Notes: During the review and update period prior to the 2014 extract of data from the NIDD, 869 people were removed from the database and there were 1,065 new registrations, the largest proportion of these in the 0–9-year age group. The age and gender distribution by degree of intellectual disability of those registered on the database is summarised in Table 2.1, which shows the corresponding prevalence rates per thousand of the population.

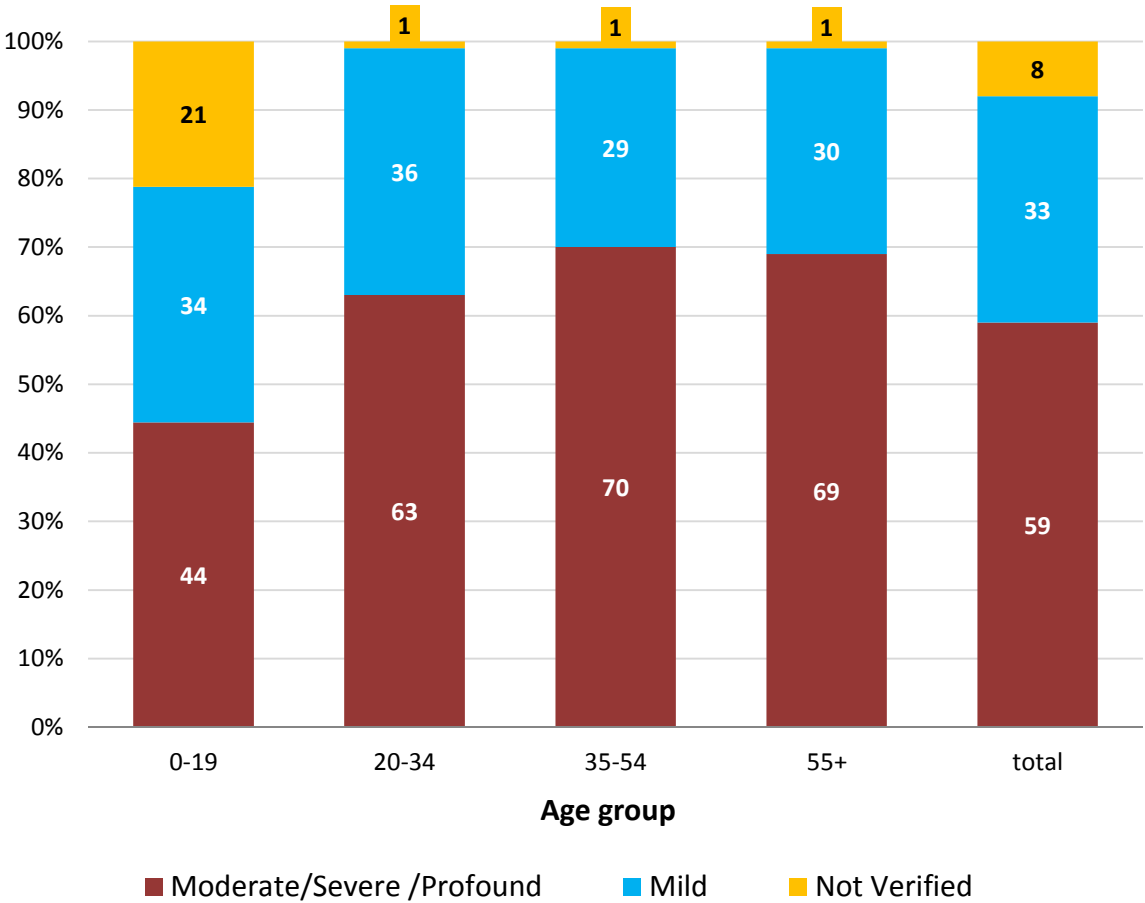

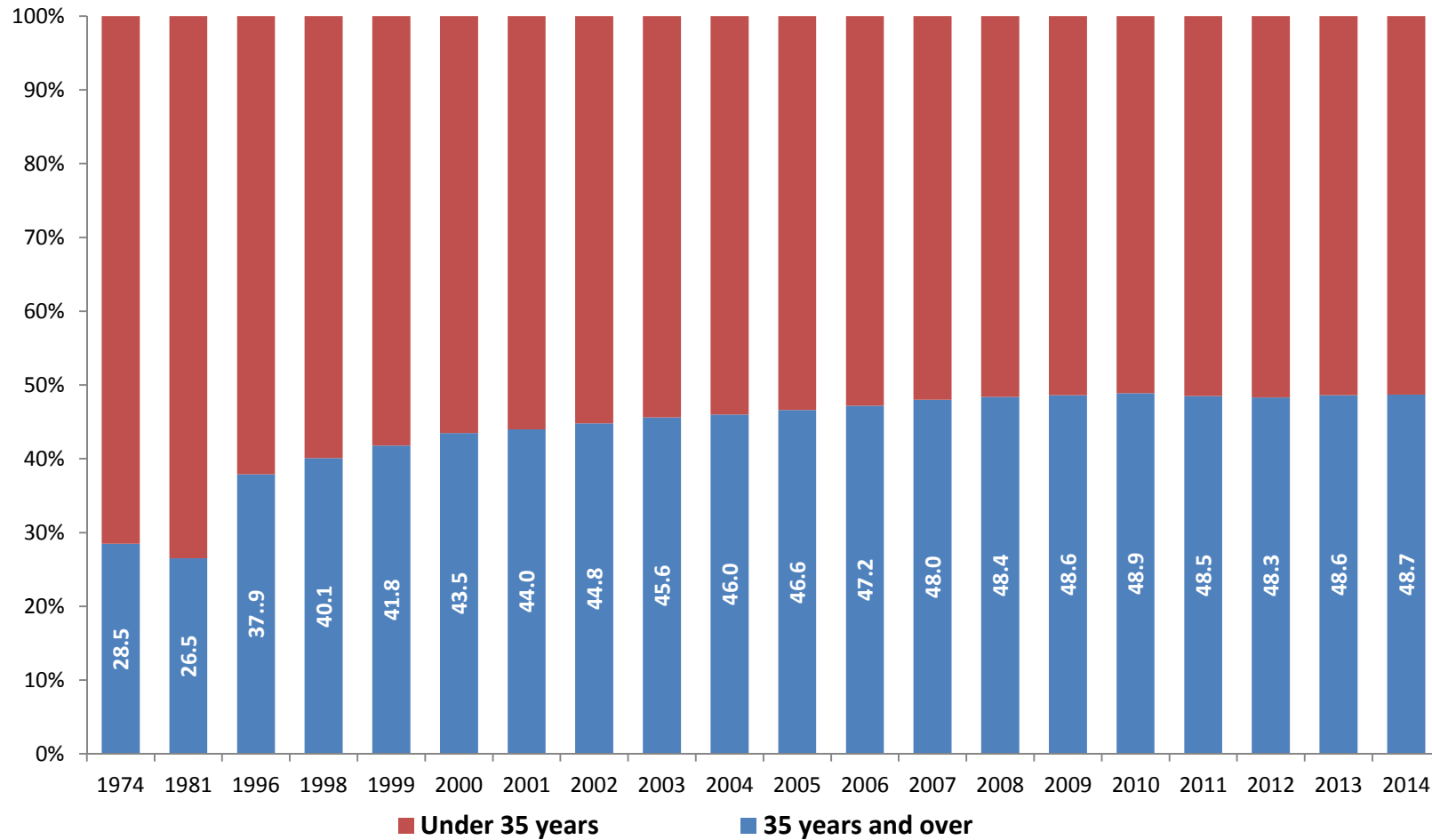

In the majority of these clients aged 0-7 years and were not registered on the NIDD yet due to resource issues within the Early Intervention or the HSE Disability Database Teams.

