, followed by HSE South, at 12.0, Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 11.8, and HSE West, at 9.6.

The reader is again reminded of the differences in data on legal status contained in this report and that reported by the MHC and also in the different methods of assigning admissions to a HSE area, as noted earlier in Chapter 1, pages 22 and 24.

### Length of stay

Thirty-two per cent of discharges for Dublin North-East, 31% for HSE South, 30% for Dublin Mid-Leinster and 29% for HSE West occurred within one week of admission (Table 2.24). Two-thirds of all discharges for each HSE area occurred within one month of admission, while over 93% occurred within three months of admission.

Discharges for Dublin Mid-Leinster had the longest average length of stay, at 25.8 days (median 14.0 days), followed by HSE South, at 25.1 days (median 13.0 days), Dublin North-East, at 24.6 days (median 13.0 days), and HSE West, at 24.4 days (median 14.0 days) (Table 2.26).

## Counties

Rates of first admissions by county of residence are presented in Table 2.27. Admissions recorded as non-residents were excluded from this analysis.

The highest rate of first admissions was recorded for Westmeath, at 204.2, followed by Longford, at 203.5, Laois, at 192.4, and Kerry, at 186.6 (Table 2.27 and Figure 2.8). Counties with the lowest rates for first admissions include Monaghan (51.8), Cavan (76.6) and Donegal (105.9).

## Diagnosis

Tipperary South had the highest rate of first admissions for depressive disorders, at 141.8 per 100,000, followed by, Tipperary North, at 130.3. Monaghan had the lowest rate of first admissions for depressive disorders, at 19.6.

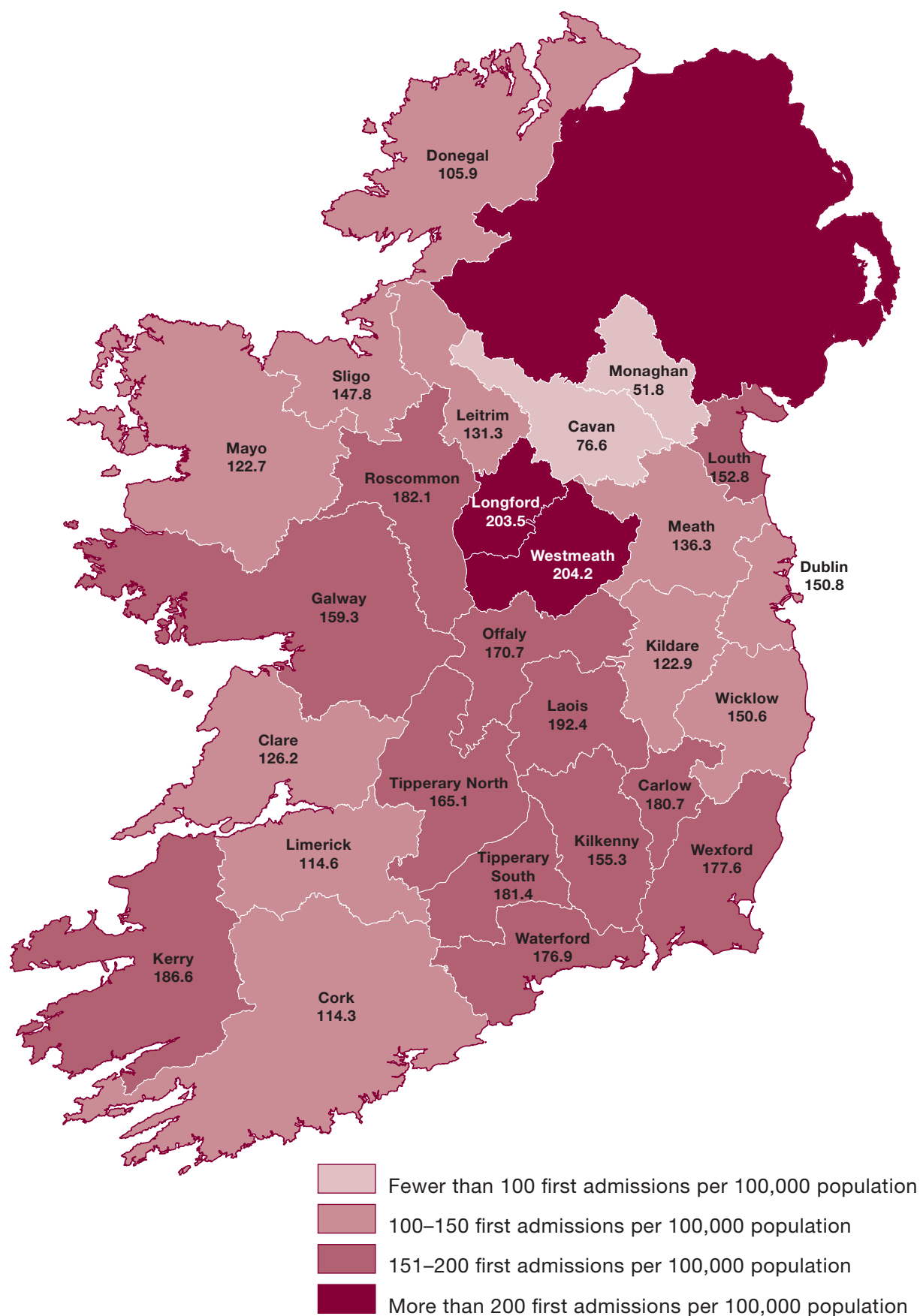
Kerry had the highest rate of first admissions for schizophrenia, at 35.8 per 100,000, followed by Westmeath, at 25.2, Sligo, at 24.6, and Longford, at 23.3. Monaghan had no first admissions for schizophrenia, while Carlow had a rate of 2.0 per 100,000.

