

Activities of Irish Psychiatric Services 2000

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An Bord Taighde Sláinte

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Summary

In 2000 there were 24,282 admissions to Irish psychiatric hospitals and units, a rate of 901.0 per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over. There were 7,290 first admissions, representing a rate of 270.5 per 100,000 population. The re-admission rate was 630.5, representing 70% of all admissions. Males accounted for over half (53%) of all admissions. Similarly, over half of all admissions (54%) were for single persons. The 45-54 year age group had the highest rate of admission at 1,129.2 per 100,000, while the 16-19 year age group had the lowest at 295.7. Among occupational groups, the unskilled had the highest rate of admission at 1,182.6 per 100,000 while own account workers had the lowest at 60.7. Three main diagnoses accounted for over two thirds of all admissions with depressive disorders accounting for 31% and schizophrenia and alcoholic disorders each accounting for 19%. Eleven per cent of all admissions were non-voluntary.

The Midland Health Board had the highest rate of admission at 1,173.3 per 100,000 population, while the North Eastern Health Board had the lowest at 564.8. Forty seven per cent of admissions were to health board hospitals, 40% were to general hospital psychiatric units and 14% were to private hospitals.

There were 61 admissions to three children's centres in 2000. Males accounted for 62% of these admissions while almost half of admissions (49%) were in the 15-19 years age group. Forty three per cent of admissions had a diagnosis of neurosis. Depressive disorders and conduct disorders each accounted for 15% of admissions and schizophrenia accounted for 8%.

There were 24,082 discharges and 312 deaths in 2000. Half of all discharges, including deaths, occurred within two weeks of admission, while only 2% took place after one year or more. Ninety three per cent of discharges occurred after three months of admission. Almost half of those (46%) admitted with alcoholic disorders, one quarter of those with depressive disorders and one fifth of those with schizophrenia were discharged within one week. The average length of stay for patients on discharge (excluding those in hospital for over one year) was 25.8 days, with admissions for schizophrenia having the longest average length of stay at 33.9 days, while patients with alcoholic disorders had the shortest average length of stay at 14.2 days.

There were 4,230 patients resident in Irish psychiatric hospitals and units on 31st December 2000. This represented a residency rate of 157.0 per 100,000 population. Over half (57%) of in-patients were male and 84% were voluntary. There was a slight increase in the proportion of non-voluntary in-patients from 13% in 1999 to 16% in 2000. Thirty six per cent of in-patients had a diagnosis of schizophrenia, 16% had depressive disorders, while 10% had a diagnosis of mental handicap. Over one third (35%) of in-patients were in the 45-64 year age group. Of all age groups, the 75 years and over age group had the highest rate of hospitalisation at 450.9 per 100,000 population. Forty one per cent of in-patients were in hospital for more than 5 years representing a long stay hospitalisation rate of 64.4 per 100,000. Almost one third (32%) of in-patients had been in hospital for less than three months, 17% for 1-5 years and 10% had been hospitalised for 3-12 months. In-patient rates were highest in the South Eastern Health Board (267.5 per 100,000 population) and lowest in the South Western Area Health Board (39.2). The South Eastern Health Board also had the highest rate of beds

at 287.3 per 100,000. Seventy nine per cent of in-patients were resident in health board hospitals on census night, 12% were in general hospital psychiatric units and 9% were in private hospitals.

There were 230,723 (a rate of 8,561.4 per 100,000) attendances at 234 outpatient clinics throughout Ireland in 2000. Return attendances comprised 199,615 of these attendances, a rate of 7,407,1 per 100,000 population. There were 1,192 places in 74 day hospitals in 2000, yielding a rate of 44.2 places per 100,000 population. There was an increase in the rate of attendances from 6,054,4 in 1999 to 7,104,4 in 2000. The rate of attendances ranged from 15,715.0 in the Mid Western Health Board to 2,169.9 in the North Eastern Health Board. The rate of persons attending also increased from 430.2 in 1999 to 650.0 in 2000. One hundred and five day centres provided a total of 2,427 places, a rate of 90.1 per 100,000. There were 354,772 attendances at day centres, a decrease on the 1999 figure of 402, 175. While the rate of attendances fell from 14,923.4 in 1999 to 13,164.4 in 2000, the rate of persons attending remained almost unchanged from 193.3 in 1999 to 194.1 in 2000.

There were 392 community residences in 2000, providing 2,934 places, a rate of 108.9 per 100,000. There were more places available in high support residences (1,194 places) compared to either low (1,044 places) or medium support (696 places) residences. There was a total of 1,314 admissions to, and 1,192 discharges from, community residences in 2000. High support residences accounted for over half of these total admissions and discharges. The rate of admissions to community residences rose from 28.1 in 1999 to 48.8 in 2000. The North Western Health Board had the highest rate of admission to community residences at 205.0, while the Southern Health Board had the lowest at 7.1 per 100,000 population.

