AICC Background

- Launched **October 1999**
- Unified governments of **Ireland, Northern Ireland & United States** & enhanced diplomatic relations working together against cancer
- Aimed to **reduce cancer incidence & mortality across the island of Ireland** via **cross-border and trans-Atlantic collaborations** in cancer research & education
- Under previous MOU:
 - **333 trainees** from the island of Ireland participated in the NCI Summer Prevention Programme
 - **15 Fellows** from the island of Ireland progressed through the NCI Prevention Fellowship Programme
 - **9 Fellows** from the island of Ireland undertook the Cancer Health Economics Fellowship Programme

AICC MOU Renewed in 2021

New MOU signed March 2021:

- Minister for Health Stephen Donnelly TD
- Northern Ireland Minister for Health Robin Swann MLA
- Dr Norman E Sharpless MD
- Serves as an enabling framework, supporting cancer care and cancer research priorities, and offering more opportunities to develop North-South and All Ireland-US collaborations.
- Builds on previous successes and provides an excellent framework to support national coordination of cancer research which is one of the key research actions in the **National Cancer Strategy 2017-2025**.

AICC Current Structures

1. **Steering Group** representatives of the three signatory parties

2. **Implementation Group**

(Chaired by Dr. Mairead O'Driscoll, CEO HRB & Professor Cherith Semple, University of Ulster)

AICC 2024 Grant Scheme Details

AICC 2024

Aim:

- Support **innovative, dynamic, and collaborative** cancer research activities to benefit all-island cancer patients with a dedicated funding stream

Objectives:

- **Stimulate**, develop and improve all-island and trans-Atlantic cancer research **collaborations, networking, & engagement**
- **Prime cancer research** activity within the **3 AICC priority areas**
- **Support** high quality, innovative cancer research **pilots, mapping activities, projects and/or training initiatives**
- Engage the **all-island, multi-disciplinary cancer research community**

Eligibility

- Open to **Host Institutes** based in either jurisdiction (**Ireland/Northern Ireland**)
- All Lead Applicants required to have **cross border** collaborators as **co-applicants**
e.g. a Lead Applicant from Ireland requires a co-applicant from Northern Ireland and vice versa.
- Also required to have an **NCI collaborator**
 - ***Applications focused solely on cross-border initiatives may apply without NCI collaboration with sufficient justification for their exclusion***
- Aligned to one or both jurisdictions' cancer strategies
- Aligned to HRB Strategy 2021-2025

Out of Scope



- Developing infrastructure for biobanking, databases or patient registers*
- Applications without a predominant research element
- Applications from individuals supported by alcohol or tobacco industry
- Infrastructure involving building work, fit-out of buildings, or purchase of major pieces of equipment
- Applications involving basic biomedical research
- Research intended to create human embryos solely for the purpose of research or for the purpose of stem cell procurement, including by means of somatic cell nuclear transfer.
- Applications using cell lines, animals or their tissue that do not constitute pre-clinical research
- **Solely literature reviews, audits, questionnaires/surveys, or technology development (although these elements may be part of an integrated mapping activity, pilot or project/research study)**

Application Process-2 Stages

Stage 1 Expression of Interest

- March 1st - April 26th
- High level proposal via GEMS
- Shortlisting Panel in May
- Outcome & feedback

Stage 2 Full Application (Invite Only)

- June 04th - August 2nd
- Detailed Business Case Via GEMS
- International Panel Review September
- Followed by HRB Board Approval

Review Process

Stage 1 Expressions of Interest

- EOIs reviewed by HRB & HSC R&D for shortlisting May 2024
- Outcome & feedback to all applicants

Stage 2 Full Application

- Invited applicants submit full application June-July 2024
- Public reviews conducted August 2024

Panel Review

- Consider Full **Applications**, **Panel members'** written reviews and **Public reviews**
- Careful consideration of assessment criteria
- Successful applicants are expected to score highly on all criteria.

AICC Assessment Criteria

1) Added Value of Investment

- Proposed investment has **clear added value** above and beyond any research activities, collaboration or networking currently taking place
- HRB support **complements and leverages** other investments
- **Existing** cancer research **capabilities and collaborations** in Ireland **harnessed** to ensure impact for patients

AICC Assessment Criteria

2) Quality & Relevance of Proposed Award Activities

- Investment is **strategic and targeted** to boost all island and trans-Atlantic collaboration and partnerships in cancer research and innovation
- Spectrum of **activities/supports is appropriate** to increase cancer research in areas of need
- Coordinated approach to **engagement with the NCI** evident
- Proposed work, budget and resources are clear, **prioritised and phased appropriately**

AICC Assessment Criteria

3) Strength of Collaboration & Team

- Suitable applicant team, with complementary expertise and experience including **appropriate stakeholders** to maximise impact for patients
- **Roles and responsibilities** of proposed team are **clear**
- Proposed team **can deliver on objectives** of the award
- **Representation** from Ireland, Northern Ireland and NCI Contributors as **appropriate**
- Clear, **strong links** with relevant **HIs/Hospitals/research groups/patient organisations evident** in governance arrangements
- Accessibility and **suitability of facilities, infrastructure and other supports**, as appropriate

Application Requirements

- Applications should be made by a **Lead Applicant** on **behalf of a team** made up of **researchers, knowledge user(s) and PPI contributors**.
- Required to have **cross border collaborators as co-applicants**
- Applicants **required** to have an **NCI collaborator**
- Research proposals which are solely focused on strengthening and, or improving North-South cancer research and innovation collaborations may apply with sufficient justification of NCI exclusion.

Lead Applicant

- Hold a post (permanent or a contract that covers the duration of the award) in a HRB recognised Host Institution as an independent investigator.

For clinicians, an adjunct position in a HRB recognised Host Institution is acceptable

OR

- Be an individual who will be recognised by the Host Institution upon receipt of an award as an independent investigator who will have a dedicated office and research space for the duration of award, for which they will be fully responsible.
- Be able to demonstrate evidence of achievement as an independent investigator
- May apply for either or both tiers

Applicant Team

Co-Applicants (maximum of 8):

- Researchers, Knowledge Users and PPI Contributors
- Well-defined, critical and substantial role in the conduct and steering of the proposed research

Collaborators (maximum of 10):

- Integral and discrete role in the proposed research
- Each collaborator must complete a Collaboration Agreement Form

Funded Personnel:

- The level, expertise and experience of the proposed research personnel must match the ambition and scale of the project

 - 2.2 Added Value
 - 2.4 Budget
 - 2.5 References
- **Must attach as a PDF**