Longford had the highest rate of first admissions for alcoholic disorders, at 43.6 per 100,000, followed by Roscommon, at 40.8, Kerry, at 35.0, Wexford, at 30.4, and Westmeath, at 30.2. Carlow had the lowest rate of first admissions for alcoholic disorders, at 4.0 per 100,000.

## Non-residents

The designation of a person as non-resident is determined by the address given by the person at the time of their admission and it is therefore more likely to reflect persons who have recently arrived in the country.

There were 71 admissions of non-residents in 2008. Forty-one per cent had an address originating in Northern Ireland, 32% had an address in England, while 7% had an address in the USA (Table 2.28). Fifty-nine per cent of admissions of non-residents were male. One-quarter of admissions of non-residents had a diagnosis of schizophrenia, 24% had a diagnosis of depressive disorders, 10% had a diagnosis of alcoholic disorders, while a further 10% had a diagnosis of mania (Table 2.29).

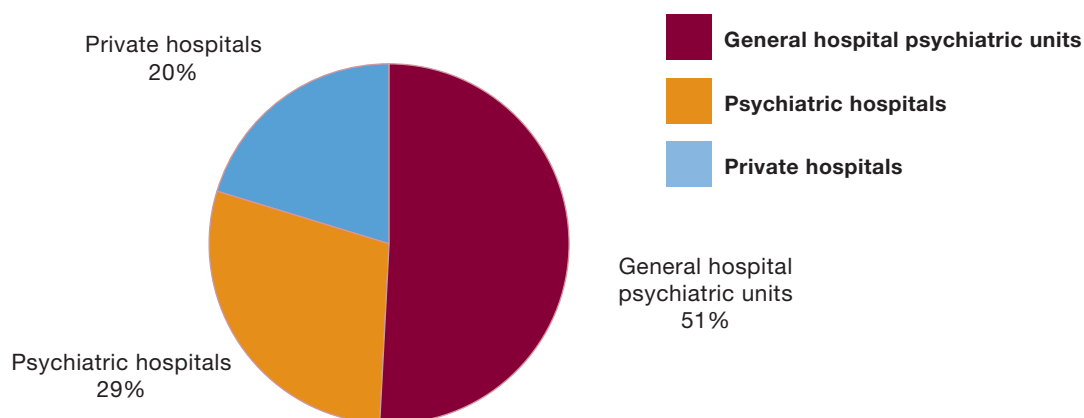

### 3 Hospital Type – Admissions, Discharges and Deaths

Table 1.1 in Chapter 1 outlined the breakdown of hospital type. In 2008 there were six additional centres reporting to the NPIRS. These were included as psychiatric hospitals. It is also worth noting that up to 2007, data for Hampstead and Highfield Hospitals were reported as one hospital but in 2008 they are presented as two separate hospitals as they are separate approved centres under the Mental Health Act 2001. Similarly, up to 2007, data for St Patrick's and St Edmundsbury Hospitals were reported as one hospital but from 2008 they are reported as two separate hospitals as they are separate approved centres under the Mental Health Act 2001. Thus, there are two additional private hospitals presented in this report compared to 2007.