Highlights

- At the end of the year 2000 there were slightly more than 4,000 patients in Irish psychiatric hospitals, compared with somewhat over 20,000 forty years ago, in 1960. This is one of the most remarkable features of health care delivery of the past half-century. It is mainly due to the mortality of long-stay patients and their non-replacement by new long-stay patients and, through the provision of community alternatives to long-term hospitalisation.
- Though the proportion of mentally handicapped persons in psychiatric hospitals has decreased in recent years, this still accounts for 10% of persons resident in hospital at the end of the year 2000.
- Admission numbers for 2000, at just over 24,000, were quite similar to those of the last ten years, indicating that admissions to in-patient care have reached a plateau, thus bringing to an end the continuous increase over the years from 1951, when there were 6,558 admissions (Department of Health, undated).
- Re-admissions continue to predominate over first admissions, comprising 70% of all admissions.
- Non-voluntary admissions remain at 11%, a proportion that may decline with the bringing into operation of the Mental Health Act 2001.
- The proportion of all admissions that were to psychiatric units of general hospitals continued to increase and stood at 40% in 2000. This figure will continue to increase as new general hospital units replace traditional mental hospitals.
- Day hospitals increased in number from 64 in 1999 to 74 in 2000. There was considerable variation between health boards in the extent of provision.
- The number of community residential facilities in 2000 remained unchanged over the preceding year and, here again, there were considerable variations between health boards in the extent of their provision.
- Out-patient clinics maintained their characteristic role, providing continuing care rather than consultation and referral back for management to referring agents, such as general practice, so that only 5% of attendances were of new patients.
- The great majority of hospital admissions were short-term, with 93% of discharged patients having spent less than three months in hospital and 50% less than two weeks.

Introduction

We are pleased to present the report Activities of Irish Psychiatric Services for the year 2000. The report presents data on admissions to and discharges from psychiatric in-patient facilities, a census of the inpatient population at the end of the year and the activities of community psychiatric services. Rates reported one per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over. Admissions for under 16s are not rated in the age-specific tables. However, in tables where age is not specified, admissions for under 16s are included in the rates per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over.

Data on in-patient psychiatric facilities are obtained from the National Psychiatric In-patient Reporting System (NPIRS), a computerised database set up in 1963 on foot of the findings of the Commission of the Enquiry on Mental Illness (Department of Health, 1966) and maintained by the Health Research Board. Annual reports on the activities of Irish psychiatric services have been published since 1965 and a full list of publications from the Mental Health Research Division is available in Appendix 3. The NPIRS database is also used to carry out decennial censuses which have taken place from 1971 to 2001. The 2001 census report is due to be published shortly. In addition, the database is an invaluable source of information for research and it has been used accordingly over a number of years.

Data on the annual census of the in-patient population and on the activities of community psychiatric facilities are obtained from the Department of Health and Children's end-of-year returns submitted by each psychiatric hospital and unit in the country. This information is supplied courtesy of the Department of Health and Children. Comparative figures for 1999 throughout the report are based on the Activities of Irish Psychiatric Services 1999 report (Daly & Walsh, 2000).

The information on in-patient admissions for this report is collected and returned by psychiatric hospitals and units throughout the country. Specific details of the data collection procedure and the form used to collect data are presented in Appendix 1. Some hospitals have experienced difficulty in recent years in collecting the required information, thus the publication of annual reports has been delayed. This year four hospitals experienced difficulty in submitting the required returns on time. This resulted in the total exclusion of one hospital and the part exclusion of data for three hospitals. It is estimated on the basis of returns in previous years that approximately 440 admissions have thus been excluded. This should be borne in mind when interpreting the findings throughout the report.

In addition to not submitting returns on time, the completeness of data collected and returned over the years has deteriorated considerably. Two main sources of information appear to pose difficulty for many hospitals, namely diagnosis and socio-economic group. Some hospitals do not diagnose until discharge with the result that diagnosis is not available for any admission not discharged within the same year as admitted. Almost all hospital clerical personnel report considerable difficulty in obtaining diagnoses in accordance with ICD 10 (WHO, 1992) from medical personnel. This problem of obtaining a diagnosis for all patients admitted and discharged within the same year posed a particular difficulty for three of the above four hospitals.

This year 49% of occupations were unknown thus making assignment to a socio-economic group impossible in these instances. Ten years ago, in 1990, only 16% of the category socio-economic group was unknown and in 1980, a mere 3% was unknown. This represents a serious level of deterioration in quality of some of the information collected at hospital level.

These issues are currently being dealt with by personnel within the Mental Health Research Division. A special committee, the NPIRS Futures Committee, has been established within the Health Research Board to examine these issues and to make recommendations about improving the data returned. This will include requesting hospitals to return data on a six-monthly basis and advocating the putting in place of adequate resources at health board level which can ensure the timely return of NPIRS data. The Health Research Board is committed to working with hospitals towards maintaining and improving an important health information database established almost thirty years ago and which allows trends and developments in mental health service provision to be monitored.