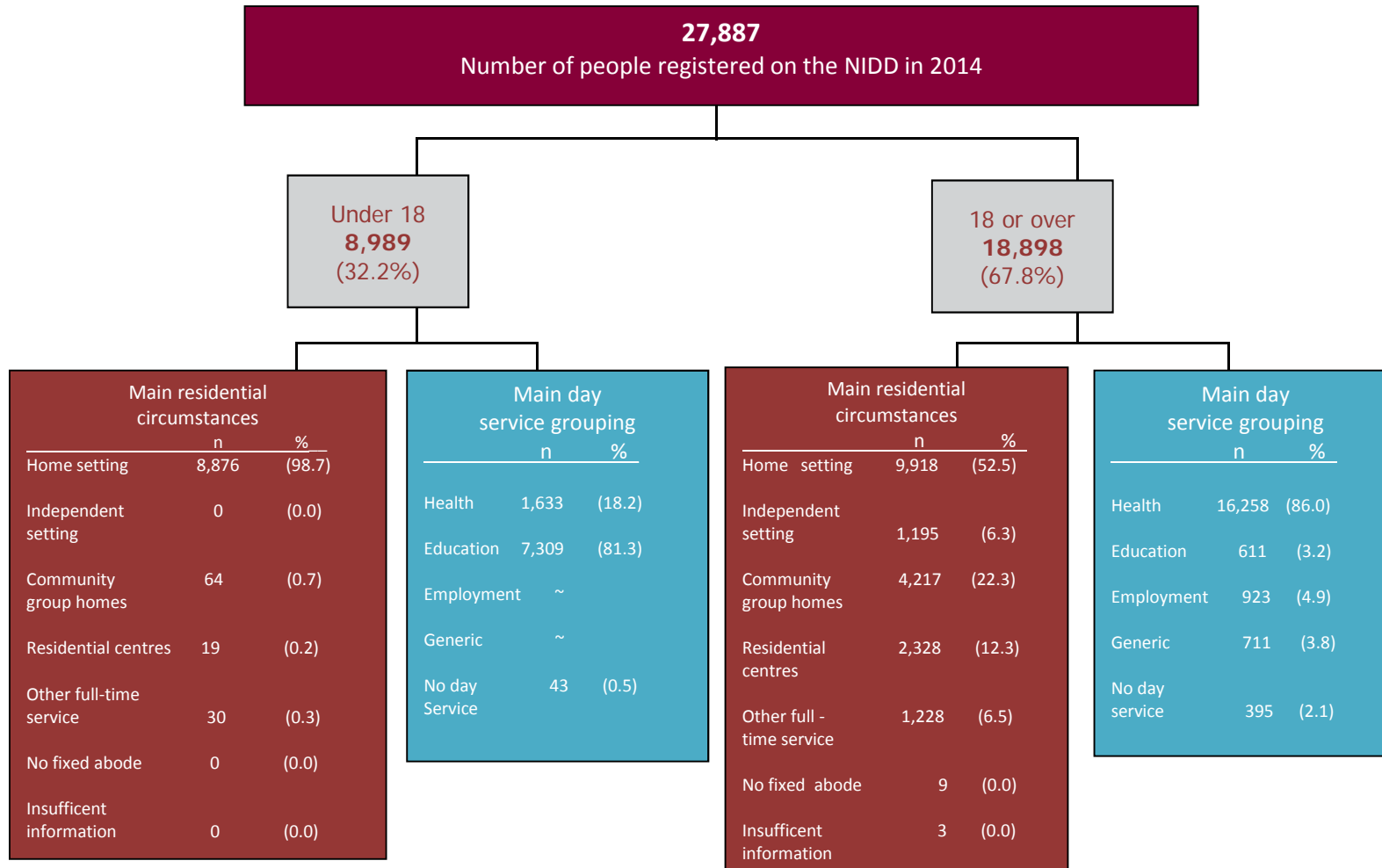