Fifty-one per cent of all admissions and 50% of first admissions were to general hospital psychiatric units. Twenty-nine per cent of all admissions were to public psychiatric hospitals (including the Central Mental Hospital, Dundrum; Carraig Mór, Cork; and St Joseph's Intellectual Disability Service, Portrane) and 20% were to private hospitals (Table 3.1 and Figure 3.1). Twenty-four per cent of first admissions were to private hospitals and 26% were to psychiatric hospitals.

There was no change in the proportion of admissions to psychiatric hospitals from 2007, while there was a 1% increase in admissions to private hospitals and a corresponding 1% decrease in admissions to general hospital psychiatric units.

Re-admissions accounted for 74% of all admissions to psychiatric hospitals, 71% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 64% of admissions to private hospitals (Table 3.1).

## Gender and age

Just over half of all admissions to psychiatric hospitals (54%) and general hospital psychiatric units (50%) were male, while 58% of admissions to private hospitals were female (Table 3.1). Fifty-seven per cent of first admissions to psychiatric hospitals and 55% to general hospital psychiatric units were male, while 54% of first admissions to private hospitals were female.

There was a higher proportion of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units (45%) and to psychiatric hospitals (46%) for persons aged 25–44 years compared with admissions to private hospitals (32%) (Table 3.2). In contrast, private hospitals had a higher proportion of admissions aged 45–64 years, at 41%, compared with either general hospital psychiatric units or psychiatric hospitals, both at 31%. Private hospitals also had a higher proportion of admissions aged 65–74 years (12%) compared with admissions to general hospital psychiatric units (8%) and to psychiatric hospitals (7%). Similar patterns were observed for first admissions.

## Marital status

General hospital psychiatric units had a higher proportion of admissions that were single (59%) than psychiatric hospitals (56%) or private hospitals (40%) (Table 3.3). In contrast, a higher proportion of admissions to private hospitals were married (45%) compared with either general hospital psychiatric units (23%) or psychiatric hospitals (22%). Similar proportions were observed for first admissions.

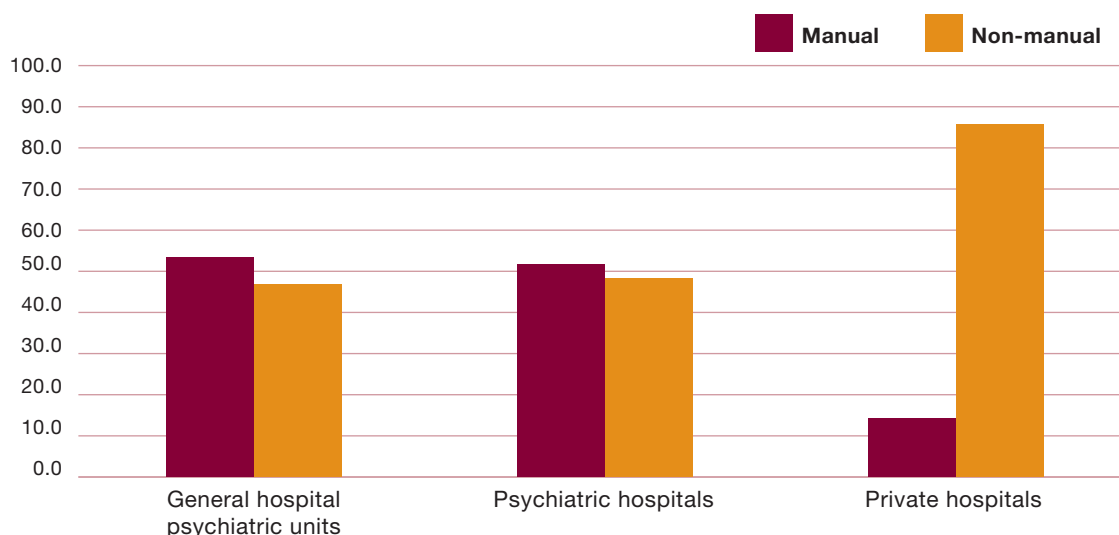
## Socio-economic group

Eleven per cent of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units, 6% of admissions to psychiatric hospitals and 1% of admissions to private hospitals were for unskilled occupations (Table 3.4). Over one-quarter (29%) of all admissions to private hospitals were for higher and lower professionals combined compared with 8% to general hospital psychiatric units and 5% to psychiatric hospitals. Almost one-third (32%) of first admissions to private hospitals were for higher and lower professionals combined compared with 9% to general hospital psychiatric units and 7% to psychiatric hospitals (Table 3.5).