Part 1

National Psychiatric In-Patient Reporting System (NPIRS)

1. Admissions

There were 24,282 admissions to Irish psychiatric hospitalised and units in 2000, a rate of 901.0 per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over. This is a decrease on the 1999 rate of 930.0 per 100,000. There were 7,290 first admissions, a rate of 270.5 per 100,000. This is an increase on the 1999 figure of 7,105. Re-admissions accounted for 70% of all admissions (Table 1.9), representing a re-admission rate of 630.5 per 100,000 population. The proportion of re-admissions has increased from 1965 to 2000 thus pointing very much to a 'revolving' door phenomenon in in-patient services.

Figure 1.1 and Table 1.1 present all and first admission numbers and rates. All admission numbers peaked in 1986 at 29,392 and have been steadily decreasing since then. However, all admission rates have increased over the 36 year period from 535.0 in 1965 to 901.0 per 100,000 in 2000. First admissions were highest in 1973 at 9,018 with rates increasing over the 36 year period from 215.0 in 1965 to 270.5 in 2000. Re-admissions have accounted for over 70% of all admissions since the early 1980s (Table 1.9).



Gender and Age

Males accounted for over half of all (53%) and first (56%) admissions in 2000 (Table 1.2). Similarly, males had a higher all (980.3) and first (309.2) admission rate compared to females who had an all admission rate of 824.7 and a first admission rate of 233.3.

There was considerable variation in all admission rates by age group. The 45-54 year age group had the highest rate of all admissions with a rate of 1,129.2 per 100,000. In contrast, the 16-19 year age group had the lowest rate at 295.7. The 35-44 and the 55-64 age groups both had admission rates in excess of 1,000 per 100,000 (1,099.1 and 1,067.3 respectively). There were 50 admissions for persons aged under 16 years. Variation in first admission rates was not so marked with rates ranging from 325.0 for the 25-34 year group to 168.0 for the 16-19 year age group. There were 39 first admissions for persons under 16 years of age.



Marital Status

Single persons accounted for over half (54%) of both all and first admissions (Table 1.3). Married persons comprised 29% of all admissions, 6% were widowed and 0.4% were divorced. Proportions for first admissions were quite similar with married persons accounting for 30%, while widowed persons accounted for 5% and divorced persons 0.4%.

The all admission rate for single males (1,444.9) was over three times that of married males (435.3). Married females had a higher rate of admission (594.4) compared to married males (435.3), but widowed (850.4) and divorced (984.5) males had higher rates than either widowed (731.5) or divorced (778.0) females.



Socio-economic group


The unskilled group had the highest rate of both all (1,182.6) and first (286.7) admissions. This is consistent with a pattern which has been observed over many years. However, it is worth noting that 49% of occupations were classified as 'unknown' in 2000 and therefore this should be interpreted with caution.

This year own account workers, i.e. self-employed persons without paid employees, had the lowest rate of all (60.7) and first (23.8) admissions. The low rate for this group may be due in part to the change in classification of occupations in accordance with the revised system introduced by the Central Statistics Office (CSO) in 1996. This system was revised to reflect the changing labour market conditions in Ireland and to take into account occupations which were not previously classified (Central Statistics Office, 1998). It was also necessary to bring the Irish system in line with international classifications of occupation. The low rate for own account workers is in contrast to previous years whereby traditionally the employers and managers group have had the lowest rate of admission. However, if we take both own account workers and employers and managers together as a group of employers they still emerge as having the lowest rate of admissions overall. Males had a higher rate of admission across all groups with the exception of higher professionals.

Diagnosis

Three main diagnostic categories accounted for just over two thirds of all admissions with depressive disorders accounting for 31% and schizophrenia and alcoholic disorders each accounting for 19% (Table 1.5). Depressive disorders had the highest rate of admission at 279.4, a marginal increase on the 1999 rate of 271.5 per 100,000, followed by schizophrenia at 174.7 and alcoholic disorders at 167.6.

The male rate of admission for alcoholic disorders (248.1) was almost three times that of the female rate (90.1) (Figure 1.3). Males also had a higher rate of admission for schizophrenia (219.2 compared to 131.9 for females). In contrast, females had a higher rate of admission for depressive disorders with a rate of 319.1 compared to 238.1 for males. Similar patterns were observed for first admissions.



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Admission rates for depressive disorders were highest across all age groups compared to all other diagnoses (Table 1.6). There was an increase in the rate of depressive disorders up to the 55-64 year age group, where it peaked at 387.3 per 100,000. Likewise, admission rates for schizophrenia and alcoholic disorders increased with age up to the 45-54 year age group, decreasing thereafter.

Depressive disorders had the highest rate of admission among all socio-economic groups with the exception of the manual skilled group, in which alcoholic disorders were highest (Table 1.7).