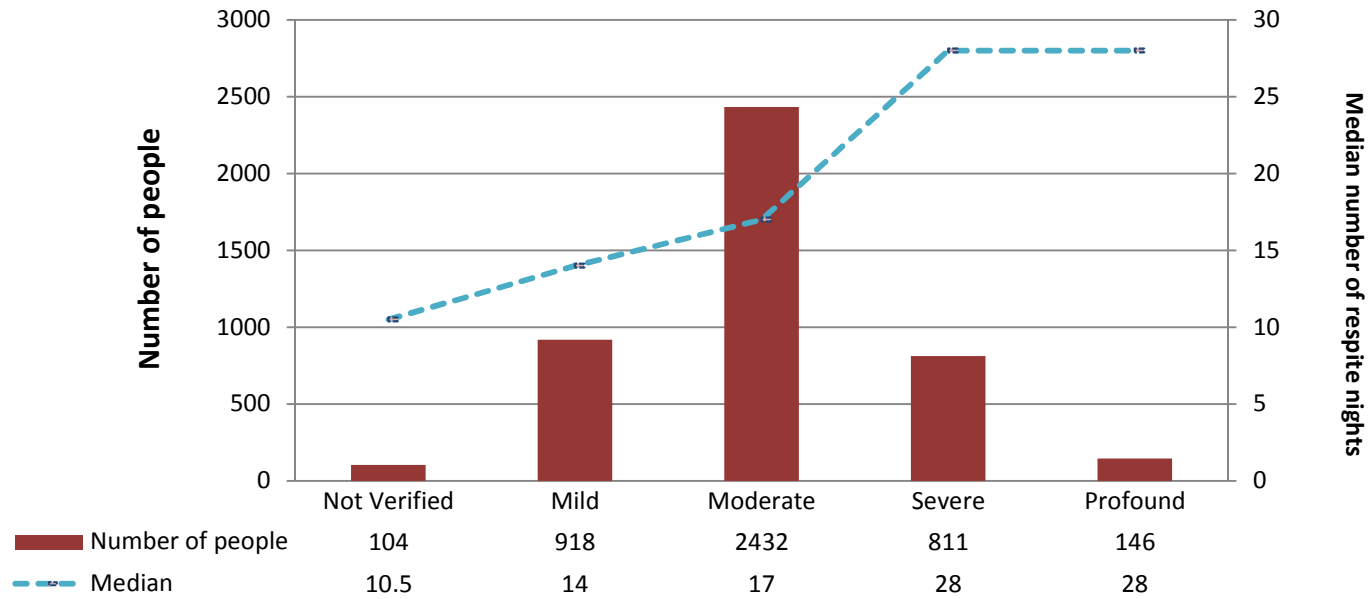

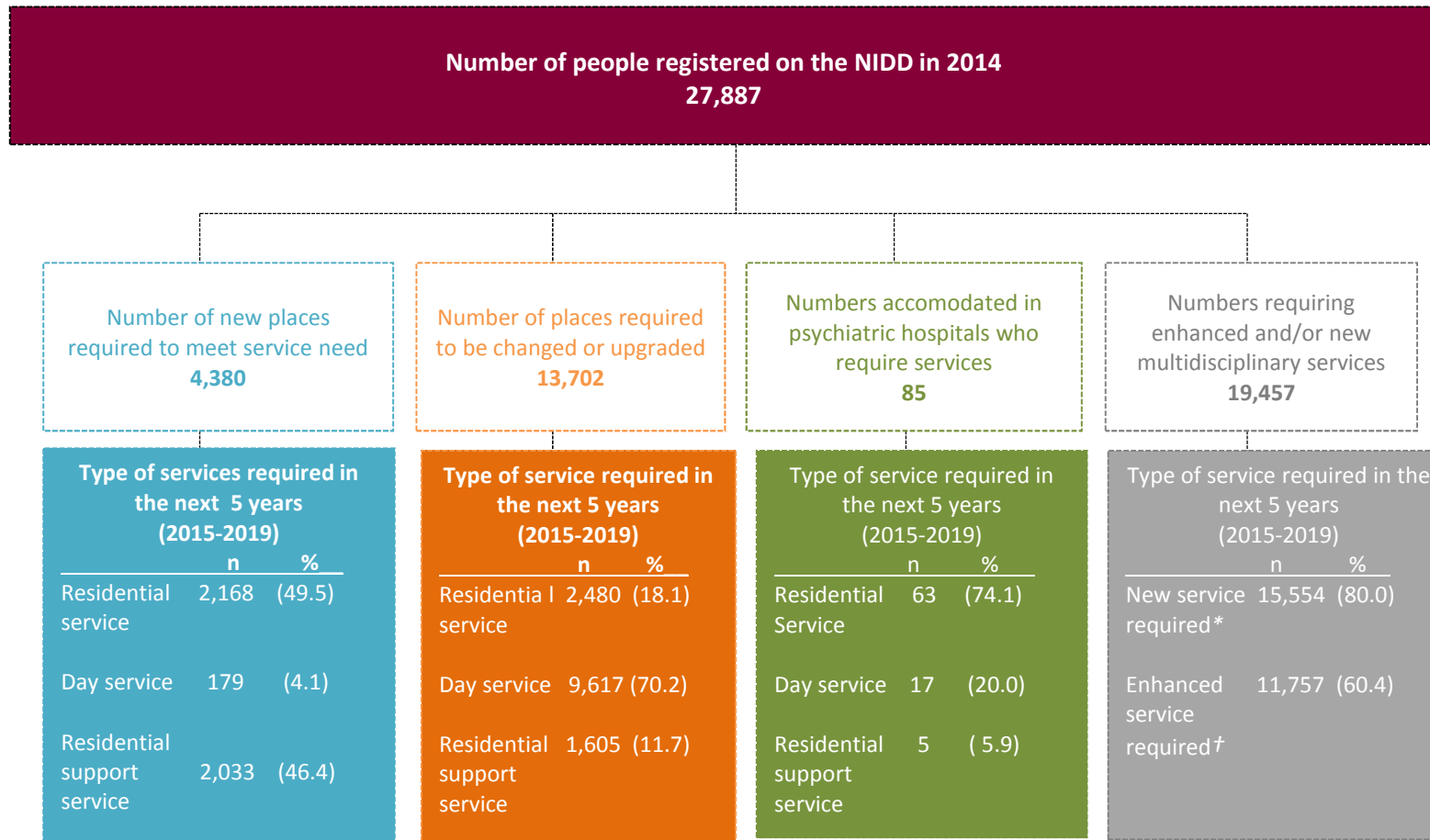