Socio-economic groups were classified into manual and non-manual occupations.<sup>1</sup> A considerably higher proportion of admissions to private hospitals (86%) were for non-

manual occupations compared with either general hospital psychiatric units (47%) or psychiatric hospitals (48%) (Figure 3.2). In contrast, over half of all admissions to general hospital psychiatric units (53%) and psychiatric hospitals (52%) were for manual occupations compared with 14% to private hospitals.

## Diagnosis

Over one-third (36%) of all admissions to private hospitals, 31% to general hospital psychiatric units and 24% to psychiatric hospitals had a diagnosis of depressive disorders (Table 3.6). Depressive disorders accounted for a higher proportion of first admissions to all hospitals, with 41% of first admissions to private hospitals, 36% to general hospital psychiatric units and 29% to psychiatric hospitals having such a diagnosis (Table 3.7).

Schizophrenia accounted for 23% of all admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 22% of all admissions to psychiatric hospitals (Table 3.6). However, just 6% of all admissions to private hospitals had a diagnosis of schizophrenia. Fourteen per cent of first admissions to general hospital psychiatric units, 13% to psychiatric hospitals and 3% to private hospitals had a diagnosis of schizophrenia (Table 3.7).

Almost one-fifth (19%) of all admissions to private hospitals had a diagnosis of alcoholic disorder compared with 10% to general hospital psychiatric units and 11% to psychiatric hospitals (Table 3.6). One-fifth of first admissions to private hospitals, 11% to general hospital psychiatric units and 10% to psychiatric hospitals had a diagnosis of alcoholic disorders (Table 3.7).

## Legal status

Non-voluntary admissions accounted for 11% of all admissions to psychiatric hospitals, 9% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 1% of admissions to private hospitals (Table 3.8). Fourteen per cent of first admissions to psychiatric hospitals, 9% of first admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 1% of first admissions to private hospitals were non-voluntary.

## Length of stay

Over one-third of discharges from general hospital psychiatric units (33%) and psychiatric hospitals (37%) occurred within one week of admission, compared with 13% from private hospitals (Table 3.9). Over half of all discharges from general hospital psychiatric units (54%) and psychiatric hospitals (58%) occurred within two weeks of admission compared with 26% from private hospitals.

Discharges from private hospitals had the longest average length of stay, at 33.2 days (median 27.0 days), but accounted for a smaller proportion of discharges (excluding those with a length of stay of one year or more), at 20% (Table 3.10). Despite private hospitals having a longer average length of stay for discharges, the proportion of re-admissions to private hospitals, as noted earlier, was smaller, at 64%, compared with 74% to psychiatric hospitals and 71% to general hospital psychiatric units (Table 3.1). Discharges from psychiatric hospitals had a marginally shorter length of stay, at 22.5 days (median 9.0 days), than general hospital psychiatric units, at 23.1 days (median 12.0 days) (Table 3.10).

## 4 Individual Units and Hospitals – Admissions, Discharges and Deaths

The data for the catchment area populations presented in this chapter have been supplied courtesy of Health Atlas Ireland, Health Promotion Unit, HSE. The catchment areas presented comprise a number of electoral divisions (EDs), however, the composition of three catchment areas remained unconfirmed with Local Health Offices (LHOs), arising from uncertainty relating to the boundaries of these catchment areas. The numbers involved are small and are not likely to change the rates significantly. A list of units and hospitals by individual catchment areas is presented in Appendix 2. Footnotes pertaining to changes/issues of interest for certain hospitals in 2008 should be noted in Table 4.2 as they have not been repeated for every table in this chapter.