Legal Status

Eleven per cent of all admissions were non-voluntary, a figure unchanged from 1999 (Table 1.8). Thirteen per cent of first admissions were non-voluntary. Males had a higher proportion and rate of non-voluntary admissions (both all and first) compared to females.

Thirty four per cent of those admitted with schizophrenia were non-voluntary, 15% of those with depressive disorders and 10% of those with alcoholic disorders were non-voluntary. Figure 1.4 presents non-voluntary admissions for selected diagnostic groups. Patients with schizophrenia had the highest rate of non-voluntary admission with a rate of 32.8, followed by mania at 18.7, depressive disorders at 14.0 and alcoholic disorders at 10.0. A similar pattern was observed among first admissions.





2. Discharges and Deaths

There were 24,082 discharges from in-patient care in 2000 and 312 deaths. Of these deaths, 179 were male and 133 were female. The number of deaths in hospital has decreased from 1,235 in 1965 to 312 in 2000 (Figure 2.1).



Length of stay

Fifty per cent of all discharges (including deaths) occurred within two weeks of admission. In contrast, 2% of discharges took place after one year or more in hospital (Table 2.1). Ninety three per cent of discharges occurred within three months of admission. This points to an increasing trend towards shorter lengths of stay.

Almost one third (30%) of voluntary patients were discharged within one week compared to 17% of non-voluntary patients (Table 2.2). Over half (52%) of voluntary patients were discharged within two weeks of admission while one third of non-voluntary patients were discharged after the same length of time. A further one third of non-voluntary patients were discharged within three months of admission.

Figure 2.2 presents the percentage discharged within one week and within three months for the three main diagnoses. Almost half (46%) of those admitted for alcoholic disorders were discharged within one week, while one quarter of those admitted with depressive disorders and one fifth of those admitted with schizophrenia were discharged within one week. As can be seen, almost all admissions for alcoholic disorders (98%) and depressive disorders (95%) were discharged within three months.

In-patient days

Table 2.3 presents an analysis of in-patient days by length of stay. Patients with a length of stay of one year or more were excluded from this analysis as they distort the number of bed days considerably. Although they are few in number they add significantly to the number of bed days. Stays of one to three months accounted for almost one quarter (24%) of all discharges but yet accounted for 44% of in-patient days in psychiatric hospitals and units during the year. In contrast, stays of less than one week accounted for 29% of discharges but only accounted for 4% of in-patient days. The average length of stay for patients was 25.8 days.

Analysis of in-patient days by diagnostic categories is presented in Table 2.4. Patients with schizophrenia had the longest average length of stay at 33.9 days. The average length of stay for those with mania and organic psychoses was equally high at 33.1 and 32.9 days respectively. Patients admitted with alcoholic disorders had the shortest average length of stay at 14.2 days

3. Health Board Areas

This chapter presents information on health board areas of admissions. Health board area is determined by where a patient is resident at the time of admission and not by where they are treated.

The Midland Health Board had the highest rate of all admissions in 2000 at 1,117.3 per 100,000 population (Table 3.1). This was an increase on the 1999 rate of 1,080.4 which was also highest for that year. Both the South Eastern and the Western Health Boards had rates in excess of 1,000 per 100,000 population with rates of 1,078.2 and 1,006.2 respectively. The North Eastern Health Board had the lowest rate as in 1999, a rate of 564.8 per 100,000. Rates of all admissions increased from 1999 in four health boards; the Midland, the Mid Western, the Southern Eastern and the Southern Health Boards.

The Southern Health Board had the highest rate of first admissions with a rate of 309.7 per 100,000 population while the North Eastern Health Board had the lowest at 207.3. There was an increase in rates in all health board areas from 1999 to 2000 with the exception of the Eastern Regional Health Authority (ERHA) which decreased from 279.2 in 1999 to 263.6 in 2000.

Gender


Males had a consistently higher all and first admission rate across all health boards (Table 3.1). The highest rate of admission for males was seen in the Midland Health Board at 1,260.8 per 100,000. This is higher than the national rate of 980.3. All other health boards with the exception of the South Western Area Health Board and the Southern Health Board had rates higher than the national rate for males. The Southern Health Board had the highest first admission rate for males at 345.1 per 100,000.

Age

Most health boards had all admission rates in excess of 1,000 per 100,000 population for the age range 25 to 64 years with the exception of the North Eastern Health Board which had consistently low rates of admission for groups within this age range (under 700.0 per 100,000 population) (Part 4: Supplementary Tables: C1). The over 75 year age group had a high rate of admission in the Northern Area Health Board at 1,696,5 per 100,000, more than twice the national rate of 681.3. Admission rates for the 45 years and over age group were higher than those of the under 45s in all health boards with the exception of the North Western Health Board (Figure 3.1).