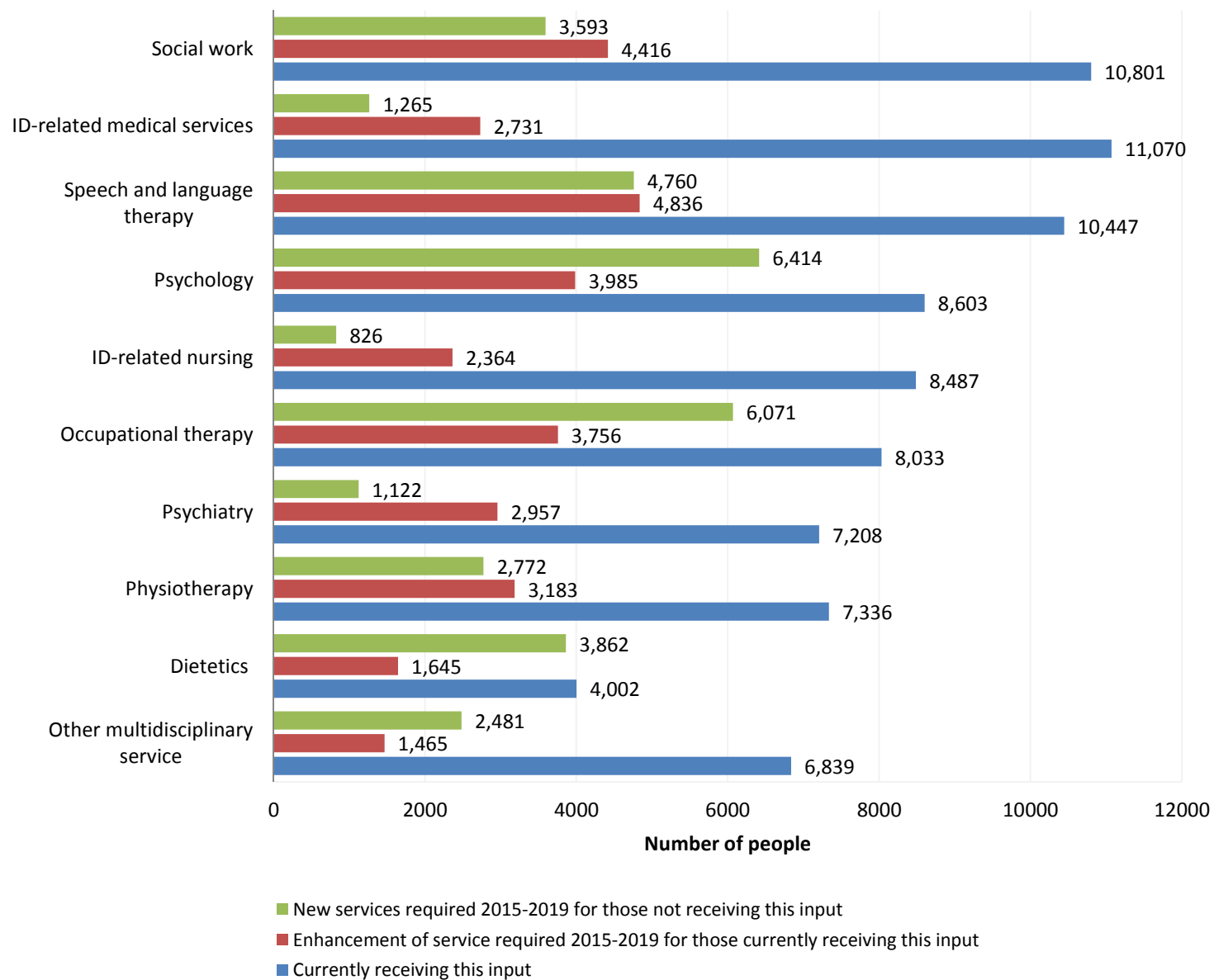