The addition of new approved centres to certain catchment areas will be reflected in possible changes in the pattern of rates over time and this should be borne in mind when comparing rates for catchment areas over a particular time span.

All and first admissions for individual catchment areas and their respective populations are presented in Table 4.1. (All tables referred to in this chapter are presented at the end of the chapter.) All admission rates were highest in Roscommon Mental Health catchment area, at 682.7 per 100,000, followed by Waterford, at 642.7, and Kerry, at 607.1 (Table 4.1). Cavan/Monaghan had the lowest rate of all admissions, at 162.5 per 100,000 population.

Waterford Mental Health Catchment Area had the highest rate of first admissions, at 177.6 per 100,000 population, followed by Kerry, at 170.9, and Laois/Offaly, at 166.8 (Table 4.1). Cluain Mhuire Mental Health Catchment Area 1 (South County Dublin) had the lowest rate of first admissions, at 20.3 per 100,000 population.

The number of admissions to individual units and hospitals for 2007–2008 is presented in Table 4.2, along with the percentage change in admissions from 2007–2008. Generally speaking there were no great changes in admissions for individual units and hospitals and this is reflected in the relatively unchanged national admission figure from 2007–2008.



## Diagnosis

As mentioned in Chapter 1, some hospitals supply diagnosis on discharge rather than on admission, and in these instances admissions have been returned as unspecified mental disorder. They are included in the category Other and Unspecified. This will affect the rates reported for individual catchment areas and comparison of rates across catchment areas should be done so with caution.

All admission rates for depressive disorders were highest for units and hospitals in Tipperary (North and South area combined), at 272.2 per 100,000 population, followed by Waterford, at 208.3, Kerry, at 199.5 and Wexford, at 193.5 (Table 4.3). Mental Health Catchment Area 8 (North County Dublin) had the lowest rate of all admissions for depressive disorders, at 35.6 per 100,000 population.

Mental Health Catchment Area 2 (Dublin South East) had the highest rate of all admissions for schizophrenia, at 154.6 per 100,000 population, followed by Mental Health Catchment area 7 (Dublin North), at 148.5, and Kerry at 142.3 (Table 4.3). Mental Health Catchment Area 8 (Dublin North) had the lowest rate of all admissions for schizophrenia, at 14.0 per 100,000.

Roscommon Mental Health Catchment Area had the highest rate of all admissions for alcoholic disorders, at 178.3 per 100,000 population, followed by East Galway Mental Health Catchment Area, at 117.8, and Kerry, at 110.8 (Table 4.3). Cavan/Monaghan had the lowest rate of all admissions for alcoholic disorders, at 6.7 per 100,000.

First admissions rates for depressive disorders were highest for units and hospitals in Tipperary (North and South combined), at 108.2 per 100,000 population, followed by Kerry, at 67.2, and Laois/Offaly and Wexford, both at 65.3 (Table 4.4). Cluain Mhuire Mental Health Catchment Area 1 (South County Dublin) had the lowest rate of first admissions for depressive disorders, at 7.0 per 100,000 population.

Kerry Mental Health Catchment Area had the highest rate of first admissions for schizophrenia, at 35.0 per 100,000 population, followed by Mental Health Catchment Area 3 (Dublin South), at 34.0, and Sligo/Leitrim, at 25.0 (Table 4.4). Mental Health Catchment Area 8 (North County Dublin) had the lowest rate of first admissions for schizophrenia, at 1.8 per 100,000.

Roscommon Mental Health Catchment Area had the highest rate of first admissions for alcoholic disorders, at 34.0 per 100,000 population, followed by Kerry, at 33.6, and Wexford, at 28.8 (Table 4.4). Cluain Mhuire Mental Health Catchment Area 1 (South County Dublin) had the lowest rate of first admissions for alcoholic disorders, at 0.6 per 100,000.

## Length of stay

Length of stay for discharges varied greatly across units and hospitals, with almost half of discharges for 2008 occurring within one week of admission for a number of hospitals, for example: Newcastle Hospital, Greystones, 48% were discharged within one week; St Brigid's Hospital, Ardee, 46%; Tallaght Hospital, Dublin, 45%; St Senan's Hospital, Enniscorthy, 42%; St Loman's Hospital, Mullingar, 41%; St Vincent's Hospital, Fairview, 41%; and Our Lady's Hospital, Navan, 41% (Table 4.20 and Table 4.21).