Marital status

Single persons had the highest rate of admission in all but four health boards with rates ranging from 1,558.1 in the Midland Health Board to 739.9 per 100,000 population in the North Eastern Health Board (Part 4: Supplementary Tables: C1). Divorced persons had the highest rate of admission in the North Eastern (1,535.5), Southern (1,384.7) and the East Coast Area Health Boards (1,487.0). Widowed persons had the highest rate in the Northern Area Health Board at 1,259.9 per 100,000. Similar patterns were observed among first admissions.



Socio-economic group

In keeping with the high national rate of admission for the unskilled group, this group had the highest rate of all and first admissions in all health boards without exception (Part 4: Supplementary Tables C4 and C5). The Mid Western Health Board had the highest rate of admission for the unskilled group at 1,819.3 per 100,000. Own account workers had the lowest rate of all and first admissions in all health boards, again in keeping with the national rates. Of particular interest is the low all and first admission rate for agricultural workers in many health boards, even lower than the traditionally lowest group, employers and managers.

Diagnosis


Depressive disorders had the highest rate of all and first admissions in all health board areas. All admission rates ranged from 341.6 in the South Eastern Health Board to 172.2 in the North Eastern Health Board (Table 3.2). The rate of admission for depressive disorders in 2000 in the North Eastern and South Eastern Health Boards increased from their 1999 rate. The rate of admission for alcoholic disorders ranged from 306.5 in the Midland Health Board to 74.0 in the South Western Area Health Board (ERHA). The Midland Health Board was the only health board in which admission rates for alcoholic disorders increased from 1999 (279.7). The rate of admission for schizophrenia ranged from 210.9 in the East Coast Area Health Board to 108.2 in the North Eastern Health Board. There was an increase in the admission rate of schizophrenia in the Eastern Regional Health Authority and the Mid Western and Southern Health Boards from their 1999 rates.

Legal status

The proportion of non-voluntary admissions in some health boards was in excess of the national admission proportion of 11%. The Southern Health Board had the highest proportion at 14%, while non-voluntary admissions in both the Mid Western and North Western Health Boards were at 13%. The proportion of non-voluntary admissions in the Southern Health Board (14%) was twice that of the South Western Area Health Board (7%).

Figure 3.2 presents the rate of non-voluntary admissions by health board area. The Southern Heath Board had the highest rate of non-voluntary admission with a rate of 127.7 per 100,000, while the South Western Area Health Board had the lowest rate at 48.1.

Non-voluntary rates for first admissions ranged from 48.8 in the Northern Area Health Board to 17.3 in the South Western Area Health Board



Length of stay

Table 3.3 presents length of stay by health board area. While the Midland, South Eastern and Western Health Boards had high admission rates nationally, almost one third of these admissions were less than one week in duration. Over one quarter of discharges in all health board areas took place after one week and over 90% had been discharged within three months.

The Eastern Regional Health Authority accounted for 37% of total in-patient days (Table 3.4) compared to 6% in the North Eastern Health Board. The average length of stay by health board ranged from 30.8 days in the South Western Area Health Board to 23.4 in the Western Health Board.

Non-nationals

One hundred and fifteen non-nationals were admitted in 2000 and their country of origin is presented in Table 3.5. Country of origin is based on address received on admission, so it is likely to capture only those recently in the country. Non-nationals account for less than one per cent of the total number of admissions for the year. Forty one per cent were from England, one quarter were from Northern Ireland and 10% were from Scotland.

4. Hospital Type

Forty seven per cent of admissions were to health board hospitals, 40% were to general hospital psychiatric units and 14% were to private hospitals (Table 4.1). There was a 4% increase in admissions to general hospital psychiatric units from 1999 figures.

Gender and age

Males accounted for over half of all admissions to both health board hospitals (56%) and general hospital psychiatric units (53%), while 56% of admissions to private hospitals were for females (Table 4.1).

The age distribution for private hospitals was more evenly distributed compared to either health board hospitals or general hospital psychiatric units (Table 4.1). Forty four per cent of admissions to both health board hospitals and general hospital psychiatric units were aged 25-44 years compared to 32% in private hospitals. One fifth of admissions to private hospitals were over 65 years of age compared to 13% to health board hospitals and 12% to general hospital psychiatric units.

Diagnosis

Depressive disorders accounted for over one third of admissions to both general hospital psychiatric units and private hospitals and 27% of admissions to health board hospitals (Table 4.2). Twenty two per cent of admissions to health board hospitals and 20% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units were for schizophrenia compared to only 10% to private hospitals.

Socio-economic group


Sixty one per cent of admissions to health board hospitals and 56% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units were for manual occupations compared to only 20% to private hospitals (Figure 4.1).

Legal status

Non-voluntary admissions accounted for 14% of admissions to health board hospitals, 10% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 3% to private hospitals (Part 4: Supplementary Tables: D2).

Length of stay

Almost one third of discharges from health board hospitals and general hospital psychiatric units occurred within less than one week of admission compared to 10% from private hospitals (Table 4.3). Seventy three per cent of discharges from health board hospitals and 77% of discharges from general hospital psychiatric units occurred within one month compared to 45% from private hospitals. Forty seven per cent of discharges from private hospitals occurred within three months of admission.

5. Hospitals and Units Individually

Table 5.1 presents all and first admission rates for individual hospitals and units and their respective catchment populations. Health board hospitals and units in Tipperary had the highest rate of all admissions at 1,281.1 per 100,000, followed by hospitals and units in Waterford (1,136.3) and St. Loman's Hospital, Mullingar (1,096.9). Health board hospitals and units in Cavan/Monaghan had the lowest rate of all (297.2) and first (104.8) admissions.

All admission rates for health board hospitals and units by diagnosis are presented in Table 5.2. Hospitals and units in Tipperary had the highest rate of admission for schizophrenia at 270.9 per 100,000 while those in Cavan/Monaghan had the lowest at 59.7. The North Lee Mental Health Services had the highest rate of admission for depressive disorders (570.4) while Cavan/Monaghan had the lowest (107.5). Admission rates for alcoholic disorders were highest in the East Galway Mental Health Services (383.4) and lowest in hospitals and units in Cavan/Monaghan (15.9).

6. Children's Centres

The National Psychiatric In-patient Reporting System receives returns from three children's centres; Warrenstown House and Court Hall, both in Dublin and St. Anne's Children's Centre in Galway. There were 61 admissions to these children's centres in 2000 (Table 6.1). Over half (56%) of these admissions were to St. Anne's Children's Centre, 28% were to Warrenstown House and 16% to Court Hall. All of the admissions to Warrenstown House were first admissions.



7. In-Patient Census 2000

The Department of Health and Children's census of psychiatric hospitals and units was carried out on 31st December 2000. Rates reported are per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over.

There were 4,230 in-patients resident in Irish psychiatric hospitals and units on 31st December 2000, representing a rate of 157.0 per 100,000 population. This is a reduction on the 1999 figure of 4,469 in-patients and a rate of 167.8 per 100,000 population. There has been a significant decline in inpatient numbers over the 37 year period from 1963 to 2000, from 19,801 in 1963 to 4,230 in 2000 (Table 7.1 and Figure 7.1).



Gender and Legal Status

Males comprised 57% of in-patients resident on census night, a rate of 181.4 per 100,000 population compared to 133.4 for females (Table 7.2). The proportion of voluntary patients resident in 2000 (83%) remained relatively unchanged from that in 1999 (84%). There was a slight increase in both the rate and proportion of non-voluntary in-patients (non-voluntary patients include both temporary patients and patients of unsound mind (PUM). See Appendix 1 for explanation). Thirteen per cent of in-patients were non-voluntary in 1999 compared to 16% in 2000. The male non-voluntary rate (30.4) was over twice that of the female rate (13.8) in 2000.

Diagnosis

Schizophrenia, depressive disorders and mental handicap accounted for the highest proportion of inpatient residents, with little change from 1999 (Table 7.3). Thirty six per cent of patients suffered from schizophrenia, a rate of 57.0 per 100,000 population. This is a decrease on the 1999 rate of 64.3 per 100,000 (Figure 7.2). Depressive disorders accounted for 16% of in-patients, a rate of 24.4 per 100,000, while mental handicap accounted for 10% of in-patients, a rate of 16.3 per 100,000 population.



Age and Length of Stay


Figure 7.3: Age specific rates of the in-patient population. Ireland 1999-2000. Rates per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over. **1**999 600.0 **2**000 500.0 450.9 400.0 352.6 300.0 219.8 200.0 100.0 81.6 21.3 21.3 15-19 yrs 20-44 yrs 45-64 yrs 65-74 yrs 75 yrs +

Over one third of in-patients were in the 45-64 year age group, while one quarter were in the 20-44 year age group, a pattern unchanged from 1999 (Table 7.4). One fifth were aged 65-74 years while 19% were aged 75 years and over. Age specific rates for the in-patient population are presented in Figure 7.3. The 75 years and over age group had the highest rate of hospitalisation with a rate of 450.9 per 100,000, a reduction on the 1999 rate of 501.3 per 100,000 population. There was a decrease in the hospitalisation rate for the 45-64 and the 65-74 year age groups from 1999. In contrast, there was a slight increase in the hospitalisation rate in the 20-44 year age group from 79.4 in 1999 to 81.6 in 2000. The hospitalisation rate for the 16-19 year age group remained unchanged.

Length of stay for in-patients remained unchanged from that in 1999 with 41% of in-patients in hospital for more than 5 years. This represents a long-stay hospitalisation rate (see Appendix 1 for explanation) of 64.4 per 100,000 population and is a reduction on the 1999 hospitalisation rate of 68.4. Almost one third of in-patients were in hospital for less than three months, representing a hospitalisation rate of 50.4 per 100,000.