## 5 Child and Adolescent Admissions

This chapter presents data on admissions and discharges for persons under 18 years of age, regardless of the in-patient facility to which they were admitted. Some admissions have thus been reported on in previous chapters. However, admissions to dedicated child and adolescent units, as reported in this chapter, have not been presented in earlier chapters.

Differences in data presented for under 18s in this chapter and that reported by the MHC should be noted again for reasons outlined in Chapter 1.

### All and first admissions

There were 406 admissions for children and adolescents under 18 years in 2008 (Table 5.1). This was an increase on admissions from 2007 (364). Seventy-two per cent of admissions were first admissions (Table 5.1), an increase on the number and proportion of first admissions from 2007 (249; 68%).

There were 143 admissions to dedicated child and adolescent units (St Anne's Children's Centre, Galway; Warrenstown House, Dublin; and Ginesa Unit, St John of God Hospital, Dublin) (Table 5.2). Eighty-five per cent of these were first admissions.

### Gender and age

Females accounted for over half of all (58%) and first (57%) admissions for under 18s (Table 5.1). Forty-three per cent of all admissions were aged 17 years on admission, 28% were aged 16 years, 14% were aged 15 years, 9% were aged 14 years, 3% were aged 13 years and 5% were aged 6–12 years.

Over one-third (36%) of first admissions were aged 17 years at admission, 27% were 16 years, 16% were 15 years, 11% were 14 years, 4% were 13 years and 6% were aged 6–12 years (Table 5.1).

Females accounted for 62% of all and 58% of first admissions to dedicated child and adolescent units (Table 5.2). Over one-quarter (27%) of all and first (27%) admissions to dedicated child and adolescent units were aged 15 years. Twenty-two per cent of all admissions were aged 16 years, 20% were aged 14 years, 13% were aged 17 years, 11% were aged 6–12 years and 8% were aged 13 years (Table 5.2).

## Diagnosis

Depressive disorders accounted for 26% of all and 29% of first admissions for persons under 18 years of age (Table 5.3). Eighteen per cent of all admissions had a diagnosis of eating disorders, 15% had a diagnosis of neuroses and 9% had a diagnosis of schizophrenia. Thirteen per cent of first admissions had a diagnosis of eating disorders and 13% had a diagnosis of neuroses, while 10% had a diagnosis of schizophrenia.

Females accounted for 61% of all admissions with depressive disorders, 58% of all admissions with neuroses and 89% of all admissions with eating disorders (Table 5.3). In contrast, males accounted for 59% of all admissions with schizophrenia. Similar proportions were observed for first admissions; females accounted for 64% with depressive disorders, 61% with neuroses and 84% with eating disorders (Table 5.3). Males accounted for 60% with schizophrenia.

## Legal status

Three per cent of all and 3% of first admissions were non-voluntary (Table 5.4); this is a slight increase from 2007 (1% of all and less than 1% of first admissions). There was a total of twelve non-voluntary admissions for under 18s in 2008, with four admissions for schizophrenia, three for depressive disorders, two each for neuroses and other and unspecified and one for other drug disorders (Table 5.5)

## Hospital type

Almost two-thirds (65%) of admissions for under 18s in 2008 were to adult psychiatric hospitals: 38% were to general hospital psychiatric units, 17% were to psychiatric hospitals and 10% were to private hospitals (Table 5.6). Thirty-five per cent were to dedicated child and adolescent units. Forty-one per cent of first admissions were to dedicated child and adolescent units, 37% were to general hospital psychiatric units, 16% were to psychiatric hospitals and 6% were to private hospitals.

## Length of stay

Ninety-three per cent of all under 18s admitted in 2008 were discharged in 2008. Of these, 37% were discharged within one week of admission, 22% were discharged within two to four weeks, and 21% were discharged within one to three months (Table 5.7).

The average length of stay for those admitted and discharged in 2008 was 24.5 days (median 13.0 days) (Table 5.8). Average length of stay was longest in dedicated child and adolescent units, at 49.7 days (median 41.0 days), followed by private hospitals, at 16.5 days (median 18.0 days), psychiatric hospitals, at 14.0 days (median 6.0 days), and general hospital psychiatric units, at 10.2 days (median 4.0 days).