Health Board Areas

Hospitalisation rates by health board areas varied greatly, ranging from 267.5 per 100,000 in the South Eastern Health Board to 39.2 per 100,000 in the South Western Area Health Board (Figure 7.4 and Table 7.5). The Western Health Board had the second highest rate of hospitalisation with a rate of 193.6 per 100,000. The South Eastern Health Board had the highest rate of beds with a rate of 287.3 per 100,000. This contrasts with a rate of 40.0 per 100,000 in the South Western Area Health Board.

Hospital Type

Seventy nine per cent of in-patients were resident in health board hospitals on census night, 12% were in general hospital psychiatric units and 9% were in private hospitals (Table 7.6).

8. Community Psychiatric Services

Out-patient Clinics

There were 234 out-patient clinics held in various locations throughout the country in 2000. The total number of attendances at these clinics was 230,723, a rate of 8,561.4 per 100,000 population (Table 8.1). Return attendances comprised 87% of total attendances, a rate of 7,407.1 per 100,000. In contrast, there were 11,737 new attendances, representing a rate of 435.5. The East Coast Area Health Board had the highest rate of total attendances with a rate of 16,434.2 per 100,000 population, while the Southern Health Board had the lowest rate at 5,781.0. The East Coast Area Health Board also had the highest rate of return attendances with a rate of 10,610.3 with the Southern Health Board having the lowest (5,464.5). The rate of new attendances was highest in the South Eastern Health Board (587.9 per 100,000) and lowest in the Southern Health Board (316.6 per 100,000).

There was a decrease in the rate of new attendances in all health boards from 1999 with the exception of the Mid Western and North Eastern Health Boards. Similarly, there was a decrease in the rate of return and total attendances in all health boards with the exception of the Mid Western, North Eastern and South Eastern Health Boards.

Day Hospitals

There were 74 day hospitals in operation in Ireland in 2000 with a total of 1,192 places, representing a rate of 44.2 per 100,000 population (Table 8.2). The rate of places across health boards ranged from 84.8 per 100,000 in the Mid Western Health Board to 15.8 in the North Eastern Health Board. There was an increase in the rate of places from 1999 in all health boards except the Midland and the Southern Health Boards. There were major variations in both the number of attendances and the number of persons attending in all health board areas. For example, there were 48,729 attendances in the ERHA compared to 4,814 attendances in the North Eastern Health Board. The rate of attendances ranged from 15,715.0 per 100,000 in the Mid Western Health Board to 2,169.9 in the North Eastern Health Board. Likewise, the number of persons attending ranged from 9,270 in the ERHA to 123 in the North Eastern Health Board, while the rate of persons attending ranged from 1,251.6 per 100,000 in the South Western Area Health Board to 55.4 in the North Eastern Health Board. There was an increase in the rate of attendances in all health boards from 1999 with the exception of the North Eastern and the South Eastern Health Boards, while the number of persons attending increased in all health boards except the South Eastern and the Western Health Boards.

Day Centres

There were 2,427 places in 105 day centres in Ireland in 2000, representing a rate of 90.1 per 100,000 population. The rate of places by health board area ranged from 178.5 per 100,000 in the North Western Health Board to 34.0 in the Northern Area Health Board (Table 8.3). There was a decrease in the rate of places from 1999 in the ERHA, the South Eastern and the Western Health Boards.

The number of attendances at day centres was 354,772 in 2000, a rate of 13,164,4 per 100,000. This is a decrease on the 1999 number and rate of attendances. There was considerable variation in the

rate of attendances by health board area with rates ranging from 27,165.4 per 100,000 in the North Western Health Board to 3,937.0 in the South Western Area Health Board. A total of 5,231 persons attended day centres in 2000, representing a rate of 194.1 per 100,000. This remains relatively unchanged from 1999. The Northern Area Health Board had the lowest rate of persons attending at 63.0 while the South Western Area Health Board had the highest rate (296.6). There was an increase in the rate of persons attending in all but the North Eastern, the South Eastern and the Western Health Boards.

Community Residences

There were 2,934 places in 392 community residences in 2000, a rate of 108.9 places per 100,000 population (Table 8.4). These community residences comprise low, medium and high support residences. The number and rate of places was greater for high support residences (1,194 places, a rate of 44.3) than for either low (1,044 places, a rate of 38.7) or medium support (696 places, a rate of 25.8). In fact, places in high support residences accounted for 41% of total places. The North Western Health Board had the highest rate of places overall with a rate of 193.4. This was over three times that of the South Western Area Health Board at 56.5 per 100,000. Among the low support residences, the South Western Area Health Board had the lowest rate of places at 16.7 while the North Western Health Board had the highest at 79.6 per 100,000. The rate of places for medium support residences ranged from 56.8 per 100,000 in the Western Health Board to 3.9 in the North Western Health Board. The East Coast Area Health Board had the lowest rate (24.3) of places in high support residences while the North Western Health Board had the highest at 109.9 per 100,000.

There were 1,314 admissions to, and 1,192 discharges from, all community residences in 2000 (Table 8.5). Admissions to, and discharges from, high support residences accounted for over half of these total admissions and discharges. The North Western Health Board had a particularly high number of admissions to, and discharges from, high support residences with 247 admissions and 222 discharges. This contrasts with the low number of admissions and discharges in the Midland and Mid Western Health Boards. A high number of admissions to, and discharges from, low support residences was again seen in the North Western Health Board with 70 admissions and 74 discharges, contrasting with 2 admissions and 4 discharges in the Southern Health Board. The Western Health Board had the highest number of admissions to, and discharges from, medium support residences with 177 admissions and 160 discharges, while the North Western Health Board had no admissions or discharges.

The rate of admissions to community residences for all health board areas is presented in Table 8.6. The North Western Health Board had the highest rate of admission to both low and high support residences with rates of 45.3 and 159.8 per 100,000 respectively. The South Eastern Health Board had the lowest rate of admission to low (0.5) and high support residences (3.9 per 100,000 population). The Western Health Board had the highest rate of admission to medium support residences with a rate of 67.9 while the North Western Health Board had the lowest at 0.0 per 100,000. Admission rates for low, medium and high support residences increased from 1999 with the overall rate increasing from 28.1 in 1999 to 48.8 per 100,000 in 2000.



Appendix 1

1. Data coverage

Information on admissions and discharges for 53 psychiatric hospitals, general hospital units and children's centres is presented in this report. Data are presented on the three area health boards in the Eastern Regional Health Authority (ERHA) for the first time. The ERHA replaced the Eastern Health Board in March 2000. A breakdown of facilities by health board area is presented below.

A new unit, St. Michael's Unit, in the Mercy Hospital, Cork opened in April 2000. In this report, data for Tallaght Hospital and St. Loman's Hospital, Dublin are presented separately.

Coverage in the year 2000 was incomplete due to the late submission of returns and return of insufficient information. This resulted in the exclusion of James Connolly Memorial Hospital, Dublin. Returns for the Mater Hospital, Dublin were also incomplete for 2000. Some hospitals experienced difficulty in returning data for patients who had not been discharged by the end of 2000 and thus, admission figures do not reflect these records. This occurred in St. Brigid's Hospital, Ballinasloe and St. Patrick's Hospital, Dublin. It is estimated on the basis of returns in previous years that approximately 440 admissions have thus been excluded.

2. Data collection procedure

An increasing number of hospitals now return data in electronic format, thus speeding up the processing and publishing of data. In 2000 50% of hospitals (excluding children's centres) returned data electronically. This is an increase on 1999 and we hope that this will further increase in 2001. The Midland and the Mid-Western Health Boards return all data electronically, while the North Eastern, South Eastern, Southern, and Western Health Boards have now almost complete electronic coverage. Hospitals within the Eastern Regional Health Authority still largely submit data manually with one exception.

With the manual system, completed forms are returned to personnel at the Health Research Board in accordance with procedures and practices established over a number of years. Personnel at the Health Research Board code and process the data and maintain on-going liaison with hospital personnel. A sample of the form used to collect data from hospitals is presented at the end of this section.

The 2000 report sees the inclusion of the category "divorced" under marital status for the first time. Some hospitals however did not record this in 2000. In these instances divorced persons were coded as 'Other'.

Many Dublin hospitals do not provide sufficient address information on admission data to allow allocation to an appropriate health board area. This resulted in a number of admissions having an unspecified health board area within the Eastern Regional Health Authority in this report. Previously this was not a problem with the old Eastern Health Board as all Dublin addresses were assigned to this health board.

3. Glossary of Terms

Long-stay hospitalisation

Long-stay hospitalisation refers to continuous hospitalisation for over one year.

Place of Residence.

This variable is used to allocate patients to health boards. The address from which each patient is admitted to hospital is used to allocate the patient to the corresponding health board area and is rated accordingly. Thus, tabulations relating to health boards are calculated irrespective of whether or not the patient was admitted to a hospital belonging to that health board.

Resident Patients

Resident patients refers to patients in hospital on census night.

Socio-economic group.

Patients are allocated to one of 11 socio-economic groups as outlined by the Central Statistics Office (CSO) in the Census of Population 1996.

Temporary Patient

A temporary patient is one who is believed to require, for his/her recovery, not more than six months suitable treatment and is unfit, on account of his/her mental state, for treatment as a voluntary patient or who is an addict and is believed to require for his/her recovery, at least six months preventive and curative treatment.

PUM (Person of Unsound Mind)

A PUM is a patient who may be admitted and detained in a district mental hospital under the Mental Treatment Act, 1945.

4. Computation of Rates

The rates accompanying numerical data in this report are calculated using the Census of Population 1996 (Central Statistics Office, 1997a, 1997b, 1998). All data are rated to the population aged 16 years and over. It must be emphasised that while this population base is the only definitive measure of the Irish population available at the present time, it is now six years out of date and does not reflect a significant increase in the population as a whole since that time period due to both economic and social factors.
